



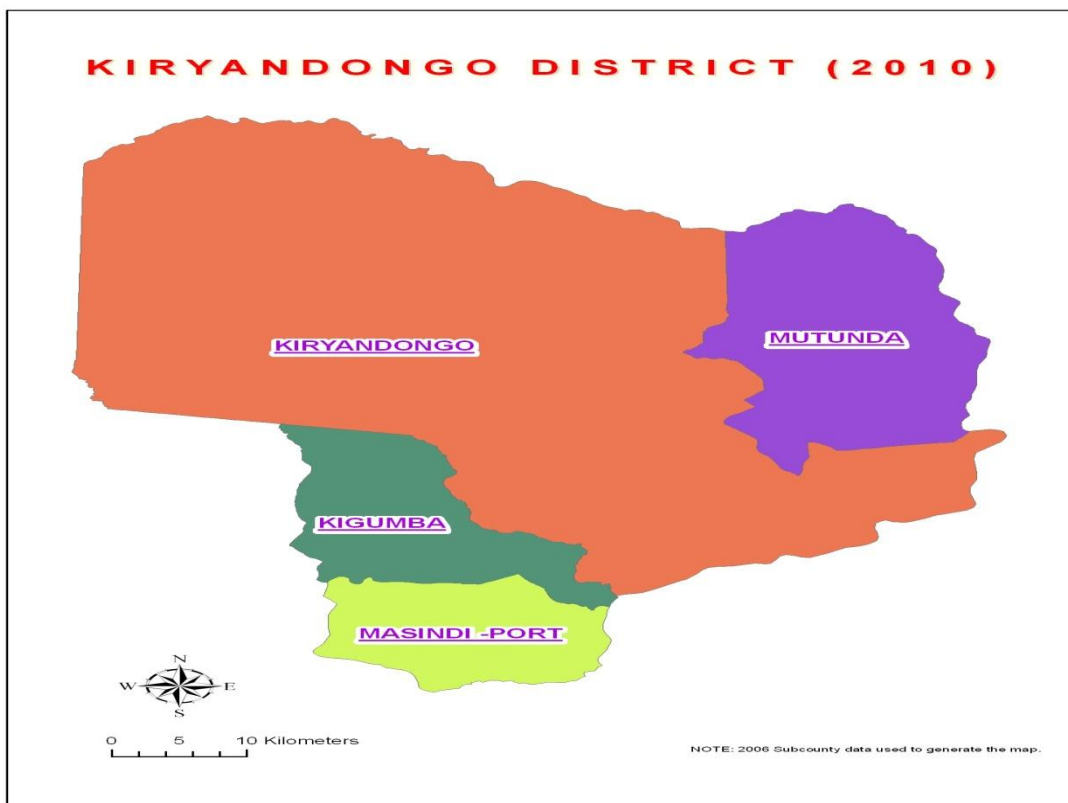

CHAPTER ONE: INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background

The Government of Uganda's economic vision is that every household is able to have the means to earn the minimum income that enables it to access basic human needs such as food, shelter, clothing, health and education. The Government aims at using this approach to eradicate poverty among the different households.

The Poverty Eradication Action Plan (PEAP) recognizes that although major progress has been achieved in the reduction of poverty from 56 percent in 1992/1993 to 31 percent in 2005/2006, the proportion of people living below the poverty line is still very high.

So the Government of Uganda launched the Economic Development Strategy (EDS) in the financial year 2005/2006 with the aim of eradicating poverty at household level. The strategy initially started at sub-county level as the unit of planning, implementation and monitoring.

Under the EDS, the Government launched the Sub-county Development Programme in the financial year 2006/2007 as a means to implement the Government programme which is the pledge to the people of Uganda to promote "Prosperity for All", and build socio-economic transformation and peace.

The Sub-county Development Programme is focusing on empowering the Sub-county structures to carry out the planning, budgeting and development roles by implementing the EDS (reduction of household poverty) through:

- Establishment of the Community Information System (CIS)
- Increasing access to Rural Financial Services (RFS)
- Improving Productivity
- Improving Marketing and Trade
- Improving infrastructure, and
- Improving local standards of Physical Planning and Development.

1.2 The Community Information System (CIS)

The Community Information System (CIS) is a government programme that has been established to ensure that households and communities have access to and make use of reliable and meaningful data and information generated at household, parish and sub-county levels. The CIS generates basic information from communities to monitor households' welfare as well as promote efficient utilisation of information at grassroots level.

CIS is also an activity of the Community Mobilisation and Empowerment Strategy (CMES), which is a multi- sectoral framework to harmonise and consolidate actions by all actors involved in mobilising communities for development.

1.3 Objectives of the Community Information System

The main objective was to empower communities to make informed decisions using readily available up to date information. The system was also intended to enable community administrators to have regular and meaningful information about households and communities on which to base development planning, monitoring and evaluation of projects / programmes that are geared towards poverty alleviation. The specific objectives are:

- To facilitate regular and sustainable monitoring of the effectiveness of Government, NGOs and other agencies' poverty reduction initiatives among communities and for policy and decision making.
- To enhance the use of reliable and accurate data among communities.
- To support participatory development planning at various levels of administration.
- To identify communities and households by their socio-economic characteristics and hence their needs.

1.4 CIS Data Collection in Kiryandongo District

The household registers were used for CIS data collection whose units were the households within each village. Thus data collected on complete households within the village constituted a village summary. The village data were summarized to give parish level information which was then summarized further to a sub-county level. Kiryandongo district has 4 subcounties from which data were collected in mid 2009 from June to July and then summarized for this report.

1.4.1 Presentation of the CIS report

The data in this report is summarized at three levels, that is, village, parish and sub-county level. Information presented in this report is at a sub-county level. Further detail at parish and village level is provided in the Appendix. The information presented in this report shows the socio-demographic characteristics of the households including ownership of Assets, Crops grown and Livestock reared.

1.4.2 Limitations of the Report

1. The sensitization level was very low. The respondents were reluctant to provide information due to fear of being taxed and taking their land and other property. They claim to have not been given prior knowledge about the exercise and its usefulness.
2. There was lack of ownership by the political wing of the CIS activity during data collection as they were not involved in the exercise.
3. Under coverage of the population could not be ruled out given the fact that some villages were so big for one person's coverage.
4. There was also a lot of worry about confidentiality of the information collected. This was expected especially in the more affluent members of the community.
5. Being a new district, the data could not be reported separately for some administrative units like the town council which were newly created.

CHAPTER TWO: SOCIO-DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

2.1 Population by Gender

Table 2.1 presents the total number of households and distribution of the household population by the sex of the household members by subcounty for the CIS data collected in 2009. The findings under the CIS revealed that Kigumba sub-county had the highest number of household (8,118) and population (45,250). Mean while Masindi Port had the lowest number of households (819) and population (4,810) in the district. The findings further revealed that out of the 4 sub-counties in Kiryandongo district, Mutunda, and Kiryandongo had more females than males.

To provide comparison, the total number of household for census 2002 and total population projection for 2009 from the census 2002 benchmark has been included. However, the reductions in the number of CIS 2009 household compared to that of census 2002 and the variation of the total population of 2009 census projection were partly due to the fact that during the time of census 2002 there were refugees settlement in the district mingled with the community. But by the time of CIS 2009 exercise the refugees had been isolated from community and resettled elsewhere. Appendix Table A2.1 provides information up to the village level.

2.2 Household Population by Age Group

During 2009 CIS data collection, household members were asked their age in completed years. The age groups were categorised between 0-5, 6-17 and 18 years and above. Table 2.2 presents the percentage distribution of the household population by subcounty and age-group. The findings showed that Kiryandongo sub-county had the highest percentage of persons between the ages of 0-5 years (32.4%) while Masindi Town Council had the lowest percentage (17.4%). Between 6-17 years of age, Mutunda sub-county registered the highest population (36.4%) and Kigumba sub-county registered the lowest (25.8%). For the 18 years and above, Kigumba registered the highest population

(48.5%) and Kiryandongo Sub County, the lowest (32.9%). The results up to village level are presented in Appendix Table A2.2.

2.3 Marital Status

Information gathered during CIS data collection exercise of 2009 included the marital status of household members who had reached the age of 12 and above. The findings revealed that Kigumba sub-county registered the highest proportion of people who were never married (45.26%) and Masindi Port subcounty registered the lowest (36.45%) under this category - Table 2.3. Among those who are now married, Masindi Port registered the highest proportion (50.66%) while Kiryandongo registered the lowest (43.39%). Masindi Port sub-county registered the highest proportion of persons that were married (12.89%) whereas Kigumba registered the lowest (9.9%). Appendix Table A2.3 presents data up to the parish level.

2.4 Level of Education Attainment

The Education level of the usual household members who were above 5 years of age was among the personal information that was collected. The highest education completed was captured, including that of children who were in boarding schools/colleges and other institutions. The highest education attained was categorized in 3 groups. These were P1 - P7, J1 - S6 and above S6. Table 2.4 shows that the proportion of the population who completed the level of education in the category P1 to P7 and junior one to senior six was almost the same across the subcounties. However, for the category of senior six and above, Kigumba subcounty registered the highest population proportion of 19 percent and the lowest proportion under this category was in Masindi Port (0.22%). This result shows that by the time of CIS of exercise, most people in the district had stopped in primary and very few had went beyond senior six. Appendix Table A2.4 presents the results of the educational attainment of the household population aged 5 and above at parish level.

2.5 Main Economic Activity

The usual household members aged 5 years and above during the last 12 months were asked to state their main economic activity. Table 2.5 presents the findings. The majority of household members that were involved in Agriculture were from Mutunda (75.09%) sub-county while Masindi Port registered the least (45.58%). Findings further showed that Mutundat had the highest percentage of people that were involved in Trade (7.4%) and Masindi Port Sub-County had the least (1.13%). Manufacturing as a main economic activity was carried out in a very small scale with Masindi Port (1.29%) taking the highest proportion while the least was in Kigumba Subcounty (0.24%). Provision of Services as a main economic activity was mostly done in Masindi Port (16.798%) and the least was in Kiryandongo (3.88%). The detailed analysis at parish level is presented in Appendix Table A2.5.

CHAPTER THREE: AGRICULTURE

3.1 Crops Grown

The CIS household register solicited information from the respondents on the different types of crops grown. Table 3.1 presents the findings on some of the crops grown by the respondents.

The findings showed that the households in Kiryandongo district participated mainly in the growing of four major crops. That is maize (67.2%), beans (43.8%), cassava (45.8%) and sweet potatoes (20.7%). The highest proportion of household that grew of maize was registered in Mutunda sub-county with 92.6 percent and the lowest was in Masindi Port with 31.5 percent. While for beans and cassava still the highest was in Mutunda with 82.7 percent and 72.3 percent respectively and the lowest was still in Masindi Port (10.9% and 16.7% respectively). For sweet potatoes, Mutunda still registered the highest growth proportion of 34.7 percent with the least being Masindi T/C (0.7%).

Coffee as a main cash crop is less grown in the district (2.6%) with Masindi Port being with the highest proportion of households (6.3%) that grew it while Kigumba subcounty had the least proportion. The category of the main food crops that registered the lowest proportion of growth in the district were rice(0.9%), Irish potatoes(0.2%), sorghum(5.1%) and banana(6.4%). Masindi Port was the sub-county that had the highest proportion of household that grew rice (2.1%) and the lowest was Mutunda(0.3%). Irish potatoes was highly grown in Kigumba and Mutunda at a smaller rate of 0.3 percent in the two subcounties and lowest grown in Kiryandongo(0.1%) and Masindi port didn't grow at all (0.0%). Sorghum was highest grown in Mutunda(10.4%) and least grown in Kigumba(0.8%). For banana, the highest growing sub-county was Masindi Port (12.2%) and least grown in Kigumba at 0.9 percent. The detailed information up to the parish level is appended in Table A3.1.

3.2 Livestock and Poultry

Masindi Port sub-county had the highest proportion of households owning cattle (49.7%) with most of the cattle coming from Kaduku (79.8%) parish this could be attributed to its location along Lake Kyoga. Mutunda had the least proportion of households owning cattle (21.3%). Kiryandongo sub-county had the highest proportion of households owning goats (62.8%) and Kigumba had the lowest proportion of 2.8 percent. The highest proportion of households owning pigs was in Kiryandongo (20.6%) and the lowest was Masindi Port (6.3%). For the chicken rearing Kiryandongo had the highest proportions of households (79.0%) and still Masindi Port had the lowest proportion (32.5%). The detailed analysis of the findings at sub-county level is presented in Appendix Table A3.2.

CHAPTER FOUR: OWNERSHIP OF HOUSEHOLDS ASSETS

4.1 Household Assets

The Table 4.1 shows that Kiryandongo sub-county had the highest proportion of households owning land and houses (87.2%) while Mutunda had the lowest proportion of households owning land (60.1%) and houses (85.3%). The highest proportion of households owning houses was instead in Masindi Port (92.4%). Kiryandongo had the highest proportion of households owning bicycles (69.1%) and the lowest proportion was in Mutunda(60.1%). The highest proportion of households owning radios was in Kigumba (69.6%) and the lowest was in Masindi Port sub-county (62.5%). Kigumba had still the highest proportion of households owning telephones (43.2%) and the lowest was in Mutunda (38%). Appendix Table A4.1 presents the results at parish level.
