Introduction

Housing conditions are important in the understanding of policy priorities, critical issues and challenges in the housing programme for sustainable development.

Poor housing conditions are associated with a wide range of health conditions, including respiratory infections, asthma, injuries, and mental health.

Inadequate sanitation and hygiene arising out of poor housing and sanitary facilities is a major cause of poor health and poverty.

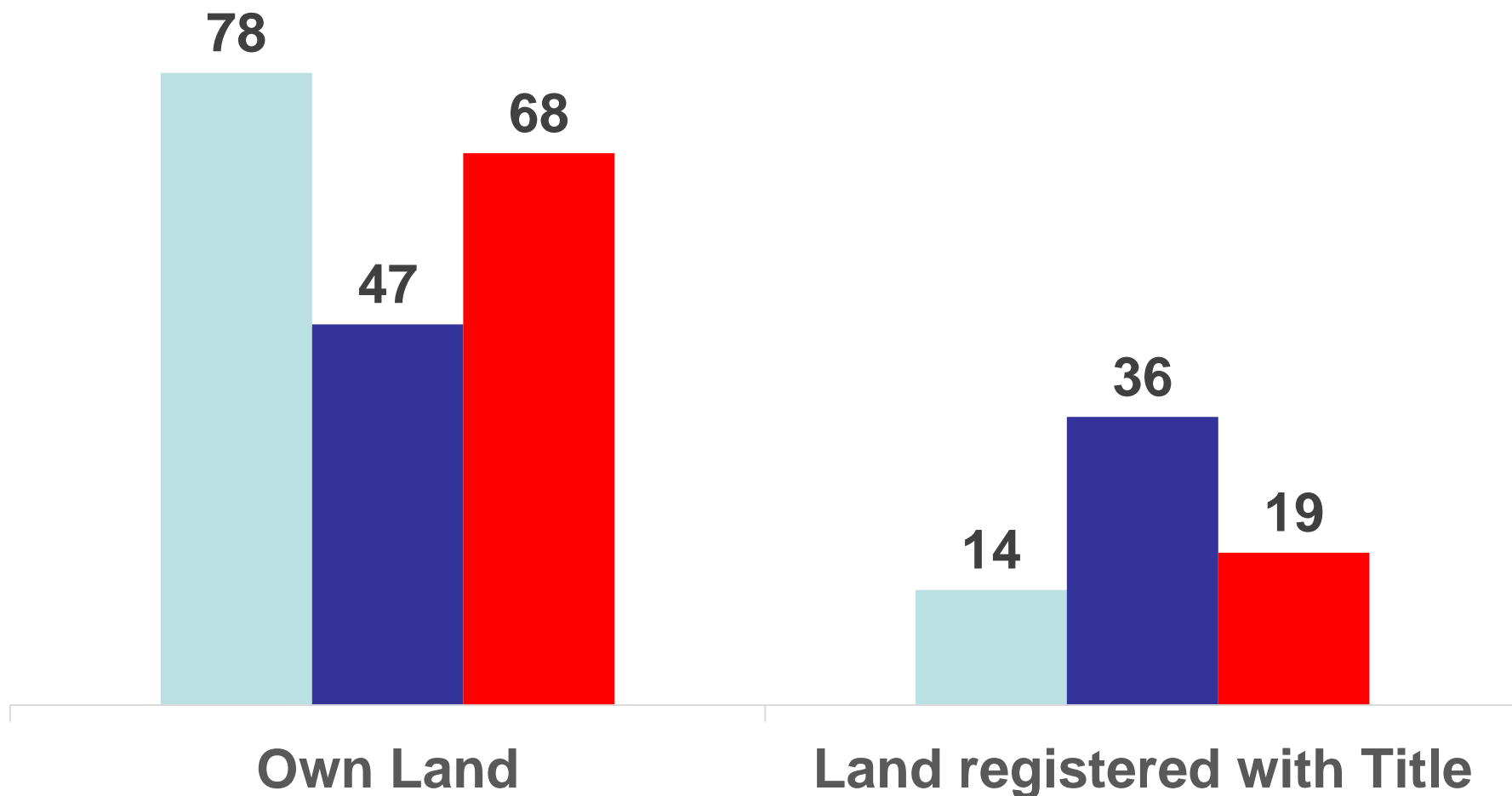
The condition of the dwelling is a good indicator of the welfare status of its occupants.

The NSDS 2021 collected information on the;

- materials used for the roof, wall, floor and
- type of energy used for lighting and cooking.
- information on household's ownership of land
- land transactions carried out since 2015.

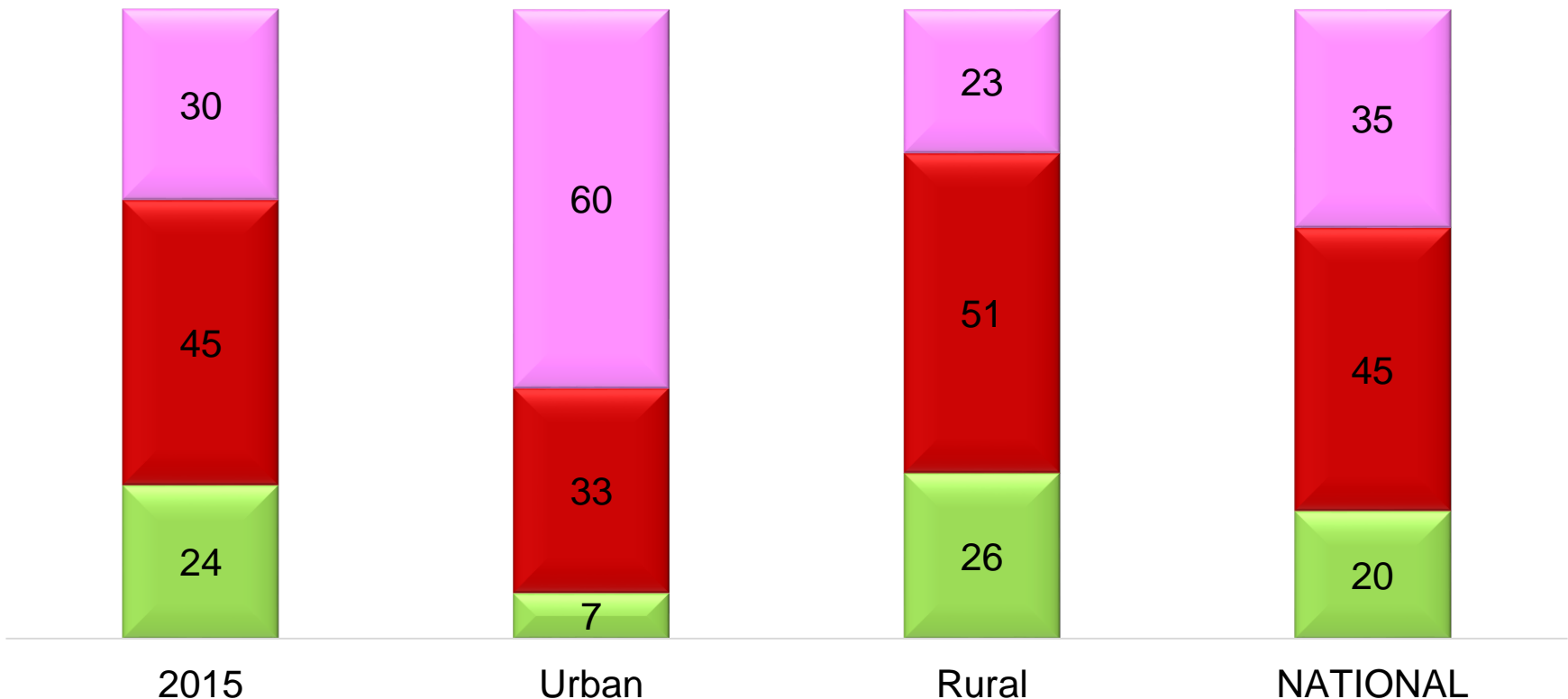
Ownership and Registration of Land (%)

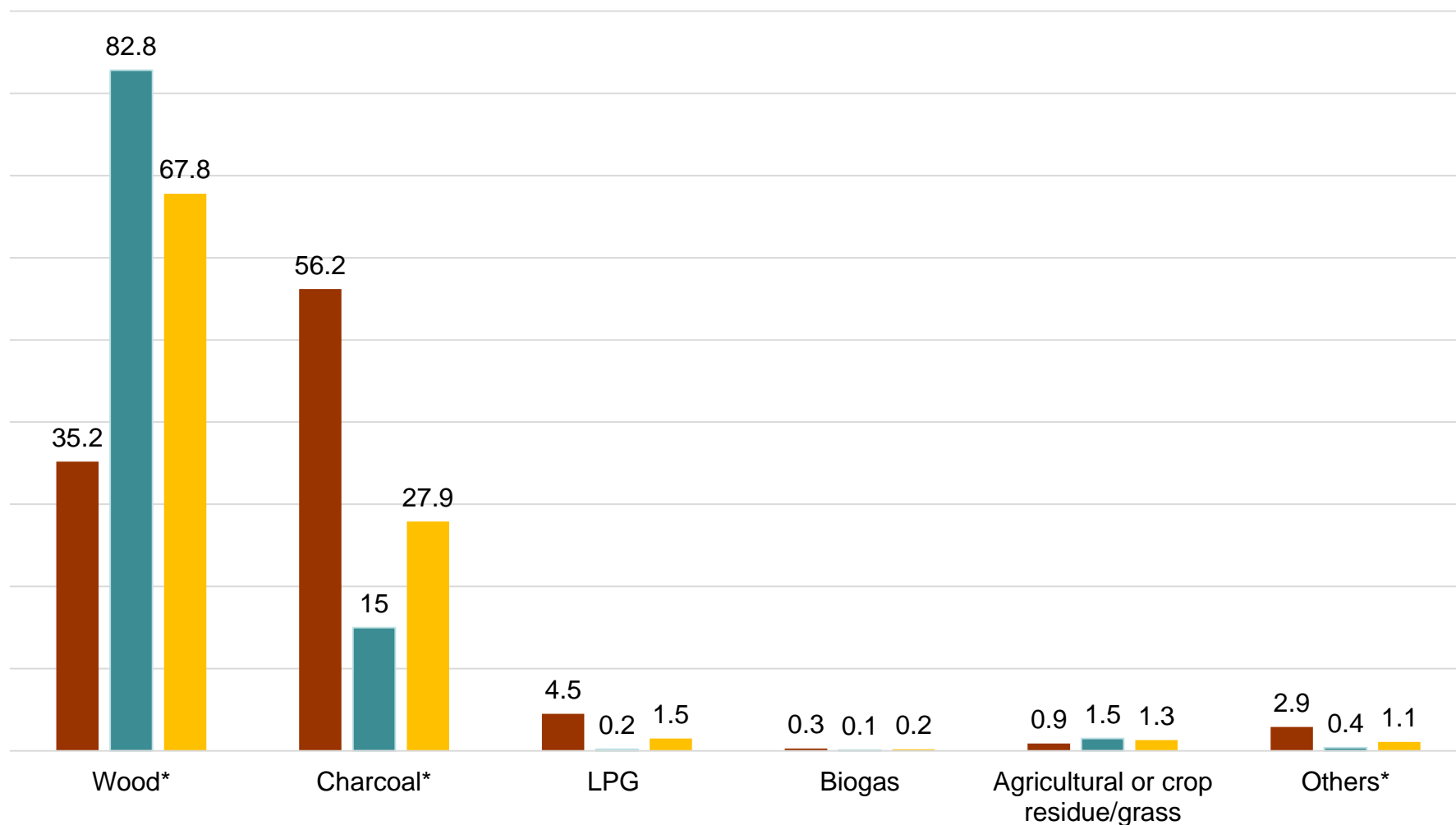
Households by status of the dwelling units (%)

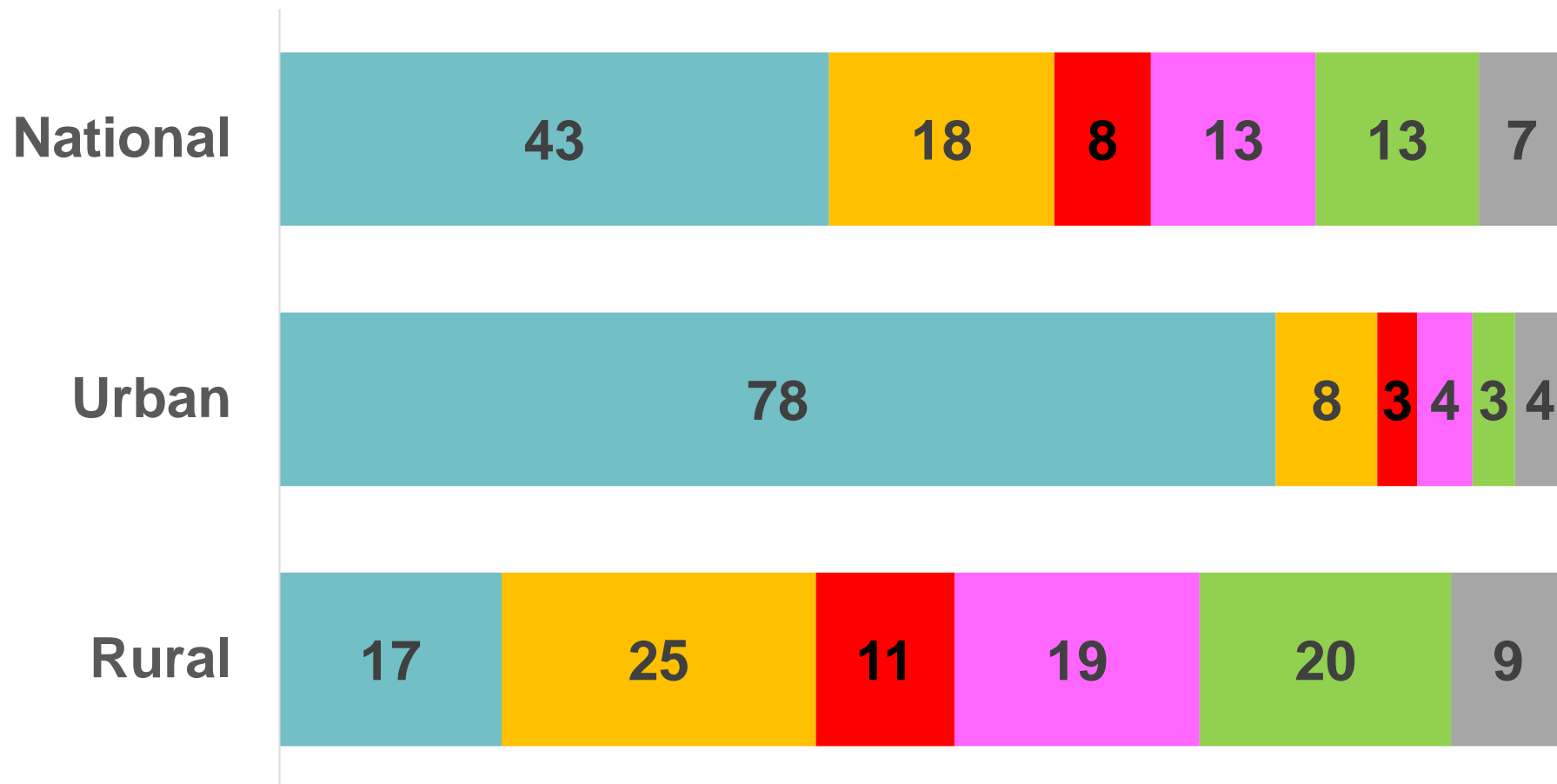
Main Source of Energy for Cooking (%)

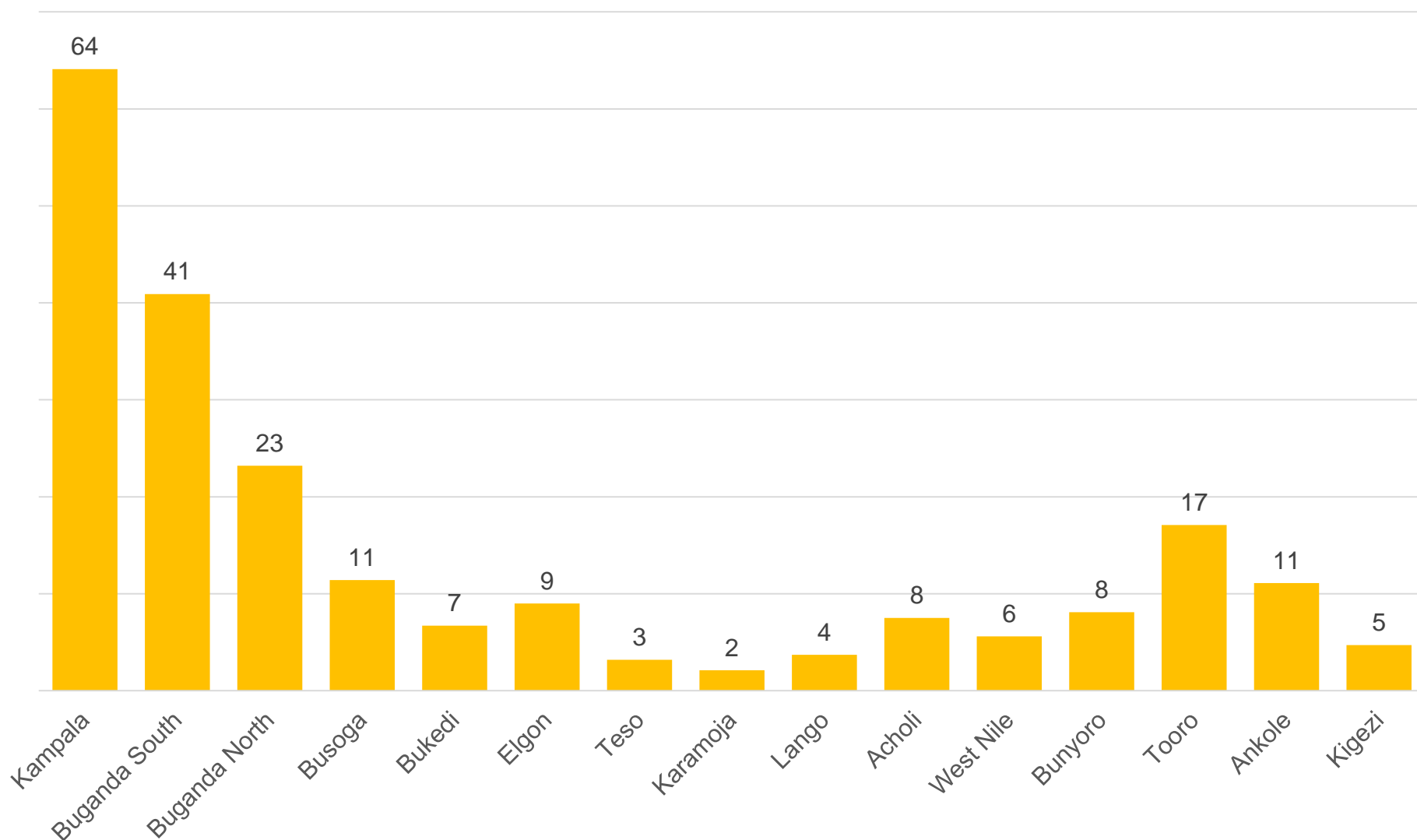


Distribution of Households by Source of Electricity (%)

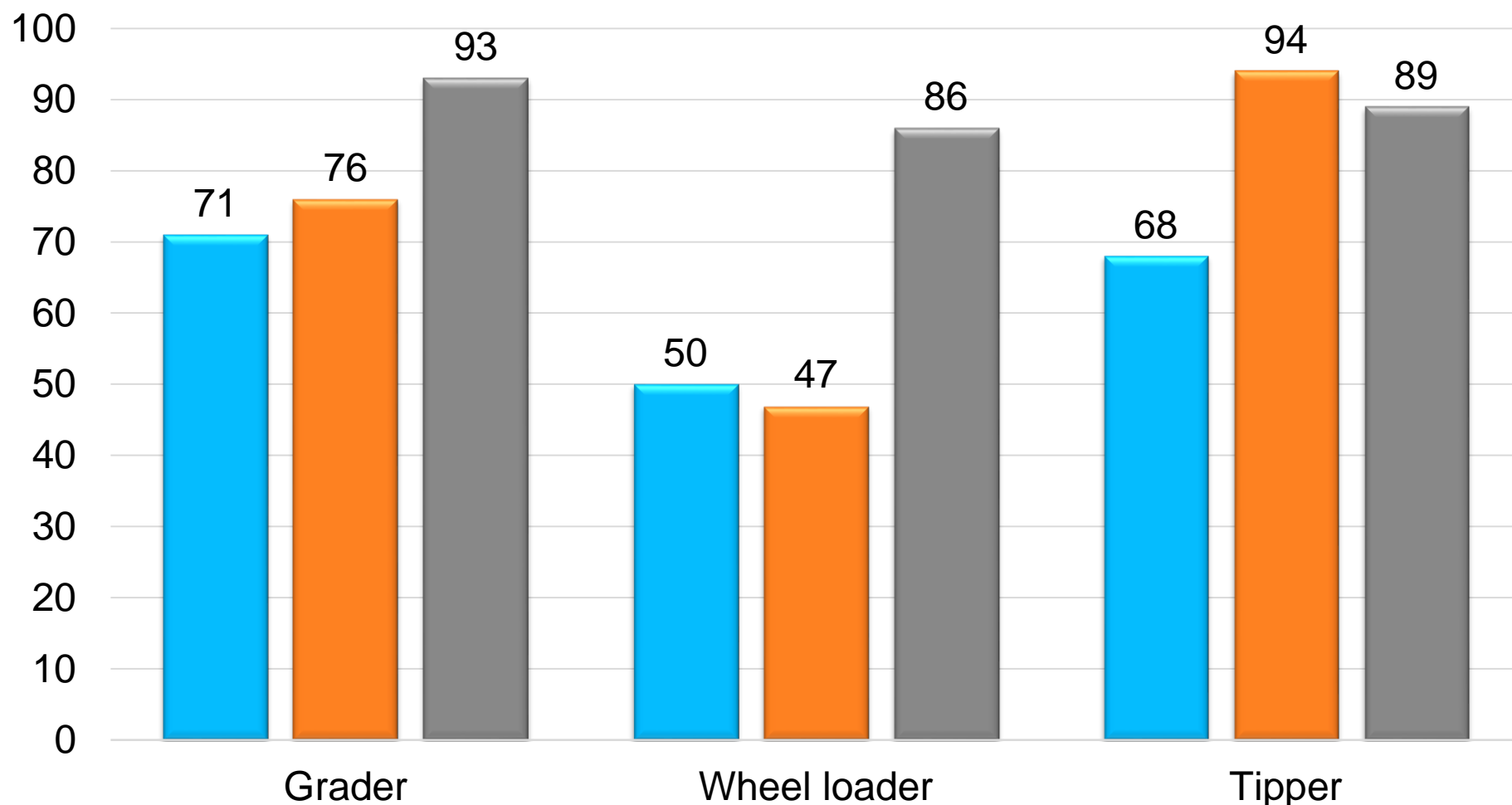

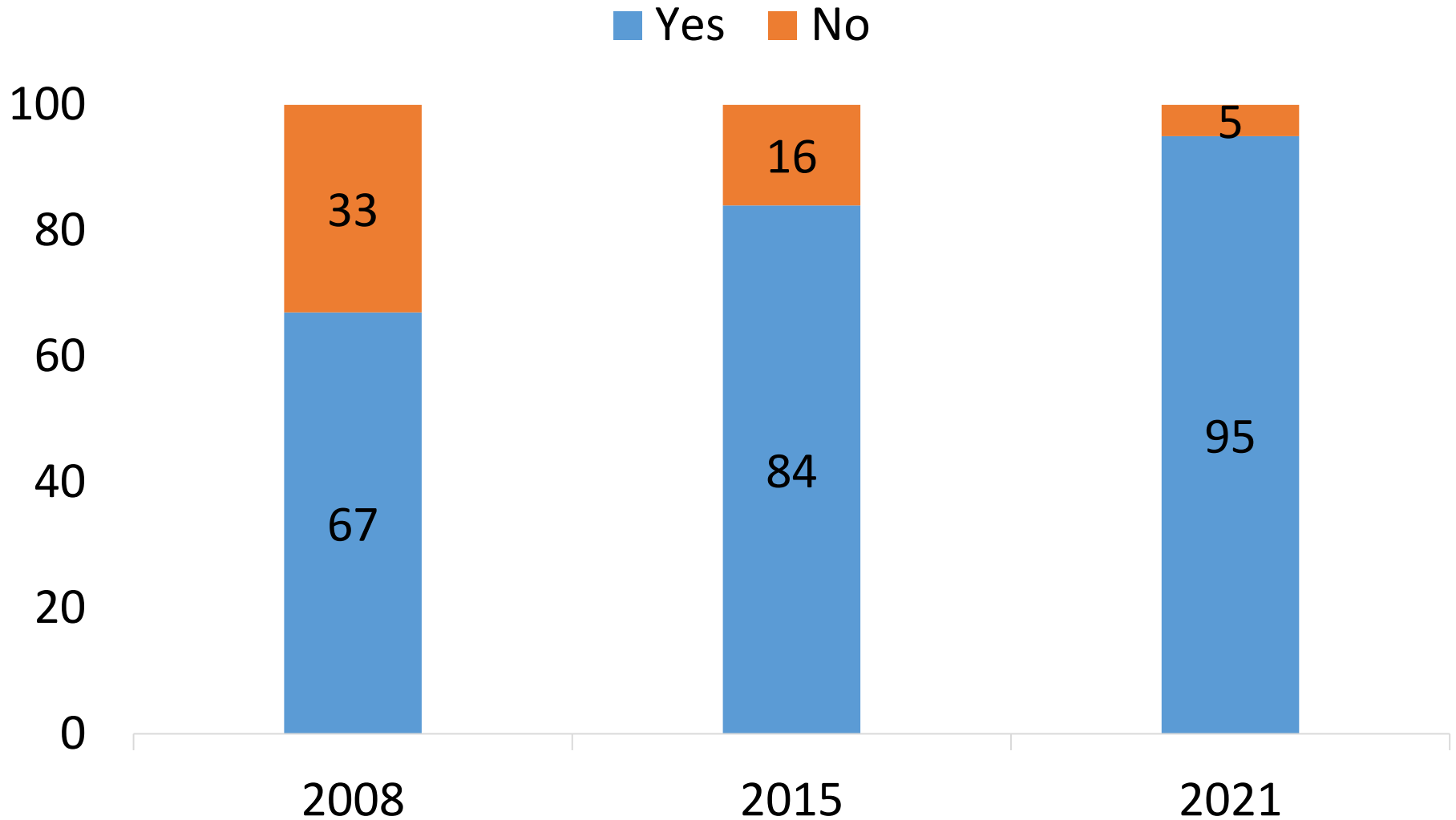

■ 2008 ■ 2015 ■ 2021



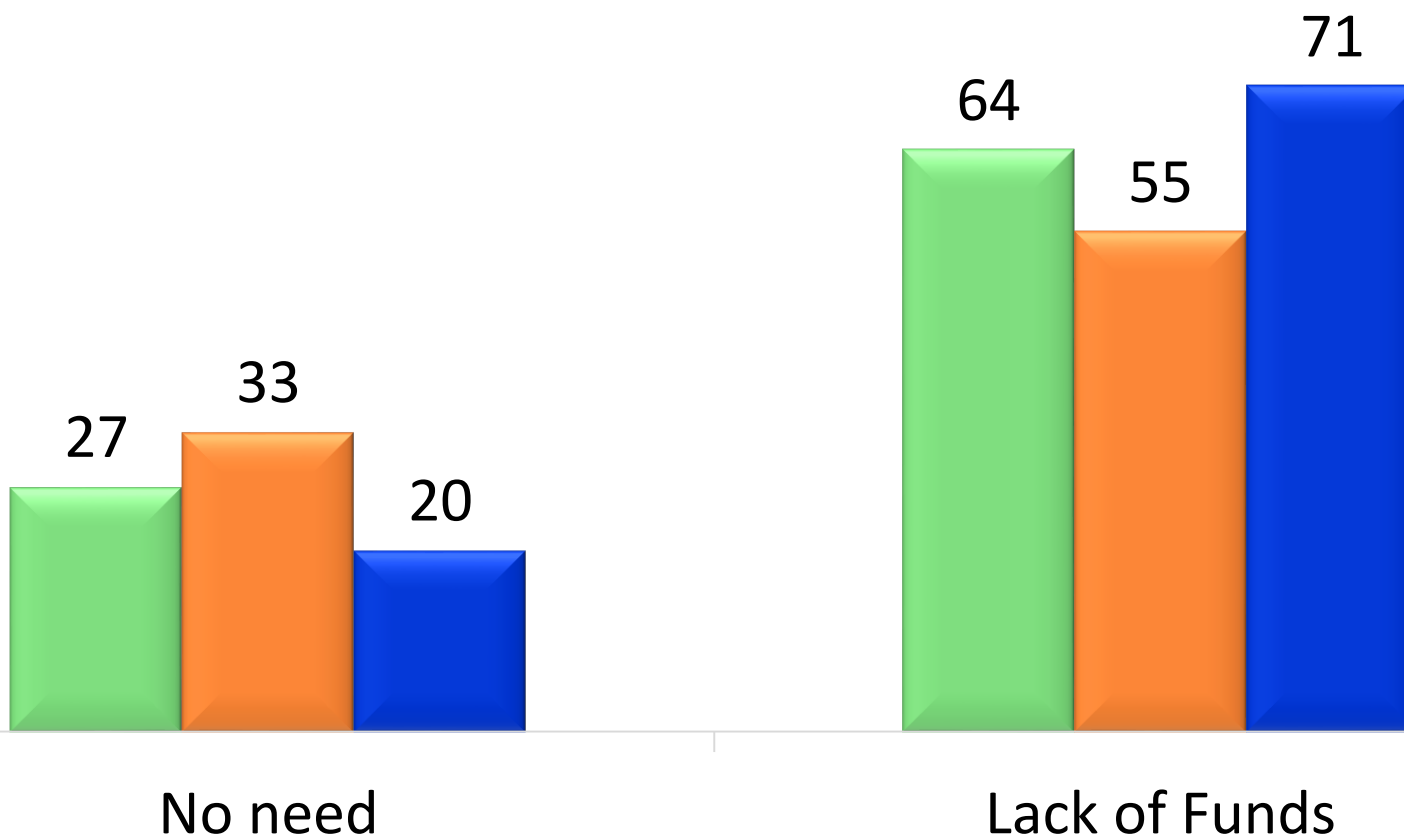
Accessibility of this equipment by sub counties %



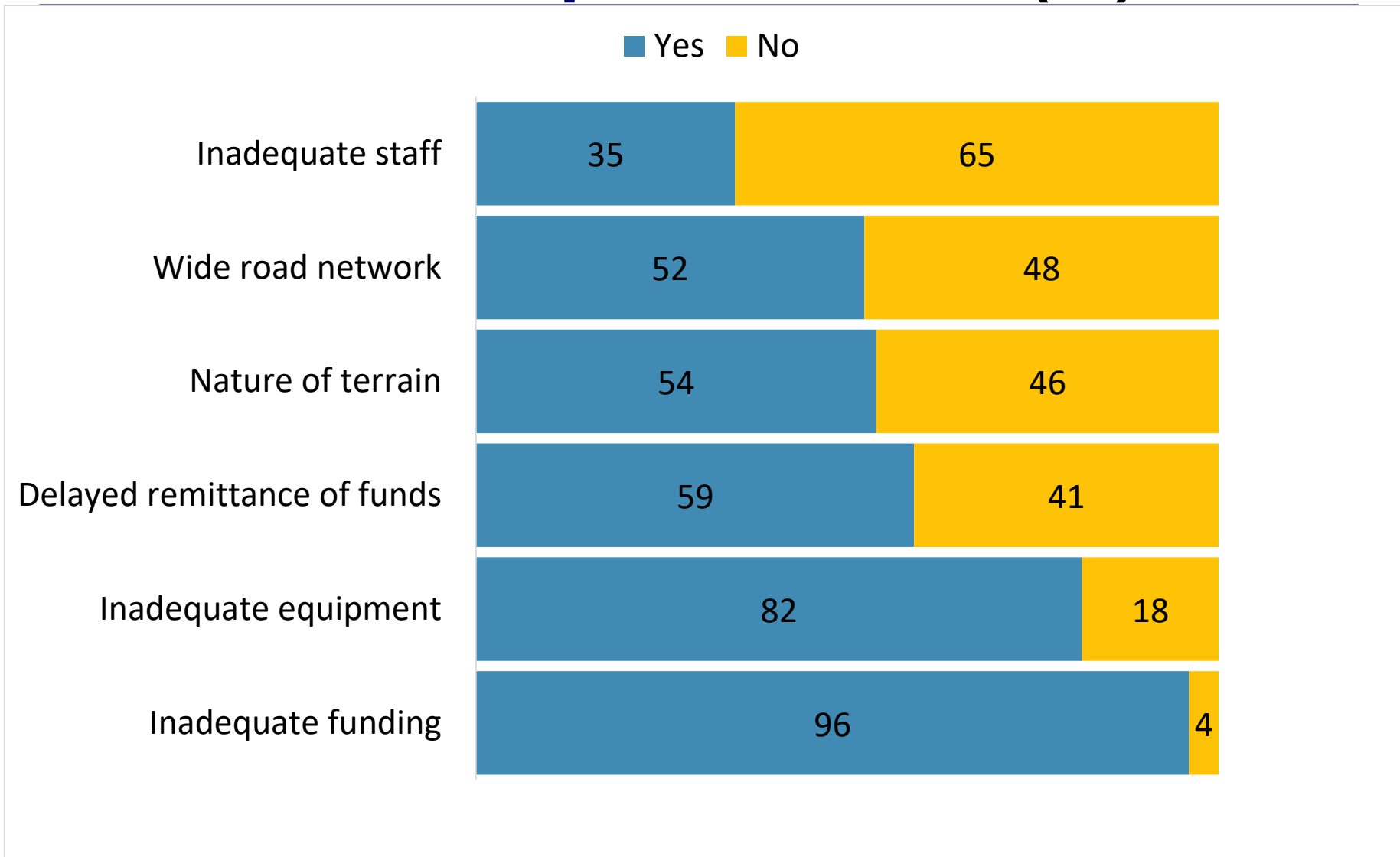


Main reason for not constructing new roads in the last 2 years (%)

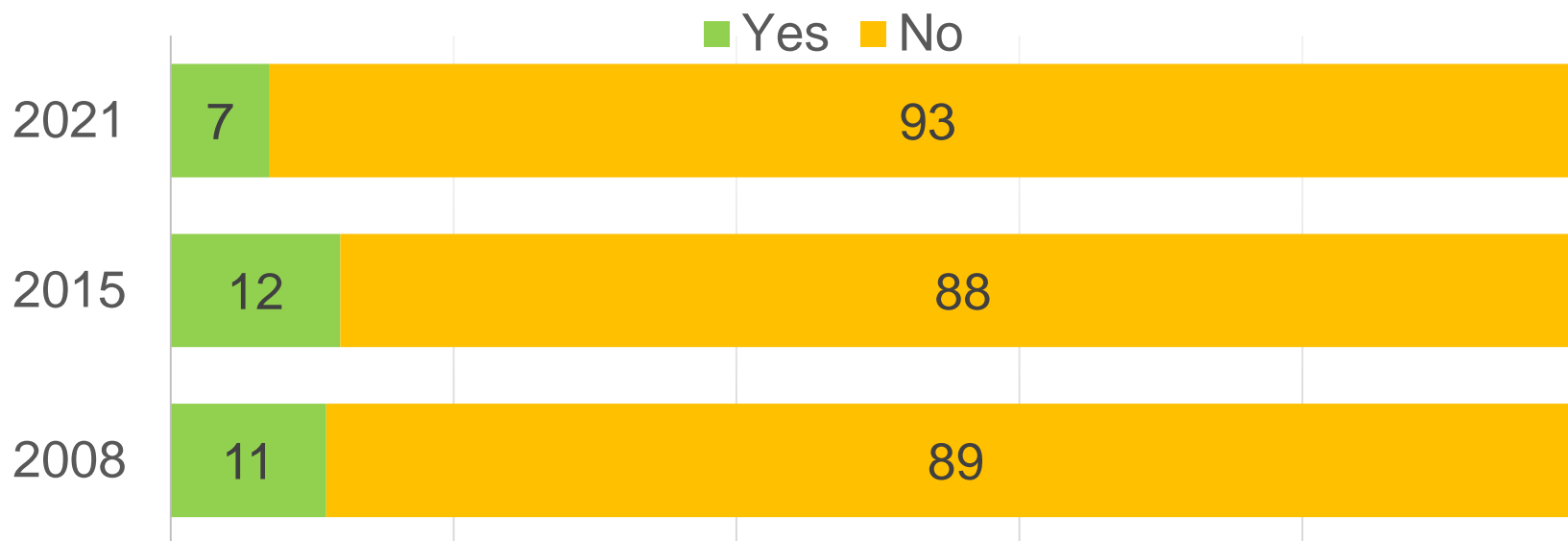
Main constraints to maintenance and repair of roads (%)

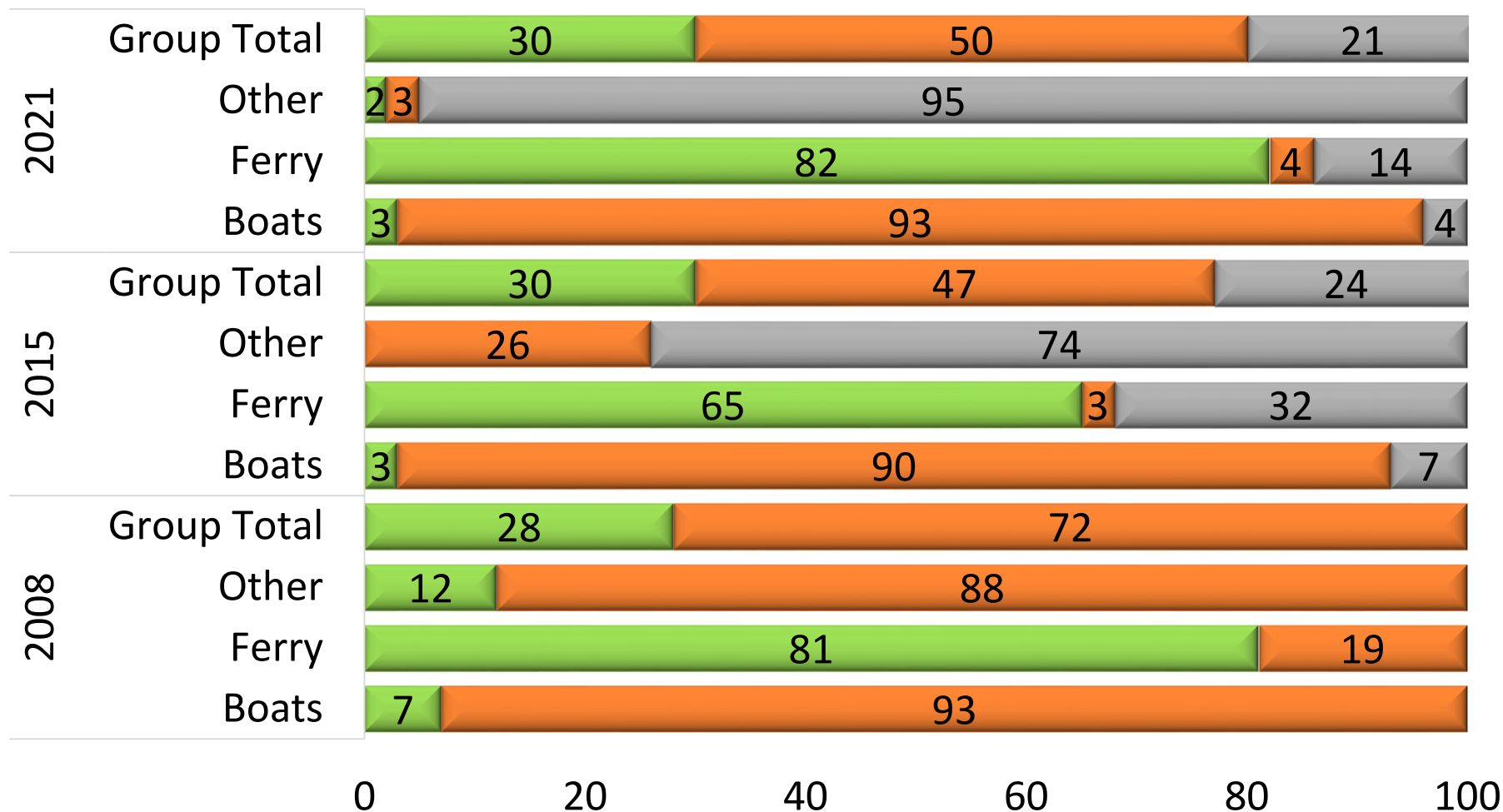
Households use of Water Transport (%)

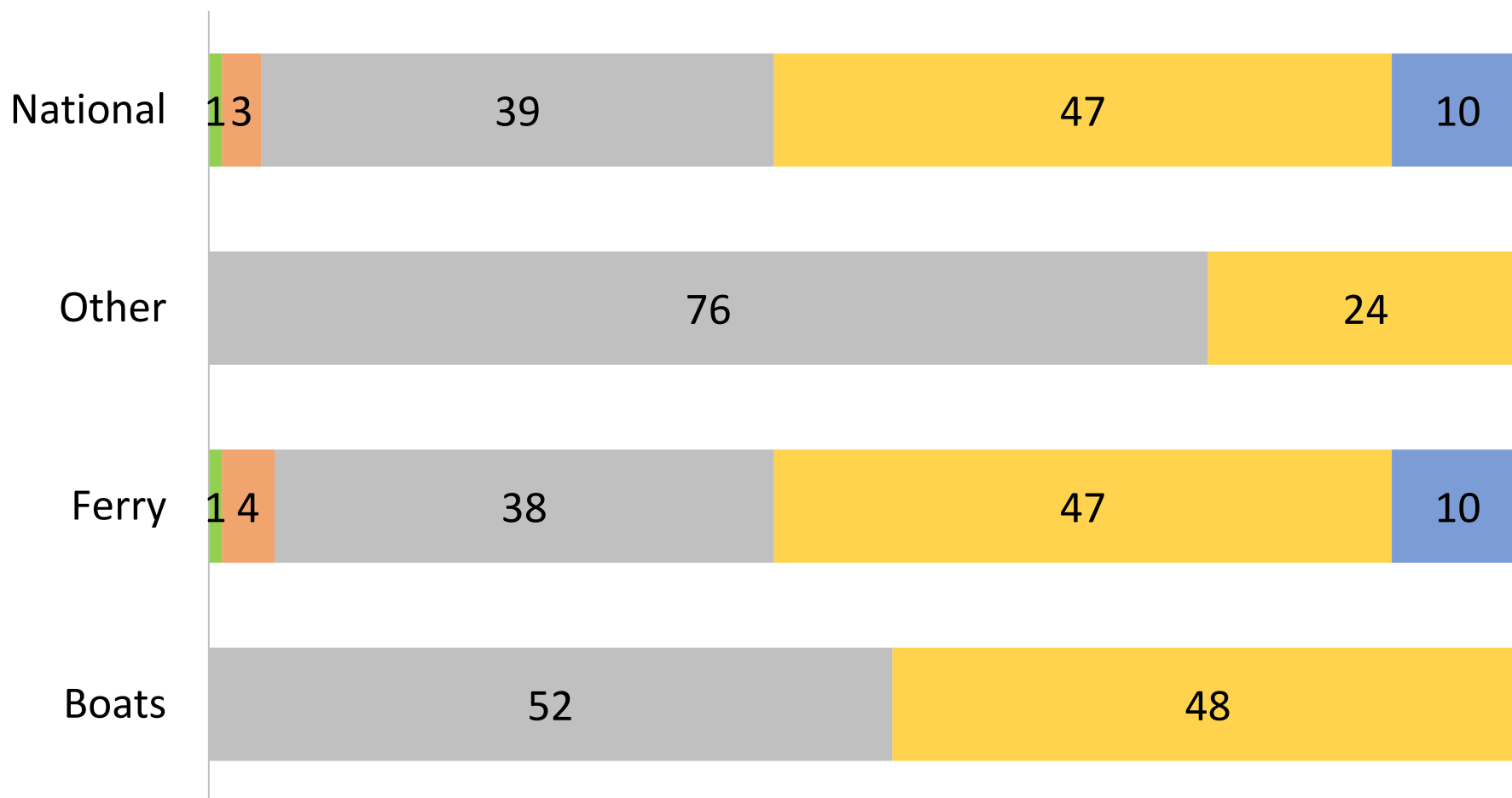
Water transport by major provider (%)

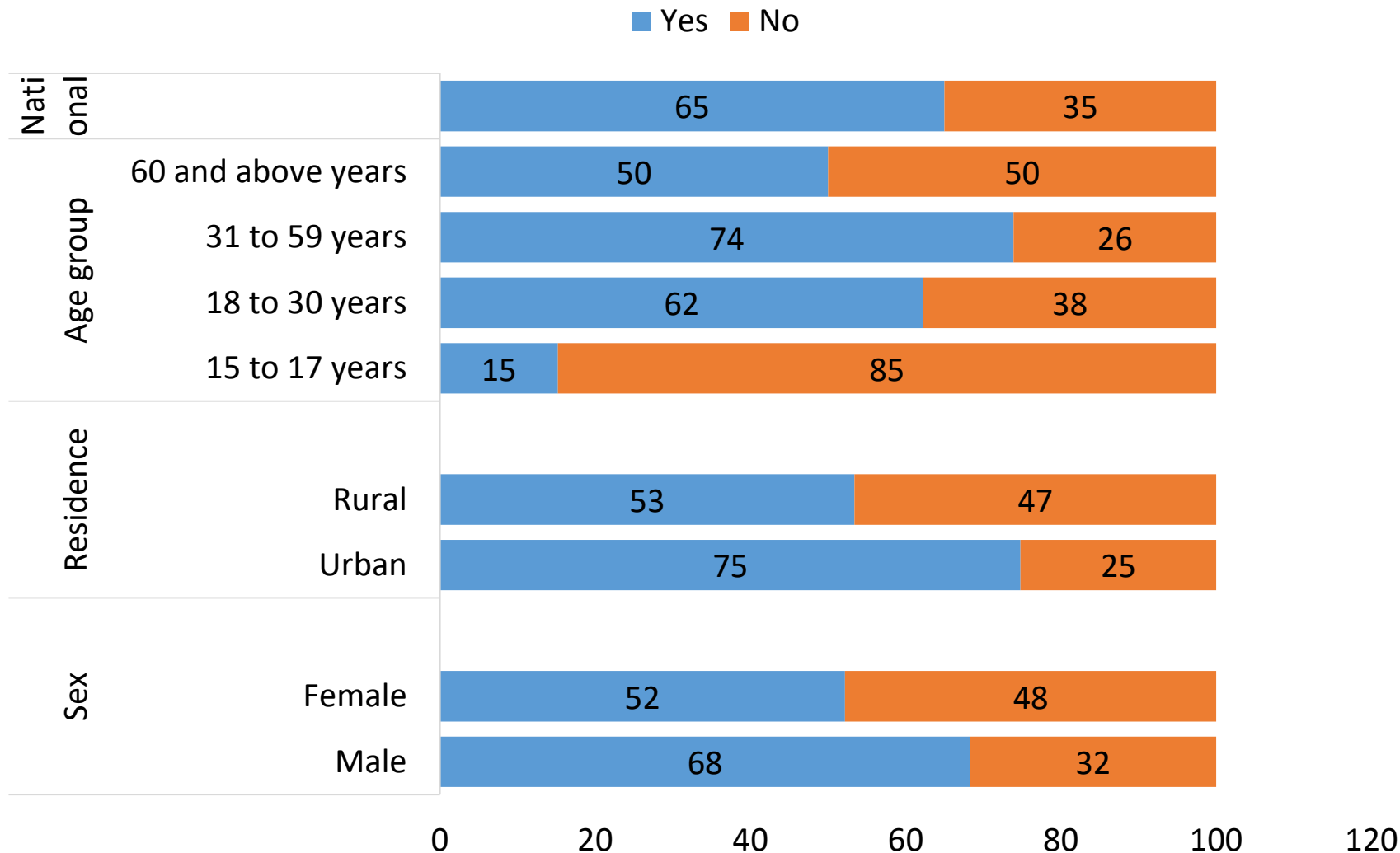

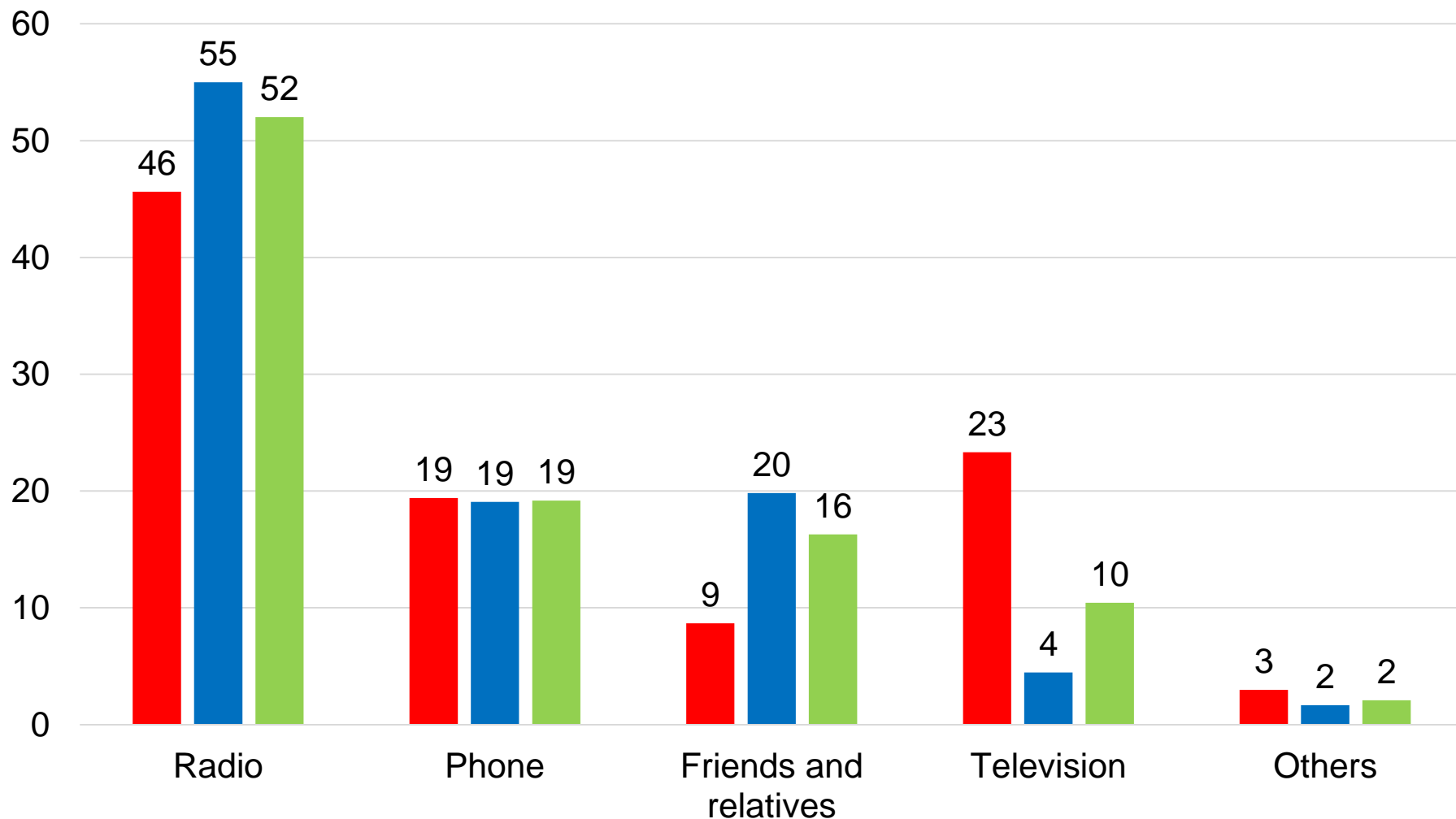

Households' main source of information (%)

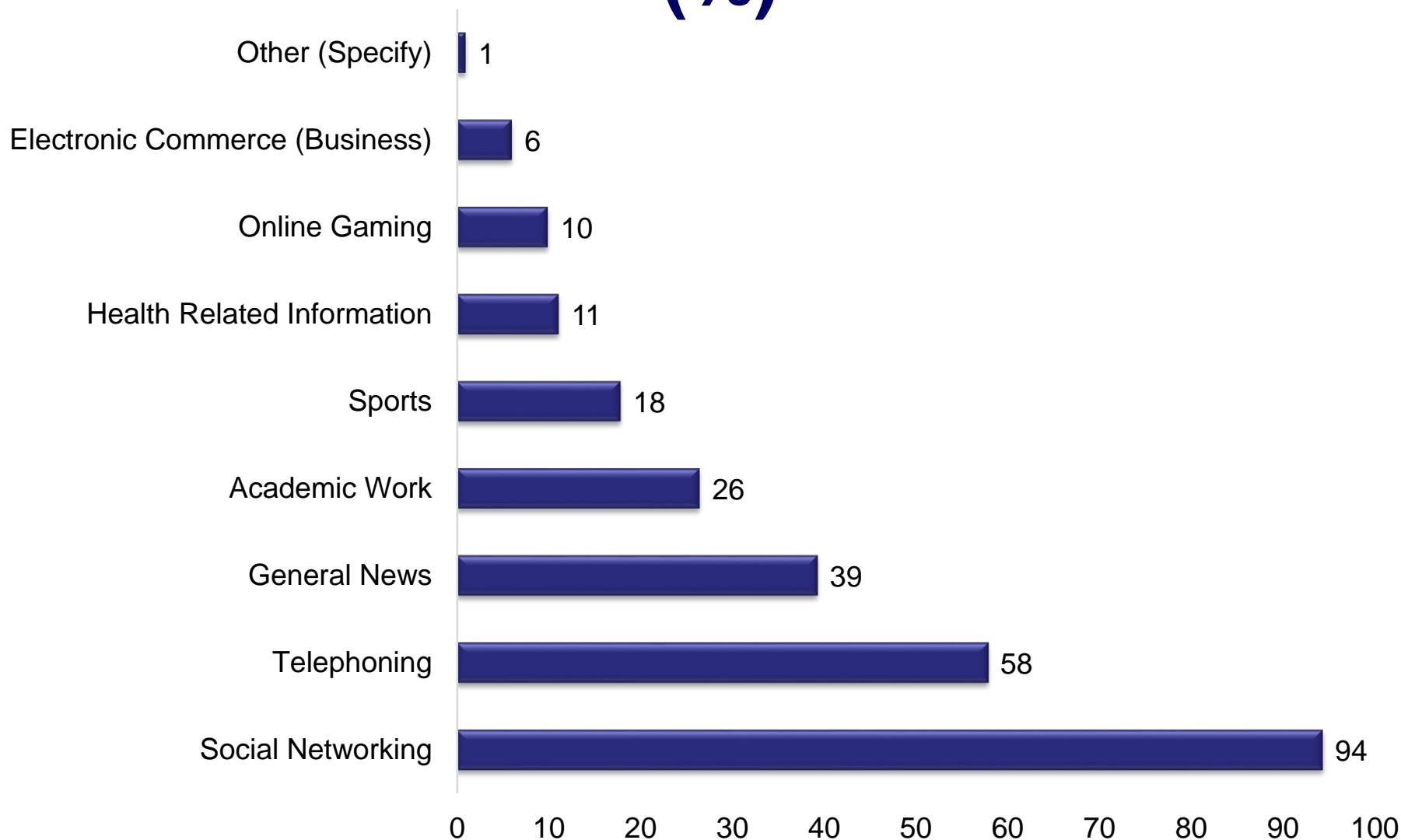

Internet use for persons 15 years and above (%)

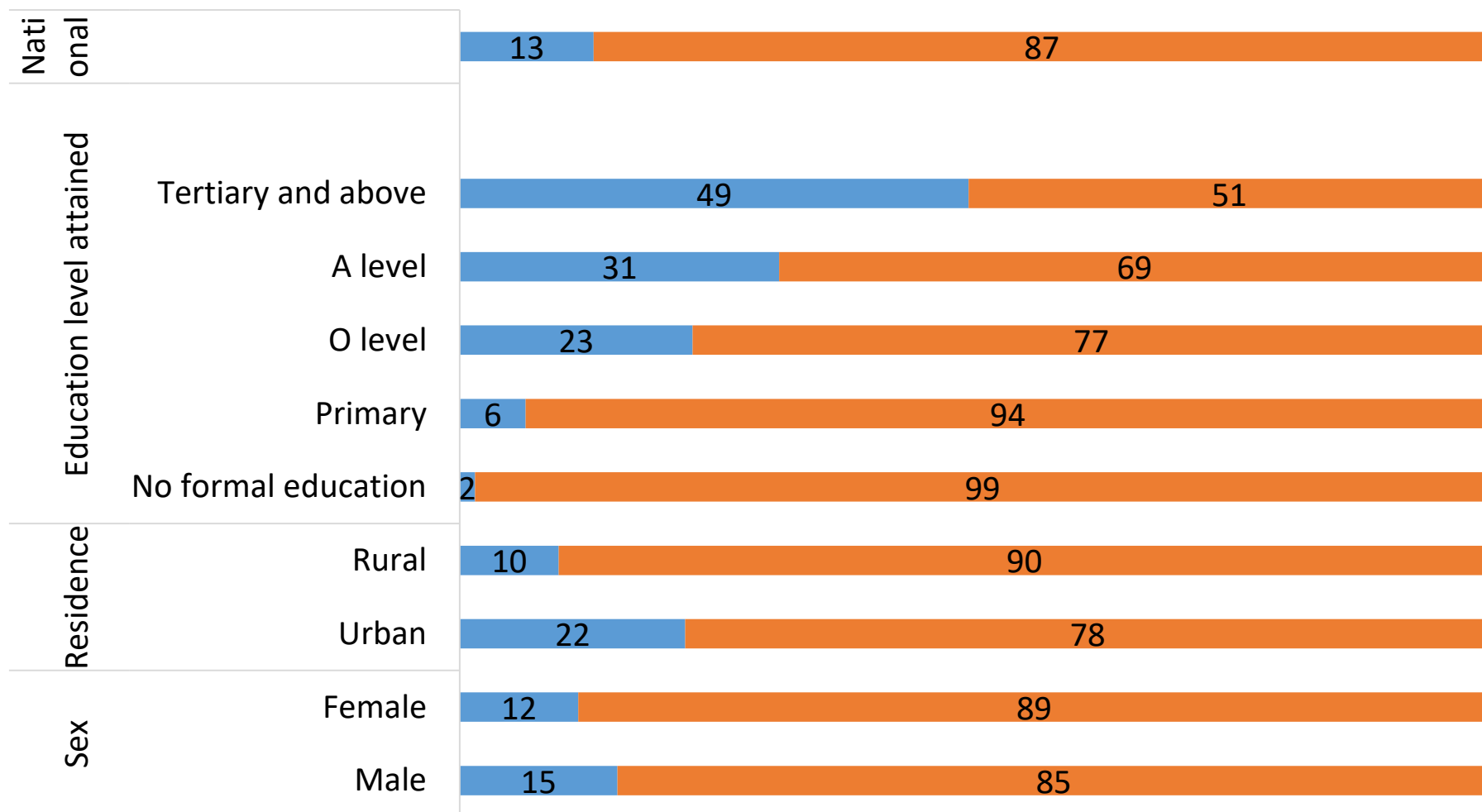

Summary of findings

- 78% households lived in owned dwelling units, which was a two % increase from 2015.
- More than three quarters of dwellings (78%) had iron sheets as roofing material
- 45 % of the dwellings were constructed with burnt brick walls;
- 36 % of the dwellings had cement screed floors.

Summary of findings

- 68 % of the households depend on firewood and charcoal (28 %) for cooking, which puts the environment at risk of degradation.
- There was an increase in the access and usage of electricity for lighting (from 18 % in NSDS 2015 to 20 % in NSDS 2021).

Summary of findings

- 46 % of the households that consume electricity paid the energy company followed by 36 % that used post - paid meters.
- Generally, households using electricity experienced load shedding three times a week for about 18 hours a day



Summary of findings



- Two in every ten hhs have land with registered title.
- The main Source of Energy for Cooking was wood 68(%
- 20% of the hhs that use of grid electricity for lighting
