
## 1.1 Annual Inflation

The Annual Headline Inflation for the year ending February 2021 is recorded at 3.8 percent compared to the 3.7 percent registered for the year ended January 2021. The increase in Annual Headline inflation is mainly attributed to the Annual Food Crops and Related Items Inflation increased to minus 4.3 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 5.6 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. This rise was mainly driven by Annual Inflation for Vegetables that recorded a minus 4.7 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 7.4 percent recorded in January 2021. In particular, the Annual Inflation for Vegetables cultivated for their fruit, increased to minus 12.6 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to the minus 17.2 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. However, Annual Fruits Inflation decreased to minus 3.3 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to the minus 17.2 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to the minus 17.2 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. However, Annual Fruits Inflation decreased to minus 3.3 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 2.5 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. See table 1.

The Annual Core Inflation for the year ending February 2021 increased to 5.6 percent compared to 5.5 percent registered for the year ended January 2021. The increase in Annual Core Inflation is attributed to Annual Other Goods Inflation that registered 2.3 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 2.1 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. Specifically, the Annual inflation for Purchase of second hand vehicles increased to 21.9 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 14.7 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. Also, Annual inflation for Sugar increased to minus 5.0 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 5.0 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 9.4 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. However, Services Inflation registered 10.6 percent for the year ending February 2021 the same rate recorded for the year ended January 2021. See Table 1 and 7.

The Annual Energy Fuel and Utilities (EFU) Inflation decreased to minus 2.6 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 1.9 percent registered for the year ended January 2021. The decrease in Annual EFU Inflation is attributed to Solid fuels Inflation that decreased to minus 3.8 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 2.1 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. Specifically, Charcoal Inflation decreased to minus 3.4 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 1.5 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. 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#### Figure 1: Uganda Headline Index and Annual Inflation for 3 major components, February 2020– February 2021: (2009/2010 = 100)


## 1.2 Annual Headline Inflation by Income Groups and Geographical areas

Analysis by geographical areas and income groups reveal that Arua registered the highest Annual Inflation of 5.7 percent for the year ending February 2021 this was lower than the 7.2 percent registered for the year ended January 2021. This was driven by Annual Inflation for Transport that increased to 25.3 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 24.9 percent registered for the year ended January 2021. In addition, Annual inflation for Miscellaneous goods and services increased to 3.4 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 2.8 percent registered for the year ended January 2021, see Table 8.

The second highest Inflation was registered in the basket of Kampala High Income that registered an Inflation of 5.0 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to the 5.1 percent registered for the year ended January 2021. The main driver was Annual Health Inflation that rose to 11.1 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 2.1 percent registered for the year ended January 2021, In addition, Annual Transport Inflation rose to 27.9 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 26.9 percent registered for the year ended January 2021.




Figure 2: Clothing and Footwear Annual Inflation Trends; February 2019 – February 2021.

The least Annual Inflation was registered in Mbale at 1.8 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 1.9 percent for the year ended January 2021. The low inflation in the Centre was due to the Annual Food and non-alcoholic beverages Inflation that declined to minus 2.6 Percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 2.2 percent registered for the year ended January 2021. In addition, Annual Health Inflation declined to minus 2.5 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to the minus 0.2 percent registered for the year ended January 2021 compared to the minus 0.2 percent registered for the year ended January 2021. *Annual Inflation figures for all the ten consumption baskets are shown in Figure 2 and Table 8.*

## 1.3 Monthly Inflation

The Monthly Headline Inflation for February 2021 rose by 0.3 percent compared to the 0.2 percent rise recorded in January 2021.

The rise in the Monthly Headline Inflation is attributed to Monthly Core Inflation that registered a 0.2 percent rise in February 2021 from the 0.2 percent drop in January 2021. The rise in Monthly core Inflation was due to the monthly services Inflation that increased by 0.2 percent in February 2021 compared to the 0.9 percent drop recorded in January 2021. In addition, Other goods Inflation increased by 0.2 percent in February 2021 from the 0.3 percent rise recorded in January 2021, See Table 1 & 7

The Monthly Food Crops and Related Items Inflation increased by 2.2 percent for the month of February 2021 compared to the 1.1 percent rise registered in January 2021. The increase is due to Monthly Vegetables Inflation that registered 7.8 percent increase for the month of February 2021 from the 1.7 percent rise registered in January 2021, See Table 1.

The Monthly Energy Fuel and Utilities Inflation decreased by 0.1 percent during the month of February 2021 compared to the 2.8 percent rise recorded in January 2021. The decrease was due to Monthly Solid Fuels Inflation that recorded a 0.2 percent drop in February 2021 compared to 6.7 percent rise recorded for January 2021. In addition, the Monthly Liquid gas Inflation further declined by 0.7 percent during the month of February 2021 from the earlier 0.3 percent drop recorded in January 2021, See Table 1 & 2...*The detailed Monthly Inflation figures by COICOP Division are presented in Section 2 of the explanatory notes in the annex.*

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## ANNEX 1: ANNUAL INFLATION BY COICOP DIVISIONS


The evolution of Annual Inflation according to COICOP is described in the following paragraphs, reference is made to table 3.

## 01 Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The Annual Inflation for Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages increased to minus 0.9 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 1.2 recorded for the year ended January 2021. This was due to Annual Food Inflation that registered minus 0.9 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 1.2 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021.

However, Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation decreased to 0.0 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.1 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. *Figure 3 shows the trends of Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages Annual Inflation from February 2019 to February 2021.* 





## 02 Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics

The Annual Inflation for Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics increased to 3.4 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 2.8 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. This was due to Annual Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that increased to 3.3 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 2.7 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. However, Annual Tobacco Inflation decreased to 3.7 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 4.8 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021.

## 03 Clothing and Footwear

The Annual Inflation for Clothing and Footwear decreased to 2.4 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 3.5 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. This was due to Clothing Inflation that decreased to 2.5 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 3.2 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. In addition, Footwear Inflation decreased to 2.1 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 4.9 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. Figure 4 shows the trends of Clothing and Footwear Inflation from February 2019 to February 2021.

## 04 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels comprises of Actual Rentals for Housing, Maintenance & repair of the dwelling, Water Supply, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels.

The Annual Inflation for Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other Fuels decreased to minus 1.4 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 0.9 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. The decrease was attributed to Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation that decreased to minus 3.3 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 2.2 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. In addition, Maintenance & Repair of the Dwelling Inflation decreased to 2.2 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 2.7 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021.

However, Actual Rentals for Housing Inflation registered 0.2 percent for the year ending February 2021 which is the same rate as that recorded for the year ended January 2021. Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services relating to the dwelling Inflation recorded a minus 0.1 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared minus 0.8 recorded for the year ended January 2021.

## 05 Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

This Division Comprises of Furniture & furnishings, Carpets & Other Floor Coverings, Household Textiles, Household Appliances, Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils, Tools and Equipment for House & Garden, and Goods & Services for Routine Household Maintenance.

The Annual Inflation for Furnishings, Household Equipment & Routine Household Maintenance decreased to 0.2 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.4 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. The drop was due to Household Appliances Inflation decreased to minus 1.5 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 0.3 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. In addition, Tools and Equipment for House and Garden Inflation decreased to 4.6 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 5.1 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils Inflation decreased to 3.9 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 4.2 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. Furniture & furnishings, Carpets & Other Floor Coverings decreased to minus 2.5 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 2.3 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. However, Household Textiles Inflation registered 1.6 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 2.3 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 2.3 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. The health Division comprises of Medical Products, Appliances & Equipment, Outpatient Services, and Hospital Services.

The Annual Health Inflation increased to 4.1 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 1.3 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. This was due to Annual Hospital Services Inflation that increased to 17.2 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 4.7 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. In addition, Annual Outpatient Services Inflation increased to 6.4 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 2.4 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. Annual Medical Products, Appliances and Equipment Inflation increased to 0.4 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.1 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021.

### 07 Transport

Transport division comprises of Purchase of vehicles, Operation of Transport and Personal Equipment and Transport Services.

Annual Transport Inflation increased to 28.9 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 28.1 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. This was mainly attributed to Purchase of Vehicles Inflation that increased to 18.0 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 12.3 percent registered for the year ended January 2021. However, Operation of Personal Transport Equipment Inflation decreased to minus 0.2 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.0percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. Transport services Inflation dropped to 56.3 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 57.8 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021.

### 08 Communication

Communication includes Postal services, Telephones and Telefax equipment and Telephone and Telefax services.

The Annual Communication Inflation decreased to 0.0 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.3 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. This was due to Annual Postal Services Inflation decreased to 0.0 percent compared to 21.9 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. Annual Telephone and Telefax Equipment Inflation registered 0.1 percent for the year ending February 2021 same as that recorded for the year ended January 2021. Telephone & Telefax Services Inflation recorded 0.0 percent for the year ending February 2021 same rate recorded for the year ended January 2021.

## 09 Recreation and Culture

Recreation and Culture comprises of Audio-visual, photographic & Information processing equipment, Recreational & Cultural services, Newspapers, books & Stationery and Package Holidays.

Annual Inflation for Recreation and Culture decreased to 0.3 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.7 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. This was due to Newspapers, Books & Stationery Inflation decreased to 0.6 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 1.3 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. In addition, Audio-visual, photographic & Information processing equipment Inflation that decreased to 0.0 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.2 that recorded for the year ended January 2021. Recreational & Cultural Services Inflation decreased to 0.4 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.7 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021.

However, Package Holidays Inflation increased to 0.3 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to minus 0.3 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021.

## 10 Education

Education comprises of Pre-Primary and Primary Education, Secondary Education, Post-secondary non-tertiary education, Tertiary Education and Education not definable by level.

The Annual Inflation for Education decreased to 0.0 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.3 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. This was due to Secondary Education Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.0 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. In addition, Pre-Primary and Primary Education Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.3 percent recorded for the year ending February 2021.

However, Tertiary Education Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the year ending February 2021 the same rate recorded for the year ended January 2021. Education not definable by level recorded 0.2 percent for the year ending February 2021 same rate recorded for the year ended January 2021.

#### 11 Restaurants and Hotels

Restaurants and Hotels comprises of catering services and accommodation services.

Annual Inflation for Restaurants and Hotels decreased to 1.1 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 1.5 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. This was due to Catering Services Inflation that decreased to 1.6 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 2.0 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. In addition, Accommodation services Inflation decreased to 0.1 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.2 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021.

#### 12 Miscellaneous Goods and Services

Miscellaneous goods and services comprises of Personal Care such as hairdressing salons and personal grooming establishments, Personal Effects such as Jewellery, clocks and watches, Insurance and Other services such as passport fees, photocopying and radio announcements.

The Miscellaneous Goods and Services Inflation for the year ending February 2021 increased to 1.9 percent compared to 1.3 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. This was due to Personal Care Inflation that increased to 1.5 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.9 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021. In addition, Personal Effects Inflation increased to 3.4 percent for the year ending February 2021 compared to 0.6 percent recorded for the year ended January 2021.

However, Insurance Inflation registered minus 0.1 percent for the year ending February 2021 same rate recorded for the year ended January 2021. Other Services n.e.c Inflation registered 4.3 percent for the year ending February 2021 same rate recorded for the year ended January 2021.

## ANNEX 2: MONTHLY INFLATION BY COICOP DIVISIONS

The evolution of Monthly Inflation according to COICOP is described in the following paragraphs, reference is made to table 4.

## 01 Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The Monthly Inflation for Food and Non-alcoholic Beverages registered an increase of 0.9 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.8 percent rise recorded for January 2021. This was due to Food Inflation that further increased by 0.9 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.9 percent rise recorded for January 2021. Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation increased by 0.1 percent for the month of February 2021 compared to 0.0 percent recorded for January 2021.

## 02 Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics

The Monthly Inflation for Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics registered increased by 0.5 percent during the month of February 2021 from the 0.3 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2021. This was mainly due to Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that registered 0.6 percent rise for the month of February 2021 from 0.6 percent drop recorded for January 2021. However, Tobacco Inflation dropped by 0.4 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 1.7 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2021.

## 03 Clothing and Footwear

The Monthly Inflation for Clothing and Footwear registered a decrease of 0.4 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded for January 2021. This was due to Clothing Inflation that decreased by 0.4 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.0 percent recorded for January 2021. In addition, Footwear Inflation registered a decrease of 0.3 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded for January 2021.

## 04 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels

The Monthly Inflation for Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other fuels registered a decrease of 0.1 percent for the month of February 2021 from 1.9 percent rise recorded for January 2021. This was attributed to Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation that recorded a 0.2 percent drop for the month of February 2021 from 4.1 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2021. However, Maintenance and repair of the dwelling Inflation registered an increase of 0.3 percent for the month of February 2021 from 0.7 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2021. Actual Rentals for Housing Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2021. Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services relating to the dwelling Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2021 same as that recorded for the month of January 2021.

## 05 Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

The Monthly Inflation for Furnishings, Household Equipment & Routine Household Maintenance registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.5 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2021. Household Textiles Inflation registered an increase of 0.2 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 1.1 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2021. In addition, Goods and Services for Routine Household Maintenance Inflation registered a 0.4 percent rise for the month of February 2021 from the 0.5 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2021. However, Household Appliances Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of January 2021 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2021. Tools and Equipment for House & Garden Inflation registered a drop of 0.3 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 1.6 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2021. Furniture and Furnishings, Carpets and Other Floor Coverings Inflation registered a decline of 0.4 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2021. Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils Inflation registered a decrease of 0.1 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2021.

### 06 Health

The Monthly Inflation for Health registered 3.0 percent rise for the month of February 2021 from 0.0 percent recorded for the month of January 2021. This was attributed to Hospital Services Inflation that increased by 12.1 percent for the month of February 2021 from 0.0 percent recorded for the month of January 2021. Outpatient Services Inflation increased by 4.8 percent for the month of February 2021 from 0.0 percent recorded for the month of January 2021. Medical Products, Appliances and Equipment increased by 0.3 percent for the month of February 2021 from 0.0 percent recorded for the month of February 2021 from 0.0 percent recorded for the month of February 2021.

### 07 Transport

Transport Inflation registered a decline of 0.5 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 2.1 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2021. This was due to Transport Services Inflation that recorded a decline of 1.2 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 3.8 percent drop recorded during the month of January 2021. However, Purchase of Vehicles Inflation registered an increase of 0.6 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.8 percent increase recorded during the month of January 2021. Operation of Personal Transport Equipment Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.7 percent drop recorded during the month of January 2021.

## 08 Communication

The Monthly Inflation for Communication registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2021 same as that recorded for the month of January 2021. Telephone and Telefax Equipment Inflation recorded 0.0 percent for the month of February 2021 same as that recorded for the month of January 2021. Telephone and Telefax Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of December same as that recorded for the month of January 2021. Postal services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2021 same as that recorded for the month of December same as that recorded for the month of January 2021. Postal services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2021 same as that recorded for the month of January 2021.

### 09 Recreation and Culture

Monthly Recreation and Culture Inflation registered a rise of 0.2 percent for the month of February 2021 same rate recorded for the month of January 2021. Audio-visual, photographic & Information processing equipment Inflation registered an increase of 0.1 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.7 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2021. Newspapers, Books and Stationery Inflation registered an increase of 0.2 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2021. Newspapers, Books and Stationery Inflation registered an increase of 0.2 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2021. Package Holidays Inflation registered an increase of 0.7 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 1.2 percent drop recorded during the month of January 2021. Recreational and Cultural Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2021.

## 10 Education

Monthly Inflation for Education registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2021 same as that recorded for the month of January 2021. This was due to Pre-primary & Primary Education, Secondary Education and Tertiary Education all registering 0.0 percent for the month of January 2021. In addition, Education not defined by Level Inflation for the month of February 2021 registered an increase of 0.2 percent from 0.0 percent recorded during the month of January 2021.

## 11 Restaurants and Hotels

The Monthly Inflation for Restaurants and Hotels registered a 0.1 percent drop for the month of February 2021 from the 0.4 percent increase recorded during the month of January 2021. This was due to Catering Services Inflation that recorded a 0.1 percent drop for the month of February 2021 from 0.5 percent rise recorded during the month of January 2021. However, Accommodation Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2021 same rate recorded for the month of January 2021.

## 12 Miscellaneous Goods and Services

Miscellaneous Goods and Services Inflation for the month of February 2021 registered an increase of 0.4 percent from 0.1 percent rise recorded during the month of January 2021. This was due to Personal Care Inflation that recorded a rise of 0.3 percent for the month of February 2021 same rate recorded for the month of January 2021. In addition, Personal Effects n.e.c Inflation registered an increase of 2.9 percent during the month of February 2021 from the 2.7 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2021. However, Insurance Inflation registered 0.0 percent during the month of February 2021 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2021. Other Services n.e.c Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2021 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2021.
