CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION

MARCH 2023

1.1 Annual Headline Inflation

The Annual Inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index for Uganda for the 12 months to March 2023 is registered at 9.0 percent compared to the 9.2 percent registered in the year ended February 2023. This is mainly due to the slight slowdown in Annual Core Inflation that registered 7.6 percent in the year ending March 2023 compared to 7.8 percent registered in the year ended February 2023.

The Annual Core Inflation was mainly attributed to the Annual Other Goods Inflation that registered 10.4 percent in the year ending March 2023 compared to 10.9 percent in the year ended February 2023. The main driver was laundry soap inflation that registered 4.4 percent in March 2023 compared to 21.5 percent registered in February 2023. In addition, sugar inflation registered 38.7 percent in March 2023 compared to 42.8 percent registered in February 2023.

The Annual Food Crops and Related Items inflation slowed down to 26.7 percent in the year ending March 2023 compared to 27.4 percent registered in the year ended February 2023. This was mainly due to tomatoes inflation that registered 33.3 percent in March 2023 compared to 44.0 percent registered in February 2023, matooke inflation that registered 47.4 percent in March 2023 compared to 61.0 percent in February 2023 and cassava inflation that registered 65.8 percent in March 2023 compared to 82.0 percent in February 2023.


The Annual Energy Fuel and Utilities (EFU) inflation slowed down to 4.4 percent in the year ending March 2023 compared to 5.2 percent registered in the year ended February 2023. This was mainly due to solid fuels inflation that registered 7.2 percent in March 2023 compared to 8.6 percent in February 2023. In particular, charcoal inflation registered 7.7 percent in March 2023 compared to 10.2 percent in February 2023. In addition, petrol inflation slowed down to 0.2 percent in March 2023 compared to 1.5 percent in February 2023 as shown in Table 1 and Figure 1.

1.2 Annual Inflation by COICOP Divisions

According to the Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP), the main drivers to the registered inflation were commodities under; 'Furnishings, household equipment and routine household' whose inflation registered 5.4 percent in the year ending March 2023 compared to 9.0 percent registered in the year ended February 2023.'Transport' inflation was registered at 4.3 percent in March 2023 compared to 5.4 percent registered in February 2023.

Recreation, Sport and Culture decreased to 3.3 percent for the year ending March 2023 compared to 5.0 percent registered for the year ended February 2023. 'Housing, water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' inflation registered 4.3 percent for the year ending March 2023 compared to 5.0 percent registered for the year ended February 2023.

However, there was an increase in price of commodities under; Education Services whose inflation was registered at 7.3 percent for the year ending March 2023 compared to 4.3 percent for the year ended February 2023. In addition, Information and Communication Inflation registered 1.2 percent for the year ending March 2023 compared to 0.2 percent for the year ended February 2023 as shown in Table 3 below.

1.3 Annual Goods Inflation

The goods inflation for the 12 months to March 2023 was registered at 12.0 percent compared to 12.4 percent registered in February 2023. This was mainly due to annual inflation for non-durable (ND) goods that was registered at 15.0 percent for the 12 months to March 2023 compared to 15.5 percent registered in February 2023. In addition, Annual inflation for semi-durable goods (SD) registered 3.5 percent in March 2023 compared to 3.7 percent registered in February 2023. Annual inflation for durable (D) goods was registered at 1.6 percent for the 12 months to March 2023 compared to 1.8 percent registered in the year ended February 2023as shown in Table 4 below.

1.4 Monthly Inflation.

The Monthly Headline Inflation for March 2023 increased by 0.6 percent compared to 0.1 percent drop recorded in the month of February 2023 as shown in Table 5 below.

The main driver was the monthly core inflation that increased by 0.4 percent in March 2023 from the 0.0 percent recorded in February 2023. This was mainly due to monthly services inflation that increased by 0.6 percent in March 2023 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded in February 2023. Specifically, primary education inflation increased by 5.1 percent in March 2023 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in February 2023. In addition, monthly other goods inflation increased by 0.3 percent in March 2023 from the 0.3 percent drop registered in February 2023. The rise in monthly other goods inflation was mainly due to the monthly rice inflation that increased by 2.3 percent in March 2023 from the 1.4 percent drop recorded in February 2023. Maize flour inflation increased by 1.8 percent in March 2023 from the 21.4 percent drop recorded in February 2023.

Food crops and related items monthly inflation registered a 3.2 percent rise in March 2023, from the 0.4 percent drop registered in February 2023. This was mainly due to monthly beans inflation that increased by 10.1 percent in March 2023 from the 3.9 percent rise recorded in February 2023. In addition, irish potatoes inflation increased by 9.0 percent in March 2023 from the 0.2 percent drop recorded in February 2023.

Energy Fuel and Utilities (EFU) inflation decreased by 0.1 percent in March 2023 from the 0.9 percent drop in February 2023. The drop in EFU was mainly due to solid fuels inflation that decreased by 0.8 percent in March 2023 compared to the 0.3 percent rise recorded in February 2023. Specifically, monthly firewood inflation decreased by 2.4 percent in March 2023 from the 2.0 percent riseregistered in February 2023.

1.5 Monthly Inflation by COICOP Divisions

The monthly headline inflation for March 2023 increased by 0.6 percent compared to 0.1 percent drop recorded in the month of February 2023. This was mainly attributed to the Monthly Food and

Non- Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that increased by 1.4 percent in March 2023 from the 1.2 percent drop recorded in February 2023. In addition, Monthly 'education services' inflation increased by 2.9 percent in the month of March 2023 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in February 2023. Monthly restaurants and accommodation services inflation increased by 1.5 percent in March 2023 from the 0.7 percent rise recorded in February 2023.

However, transport inflation decreased by 0.6 percent in March 2023 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded in February 2023. Monthly healthinflation decreased by 0.4 percent in March 2023 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded in February 2023. Monthly Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels inflation decreased by 0.2 percent in March 2023 from 0.1 percent rise registered in February 2023 as indicated in Table 7 below.

1.5 Annual Headline Inflation by Income Groups and Geographical areas

Analysis by geographical areas and income groups revealed that Arua registered the highest inflation of 13.6 percent for the 12 months to March 2023 compared to 13.8 percent recorded in February 2023. This was mainly driven by annual 'Recreation, Sport and Culture' inflation that increased to 20.7 percent in March 2023 compared to 6.2 percent registered in February 2023. In addition, annual 'transport' inflation registered 5.9 percent in March 2023 compared to 2.8 percent in February 2023.

The second highest inflation was registered in Fortportal at 11.2 percent for the 12 months to March 2023 compared to 11.5 percent recorded in February 2023. This was mainly driven by annual 'housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels' inflation that registered 6.5 percent in March 2023 compared to 2.8 percent registered in February 2023. In addition, annual 'education services' inflation registered 10.5 percent in March 2023 compared to 7.5 percent in February 2023.

The least annual inflation was registered in Kampala High Income at 7.2 percent for the 12 months to March 2023 compared to 6.8 percent recorded in February 2023. This was mainly due to the annual inflation for transport that registered 5.3 percent in March 2023 compared to 6.7 percent registered in February 2023. In addition, annual 'recreation, sport and culture' inflation registered 2.2 percent in March 2023 compared to 4.1 percent in February 2023.
