CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION

MAY 2023

1.1 Annual Headline Inflation

The Annual Inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index for Uganda for the 12 months to May 2023 is registered at 6.2 percent compared to the 8.0 percent registered in the year ended April 2023.

The slowdown in the Annual Inflation is largely attributed to the Annual Core inflation, which slowed down to 5.6 percent in the year ending May 2023 compared to 6.8 percent registered in the year ended April 2023. The main driver to Annual Core Inflation was the Annual Other Goods Inflation that registered 7.4 percent in the year ending May 2023 compared to 8.8 percent in the year ended April 2023. The main drivers were Maize Flour inflation that registered 28.0 percent in May 2023 compared to 49.4 percent registered in April 2023, Rice inflation registered 35.3 percent in May 2023 compared to 42.2 percent registered in April 2023, Cassava flour inflation registered 50.5 percent in May 2023 compared to 69.3 percent registered in April 2023 and Laundry Soap Bar inflation registered negative 9.7 percent in May 2023 compared to negative 6.0 percent registered in April 2023. Annual Services inflation also declined to 3.4 percent in the year ending May 2023 compared to 4.3 percent registered in the year ended April 2023. This is attributed to Annual Transport inflation that decelerated to negative 0.3 percent in May 2023 compared to 3.9 percent in April 2023.

The other driver to the slowdown in the Annual Inflation was the Annual Food Crops and Related Items Inflation that registered 15.7 percent in the year ending May 2023 compared to 25.3 percent registered in the year ended April 2023. This is attributed to Tomatoes Inflation that registered negative 26.2 percent in May 2023 compared to 26.3 percent registered in April 2023, Cooking Bananas inflation that registered 46.3 percent in May 2023 compared to 62.9 percent registered in April 2023, Sweet potatoes inflation that registered 15.9 percent in May 2023 compared to 34.8 percent registered in April 2023 and Beans inflation that registered 40.1 percent in May 2023 compared to 45.1 percent in April 2023.


In addition, the Annual Energy Fuel and Utilities (EFU) inflation slowed down to 0.9 percent in the year ending May 2023 compared to 2.1 percent registered in the year ended April 2023. This was mainly due to liquid Energy Fuels inflation that registered negative 4.4 percent in May 2023 compared to 2.1 percent in April 2023. In particular, Diesel inflation registered negative 9.0 percent in May 2023 compared to 7.3 percent in April 2023. In addition, Petrol inflation slowed down to negative 7.0 percent in May 2023 compared to negative 2.9 percent in April 2023 as shown in Table 1 and Figure 1.

1.2 Annual Inflation by COICOP Divisions

According to the Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP), the main drivers to the registered inflation were commodities under; 'Food and Non- alcoholic beverages' whose inflation registered 13.5 percent in the year ending May 2023 compared to 18.5 percent registered in the year ended April 2023, Transport whose inflation registered minus 0.3 percent in the year ending May 2023 compared to 3.9 percent registered in the year ended April 2023, Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics whose inflation registered 7.3 percent in the year ending May 2023 compared to 8.7 percent registered in the year ended April 2023, 'Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods whose inflation registered 9.4 percent in the year ending May 2023 compared to 10.1 percent registered in the year ended April 2023, 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household', whose inflation registered 2.1 percent in the year ending May 2023 compared to 2.8 percent registered in the year ended April 2023' and 'Recreation, Sport and Culture' whose inflation registered 1.3 percent in the year ending May 2023 compared to 1.7 percent registered in the year ended April 2023.

However, there was an increase in price of commodities under; 'Health' whose inflation was registered at 2.8 percent for the year ending May 2023 compared to 1.8 percent for the year ended April 2023, 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' whose inflation was registered at 5.4 percent for the year ending May 2023 compared to 5.2 percent for the year ended April 2023. In addition, Information and Communication inflation registered 2.5 percent for the year ending May 2023 compared to minus 2.3 percent for the year ended April 2023 as shown in Table 3 below.

1.3 Annual Goods Inflation

The goods inflation for the 12 months to May 2023 was registered at 7.9 percent compared to 10.3 percent registered in April 2023. This was mainly due to the slowdown in annual inflation for non-durable (ND) goods that was registered at 9.3 percent for the 12 months to May 2023 compared to 12.6 percent registered in April 2023. However, Annual inflation for durable goods (D) registered 1.9 percent in May 2023 compared to 2.4 percent registered in April 2023. Annual inflation for semi-durable (SD) goods was registered at 3.8 percent for the 12 months to May 2023 compared to 3.8 percent registered in the year ended April 2023 as shown in Table 4 below.

1.4 Monthly Inflation.

The Monthly Headline Inflation for May 2023 decreased by 0.3 percent compared to 0.5 percent rise recorded in the month of April 2023 as shown in Table 5 below.

The main driver was the monthly Food Crops and Related items inflation that decreased by 2.3 percent in May 2023 from the 4.1 percent rise recorded in April 2023. This was mainly due to monthly Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses inflation that decreased by 1.9 percent in May 2023 from the 4.3 percent rise recorded in April 2023. Specifically, Cooking Bananas (Matooke) inflation decreased by 8.3 percent in May 2023 from the 16.6 percent rise recorded in April 2023, Tomatoes inflation decreased by 10.1 percent in May 2023 from the 2.8 percent rise recorded in April 2023 and Sweet Potatoes inflation decreased by 9.5 percent in May 2023 from the 7.7 percent rise recorded in April 2023. In addition, monthly Fruits and nuts inflation decreased by 2.3 percent in May 2023 from the 2.2 percent rise recorded in April 2023. The decrease in monthly Fruits and nuts inflation was mainly due to the monthly Passion fruit inflation that decreased by 8.5 percent in May 2023 from the 5.1 percent rise recorded in April 2023, Fresh Leaf Vegetables inflation that decreased by 4.5 percent in May 2023 from the 3.5 percent drop recorded in April 2023 and Avocado inflation that decreased by 7.2 percent in May 2023 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in April 2023.

Core monthly inflation registered by 0.0 percent in May 2023 compared to 0.1 percent rise registered in April 2023. This was mainly due to monthly Services inflation that decreased by 0.1 percent in May 2023 from the 0.4 percent recorded in April 2023. However, other goods inflation registered by 0.0 percent in May 2023 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded in March 2023.

Energy Fuel and Utilities (EFU) inflation decreased by 0.4 percent in May 2023 from 0.1 drop recorded in April 2023. The drop in EFU was mainly due to Firewood inflation that decreased by 3.4 percent in May 2023 compared to the 9.2 percent rise recorded in April 2023. Monthly Liquid energy fuels inflation decreased by 0.8 percent in May 2023 from the 0.7 percent drop registered in April 2023. However, Charcoal inflation increased by 1.3 percent in May 2023 from the 2.3 percent drop registered in April 2023.

1.5 Monthly Inflation by COICOP Divisions

The monthly headline inflation for May 2023 decreased by 0.3 percent compared to 0.5 percent rise recorded in the month of April 2023. This was mainly attributed to the Monthly Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that decreased by 0.8 percent in May 2023 from the 1.0 percent rise recorded in April 2023. In addition, Monthly transport inflation decreased by 1.1 percent in the month of May 2023 from the 0.8 percent rise recorded in April 2023. Monthly Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels inflation decreased by 0.1 percent in May 2023 from the 0.0 percent recorded in April 2023.

However, Health inflation increased by 1.2 percent in May 2023 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded in April 2023. Monthly Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods inflation increased by 0.4 percent in May 2023 from the 0.5 percent rise recorded in April 2023. Monthly Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household inflation increased by 0.4 percent in May 2023 from 0.2 percent rise registered in April 2023 as indicated in Table 7 below.

1.5 Annual Headline Inflation by Income Groups and Geographical areas

Analysis by geographical areas and income groups revealed that Arua registered the highest inflation of 11.6 percent for the 12 months to May 2023 compared to 11.9 percent recorded in April 2023. This was mainly driven by annual 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' inflation that increased to 18.0 percent in May 2023 compared to 4.8 percent registered in April 2023. In addition, annual 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' inflation registered 2.9 percent in May 2023 compared to 1.7 percent in April 2023.

The second highest inflation was registered in Gulu at 7.8 percent for the 12 months to May 2023 compared to 10.1 percent recorded in April 2023. This was mainly driven by annual 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' inflation that registered 11.5 percent in May 2023 compared to 3.8 percent registered in April 2023. In addition, annual 'Clothing and Footwear' inflation registered 4.5 percent in May 2023 compared to 3.6 percent in April 2023.

The least annual inflation was registered in Mbarara at 4.9 percent for the 12 months to May 2023 compared to 7.7 percent recorded in April 2023. This was mainly due to the annual inflation for Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages that registered 11.6 percent in May 2023 compared to 17.1 percent registered in April 2023. In addition, annual Transport inflation registered minus 5.2 percent in May 2023 compared to minus 0.6 percent in April 2023.
