# **CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES**

### **June 2022**

### 1.1 Annual Headline Inflation

The Inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index for Uganda for the 12 months to June 2022 increased to 6.8 percent, up from 6.3 percent registered in May 2022. This was mainly driven by the increase in prices of commodities under Core Inflation which increased to 5.5 percent in the year ended June 2022, up from 5.1 percent registered in the year ended May 2022.


This increase in Core inflation was attributed to Annual Other Goods Inflation that increased to 9.3 percent in the year ended June 2022, up from 7.8 percent recorded in the year ended May 2022. Specifically, Maize flour inflation increased to 48.3 percent in June 2022 from 39.5 percent in May 2022. However, Annual Services Inflation decreased to 1.1 percent in June 2022 compared to 2.0 percent registered in May 2022. This was mainly due to the Annual Transport inflation that decreased to 1.7 percent in June 2022 from 4.4 percent in May 2022. Specifically, Long distance Bus fares inflation decreased to minus 26.6 percent in June 2022 from minus 9.8 percent in May 2022.

The Energy Fuel and Utilities Inflation (EFU) increased to 14.2 percent, up from 12.0 percent registered in the year ended May 2022. This was mainly due to Annual Liquid Energy Fuels Inflation that increased to 44.7 percent in June 2022, up from 34.9 percent in May 2022. Specifically, Petrol Inflation increased to 45.9 percent in June 2022, up from 35.8 percent registered in May 2022. Also, Kerosene inflation increased to 37.1 percent in June 2022 up from 23.0 percent in May 2022.

Food Crops and Related Items Inflation increased to 14.5 percent in the year ended June 2022, up from 13.6 percent registered in the year ended May 2022. This was due to Annual 'Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses' Inflation that increased to 18.9 percent in June 2022, up from 16.2 percent registered in May 2022. Specifically, Tomatoes Inflation increased to 56.7 percent in June 2022, up from 41.5 percent registered in May 2022 as shown in Table 1 and Figure 1.

#### **Annual Average Inflation**

The Annual Average Headline Inflation for the Financial Year (FY) 2021/22 rose to 3.4 percent, up from 2.5 percent in FY 2020/2021. The increase in the Annual Average Headline Inflation was due to Food Crops and related items Annual Average Inflation that increased to 4.4 percent for FY 2021/22 up from minus 4.3 percent in FY 2020/2021. In addition, Annual Average Inflation for Energy, Fuels and Utilities (EFU) increased to 5.2 percent in 2021/22 up from minus 0.9 percent in 2020/2021. However, Annual Average Core Inflation decreased to 3.2 percent for FY 2021/22, down from 3.5 percent in FY 2020/2021.

## **1.2 Annual Inflation by COICOP Divisions**

According to Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP), the main drivers to the increase in Inflation were prices of commodities under; 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' which increased to 13.0 percent in the year ended June 2022 compared to 11.0 percent registered in the year ended May 2022. 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' which increased to 6.6 percent for the year ended June 2022 compared to 2.3 percent registered for the year ended May 2022. 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' whose inflation increased to 6.1 percent for the year ended June 2022 compared to 4.3 percent registered for the year ended May 2022. 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' increased to 4.9 percent in June 2022 compared to 4.4 percent in May 2022.

However, there were decrease in prices of commodities under; Transport at 1.7 percent in June 2022 down from 4.4 percent in May 2022, 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household' at 16.7 percent in June 2022 compared to 17.3 percent in May 2022, 'Insurance and Financial Services' at 2.5 percent in June 2022 compared to 2.8 in May 2022.

#### 1.3 Annual Goods Inflation

The Goods Inflation for the 12 months to June 2022 increased to 10.6 percent up from 9.0 percent recorded in May 2022. This was mainly due to Annual Inflation for Non-Durable (ND) goods that increased to 13.0 percent for the 12 months to June 2022 up from 10.9 percent recorded in May 2022. In addition, Annual Semi-Durable Goods (SD) Inflation increased to 4.2 percent in June 2022 up from 3.7 percent in May 2022. However, Annual Inflation for Durables (D) goods decreased to 2.3 percent for the 12 months to June 2022 down from 3.0 percent in May 2022. Table 5 below.

#### 1.4 Monthly Inflation

The Monthly Headline Inflation for June 2022 increased by 1.0 percent compared to the 1.5 percent rise recorded in the month of May 2022. This is mainly attributed to the monthly Food and Non- Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that rose by 1.0 percent in June 2022 from the 3.5 percent rise recorded in May 2022.

In addition, the monthly Inflation for Transport increased by 1.9 percent in June 2022 compared to the 3.0 percent rise recorded in May 2022. 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' increased by 3.9 percent compared to 1.0 percent rise recorded in May 2022, 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' increased by 1.0 percent compared to the 0.2 percent drop recorded in May 2022 and 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' increased by 1.1 percent compared to 0.0 percent recorded in May 2022.

However, monthly 'Insurance and Financial Services' decreased by 0.3 percent in June 2022 compared to the 0.1 percent rise recorded in May 2022. Monthly 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household' Inflation declined by 0.1 percent in the month of June 2022 compared to the 1.1 percent rise recorded in May 2022.


### 1.5 Annual Headline Inflation by Income Groups and Geographical areas

Analysis by geographical areas and income groups revealed that Gulu registered the highest Inflation of 10.4 percent for the 12 months to June 2022 up from 8.4 percent recorded in May 2022. This was mainly driven by annual 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation that increased to 22.5 percent in June 2022 up from 17.9 percent registered in May 2022. In addition, annual 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Inflation increased to minus 0.1 percent in June 2022, up from minus 3.0 percent in May 2022.

The second highest Inflation was registered in Arua at 9.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2022 up from 7.1 percent recorded in May 2022. This was mainly driven by annual 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation that increased to 18.0 percent in June 2022, up from 11.1 percent registered in May 2022. In addition, annual 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' Inflation increased to 4.2 percent in June 2022, up from 0.4 percent in May 2022.

The least Annual Inflation was registered in Mbarara at 4.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2022 down from 5.8 percent recorded in May 2022. The low inflation was mainly driven by annual Transport Inflation that decreased to minus 1.5 percent in June 2022 down from 6.0 percent registered in May 2022. In addition, annual 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Inflation decreased to minus 0.7 percent in June 2022, down from 3.9 percent in May 2022.

### **June 2022**

### 1.1 Annual Headline Inflation

The Inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index for Uganda for the 12 months to June 2022 increased to 6.8 percent, up from 6.3 percent registered in May 2022. 

In addition, Annual Average Inflation for Energy, Fuels and Utilities (EFU) increased to 5.2 percent in 2021/22 up from minus 0.9 percent in 2020/2021. #### 1.3 Annual Goods Inflation

This was mainly due to Annual Inflation for Non-Durable (ND) goods that increased to 13.0 percent for the 12 months to June 2022 up from 10.9 percent recorded in May 2022. In addition, Annual Semi-Durable Goods (SD) Inflation increased to 4.2 percent in June 2022 up from 3.7 percent in May 2022. However, Annual Inflation for Durables (D) goods decreased to 2.3 percent for the 12 months to June 2022 down from 3.0 percent in May 2022. Table 5 below.

#### 1.4 Monthly Inflation

The Monthly Headline Inflation for June 2022 increased by 1.0 percent compared to the 1.5 percent rise recorded in the month of May 2022. 
### 1.5 Annual Headline Inflation by Income Groups and Geographical areas



Specifically, Petrol Inflation increased to 45.9 percent in June 2022, up from 35.8 percent registered in May 2022. Also, Kerosene inflation increased to 37.1 percent in June 2022 up from 23.0 percent in May 2022.

Food Crops and Related Items Inflation increased to 14.5 percent in the year ended June 2022, up from 13.6 percent registered in the year ended May 2022. This was due to Annual 'Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses' Inflation that increased to 18.9 percent in June 2022, up from 16.2 percent registered in May 2022. Specifically, Tomatoes Inflation increased to 56.7 percent in June 2022, up from 41.5 percent registered in May 2022 as shown in Table 1 and Figure 1.

#### **Annual Average Inflation**

The Annual Average Headline Inflation for the Financial Year (FY) 2021/22 rose to 3.4 percent, up from 2.5 percent in FY 2020/2021. The increase in the Annual Average Headline Inflation was due to Food Crops and related items Annual Average Inflation that increased to 4.4 percent for FY 2021/22 up from minus 4.3 percent in FY 2020/2021. In addition, Annual Average Inflation for Energy, Fuels and Utilities (EFU) increased to 5.2 percent in 2021/22 up from minus 0.9 percent in 2020/2021. However, Annual Average Core Inflation decreased to 3.2 percent for FY 2021/22, down from 3.5 percent in FY 2020/2021.

## **1.2 Annual Inflation by COICOP Divisions**

According to Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP), the main drivers to the increase in Inflation were prices of commodities under; 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' which increased to 13.0 percent in the year ended June 2022 compared to 11.0 percent registered in the year ended May 2022. 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' which increased to 6.6 percent for the year ended June 2022 compared to 2.3 percent registered for the year ended May 2022. 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' whose inflation increased to 6.1 percent for the year ended June 2022 compared to 4.3 percent registered for the year ended May 2022. 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' increased to 4.9 percent in June 2022 compared to 4.4 percent in May 2022.

However, there were decrease in prices of commodities under; Transport at 1.7 percent in June 2022 down from 4.4 percent in May 2022, 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household' at 16.7 percent in June 2022 compared to 17.3 percent in May 2022, 'Insurance and Financial Services' at 2.5 percent in June 2022 compared to 2.8 in May 2022.

#### 1.3 Annual Goods Inflation

The Goods Inflation for the 12 months to June 2022 increased to 10.6 percent up from 9.0 percent recorded in May 2022. This was mainly due to Annual Inflation for Non-Durable (ND) goods that increased to 13.0 percent for the 12 months to June 2022 up from 10.9 percent recorded in May 2022. In addition, Annual Semi-Durable Goods (SD) Inflation increased to 4.2 percent in June 2022 up from 3.7 percent in May 2022. However, Annual Inflation for Durables (D) goods decreased to 2.3 percent for the 12 months to June 2022 down from 3.0 percent in May 2022. Table 5 below.

#### 1.4 Monthly Inflation

The Monthly Headline Inflation for June 2022 increased by 1.0 percent compared to the 1.5 percent rise recorded in the month of May 2022. This is mainly attributed to the monthly Food and Non- Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that rose by 1.0 percent in June 2022 from the 3.5 percent rise recorded in May 2022.

In addition, the monthly Inflation for Transport increased by 1.9 percent in June 2022 compared to the 3.0 percent rise recorded in May 2022. 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' increased by 3.9 percent compared to 1.0 percent rise recorded in May 2022, 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' increased by 1.0 percent compared to the 0.2 percent drop recorded in May 2022 and 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' increased by 1.1 percent compared to 0.0 percent recorded in May 2022.

However, monthly 'Insurance and Financial Services' decreased by 0.3 percent in June 2022 compared to the 0.1 percent rise recorded in May 2022. Monthly 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household' Inflation declined by 0.1 percent in the month of June 2022 compared to the 1.1 percent rise recorded in May 2022.

### 1.5 Annual Headline Inflation by Income Groups and Geographical areas

Analysis by geographical areas and income groups revealed that Gulu registered the highest Inflation of 10.4 percent for the 12 months to June 2022 up from 8.4 percent recorded in May 2022. This was mainly driven by annual 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation that increased to 22.5 percent in June 2022 up from 17.9 percent registered in May 2022. In addition, annual 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Inflation increased to minus 0.1 percent in June 2022, up from minus 3.0 percent in May 2022.

The second highest Inflation was registered in Arua at 9.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2022 up from 7.1 percent recorded in May 2022. This was mainly driven by annual 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation that increased to 18.0 percent in June 2022, up from 11.1 percent registered in May 2022. In addition, annual 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' Inflation increased to 4.2 percent in June 2022, up from 0.4 percent in May 2022.

The least Annual Inflation was registered in Mbarara at 4.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2022 down from 5.8 percent recorded in May 2022. The low inflation was mainly driven by annual Transport Inflation that decreased to minus 1.5 percent in June 2022 down from 6.0 percent registered in May 2022. In addition, annual 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Inflation decreased to minus 0.7 percent in June 2022, down from 3.9 percent in May 2022.
