

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FOREWORD

This publication provides the monthly Consumer Price Indices for Uganda (Composite) and for the ten centres of Kampala High Income, Kampala Middle Income, Kampala Low Income, Jinja, Mbale, Masaka, Mbarara, Fortportal, Gulu and Arua. All the baskets are for the urban households.

The current Consumer Price Index has been rebased from 2009/2010 to 2016/2017, using weights derived from the Uganda National Household Survey (UNHS VI) that was conducted from July 2016 to June 2017. The rebased CPI is classified using international standards, referred to as Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP 2018) This is a shift from the COICOP 1999 that was used in the earlier series. COICOP 2018 is more detailed than the previous (1999) version, responding to the users' need for more detail, and addresses several other issues that required revision of the classification. The new COICOP of 2018 reflects the significant changes in goods and services in some areas, improved links of COICOP to other classifications, and addresses emerging statistical and policy needs of regional and international users.

At the elementary aggregate (EA) level, the indices are computed using the Jevons (Geometric Mean) method for all items within the elementary aggregates. The modified Laspeyres index formula is used to compute higher level indices. The National CPI is computed as a weighted average of the ten centres mentioned above and rebased indices are available from July 2017 to date at EA level.

ACRONYMS AND DEFINITIONS

COICOP: Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose, is a nomenclature developed by the United Nations Statistics Division to classify and analyse individual consumption expenditures incurred by households, non-profit institutions serving households and general government according to their purpose.

CPI: Consumer Price Index - a general indicator of price levels paid by households for consumer goods and services.

CPI basket: A commonly used term for the goods and services priced for the purpose of compiling the CPI.

Elementary aggregate (EA): The lowest level of commodity classification in the CPI, and the only level for which index numbers are constructed by direct reference to price data.

Inflation: A term commonly used to refer to changes in price levels. A rise in prices is called inflation, and a persistent fall is called deflation.

Jevons price index: An elementary price index defined as the un-weighted geometric average of the sample price relatives. It can also be defined as the un-weighted geometric average of the current to base period price relatives.

Laspeyres price index: The Laspeyres price index is an index formula used in price statistics for measuring the price development of the basket of goods and services consumed in the base period. The question it answers is how much a basket that consumers bought in the base period would cost in the current period.

Outlet: The interface between a supplier of products and the consumer. It may be a shop, a market stall, a catalogue, a website etc. Also referred to as a "retail outlet", although it can include wholesale outlets which also sell directly to the consumers

Outlier: A term used to describe any extreme value in a set of data, such as a price or price relative that requires further investigation or has been verified as incorrect

Price relative: A measure of price movements: the ratio of the price level in one period to the price level in another.

Reference base: The period in which the CPI is given a value of 100.0. The CPI is currently on a reference base of 2016/17.

Weight: The measure of the importance of an item in the index regimen relative to the other items. Weights can be expressed in either quantity or value terms. Value weights are used in the CPI.

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1.0 HIGHLIGHTS OF UGANDA CPI FOR JULY 2022

1.1 Annual Headline Inflation

The Inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index for Uganda for the 12 months to July 2022 increased to 7.9 percent, up from 6.8 percent registered in June 2022. This was mainly driven by the increase in prices of commodities under Core Inflation which increased to 6.3 percent in the year ending July 2022, up from 5.5 percent registered in the year ended June 2022.


This increase in Annual Core inflation was attributed to Annual Other Goods Inflation that increased to 10.2 percent in the year ending July 2022, up from 9.3 percent recorded in the year ended June 2022. Particularly, Cassava flour inflation increased to 62.3 percent in July 2022 from 31.2 percent in June 2022 and Maize flour inflation increased to 56.3 percent in July 2022 from 48.3 percent in June 2022. In addition, Annual Services Inflation increased to 2.0 percent in July 2022 up from 1.1 percent registered in June 2022. This was mainly due to the Annual Transport inflation that increased to 4.6 percent in July 2022 down from 1.7 percent in June 2022. Specifically, Motorcycle fares inflation increased to 18.8 percent in July 2022 up from 3.2 percent in June 2022.

Annual Food Crops and Related Items Inflation increased to 16.4 percent in the year ending July 2022, up from 14.5 percent registered in the year ended June 2022. This was due to Annual 'Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses' Inflation that increased to 23.7 percent in July 2022, up from 18.9 percent registered in June 2022. Specifically, Matoke Inflation increased to 50.7 percent in July 2022, up from 32.5 percent registered in June 2022 and Beans Inflation increased to 18.2 percent in July 2022, up from 7.7 percent registered in June 2022 as shown in Table 1 and Figure 1.

The Annual Energy Fuel and Utilities Inflation (EFU) increased to 17.2 percent in the year ending July 2022, up from 14.2 percent registered in the year ended June 2022. This was mainly due to Annual Liquid Energy Fuels Inflation that increased to 53.0 percent in July 2022, up from 44.7 percent in June 2022. Specifically, Petrol Inflation increased to 56.1 percent in July 2022, up from 45.9 percent registered in June 2022. In addition, Annual National Water charges inflation increased to 5.8 percent in July 2022 up from 0.0 percent in June 2022.

1.2 Annual Inflation by COICOP Divisions

According to the Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP), the main drivers to the increase in Inflation were prices of commodities under; 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' which increased to 14.9 percent in the year ending July 2022 compared to 13.0 percent registered in the year ended June 2022. Transport inflation which increased to 4.6 percent in July 2022 up from 1.7 percent in June 2022. 'Information and Communication' inflation which increased to minus 1.3 percent for the year ending July 2022 compared to minus 2.5 percent registered for the year ended June 2022. 'Recreation, Sport and Culture' whose inflation increased to 5.0 percent for the year ending July 2022 compared to 4.0 percent registered for the year ended June 2022. 'Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods' inflation increased to 5.4 percent for the year ending July 2022 compared to 4.7 percent in June 2022.

However, there were decrease in prices of commodities under; 'Insurance and Financial Services' at 1.2 percent in July 2022 compared to 2.5 in June 2022.

'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' at 5.9 percent in July 2022 compared to 6.1 percent in June 2022,

1.3 Annual Goods Inflation

The Goods Inflation for the 12 months to July 2022 increased to 11.8 percent up from 10.6 percent recorded in June 2022. This was mainly due to Annual Inflation for Non-Durable (ND) goods that increased to 14.5 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 13.0 percent recorded in June 2022. In addition, Annual Semi-Durable Goods (SD) Inflation increased to 4.6 percent in July 2022 up from 4.2 percent in June 2022. Annual Inflation for Durables (D) goods increased to 2.6 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 2.3 percent in June 2022. Table 5 below.

1.4 Monthly Inflation.

The Monthly Headline Inflation for July 2022 increased by 1.0 percent the same rise recorded in the month of June 2022. This is mainly attributed to the monthly Core Inflation that rose by 1.0 percent in July 2022 the same rise recorded in June 2022. This increase in monthly Core inflation was attributed to Annual Other Goods Inflation that increased by 1.2 percent in July 2022 from 1.4 percent rise recorded in June 2022. Specifically, Maize flour inflation increased by 11.1 percent in July 2022 from the 7.2 percent rise recorded in June 2022.

In addition, monthly Services Inflation increased by 0.7 percent in July 2022 from the 0.6 percent rise registered in June 2022. This was mainly due to the monthly Transport inflation that increased by 2.7 percent in July 2022 from the 1.9 percent rise recorded in June 2022. Specifically, Motorcycle fares inflation increased by 15.1 percent in July 2022 from the 2.0 percent drop in June 2022.

The monthly Energy Fuel and Utilities Inflation (EFU) increased by 2.4 percent in July 2022 from the 3.5 percent rise registered in June 2022. This was mainly due to monthly Liquid Energy Fuels Inflation that increased by 6.2 percent in July 2022 from the 7.5 percent rise recorded in June 2022. Specifically, monthly Petrol Inflation increased by 7.6 percent in July 2022 from the 8.1 percent rise registered in June 2022. In addition, monthly National Water charges inflation increased by 5.8 percent in July 2022 from the 0.0 percent recorded in June 2022.

However, Food Crops and Related Items monthly Inflation decreased by 0.5 percent in July 2022, from the 1.4 percent drop registered in June 2022. This was specifically due to, Fresh tomatoes monthly Inflation that declined by 13.8 percent in July 2022 from the 4.0 percent rise recorded in June 2022.

1.5 Monthly Inflation by COICOP Divisions

The Monthly Headline Inflation for July 2022 increased by 1.0 percent the same rise recorded in the month of June 2022. This is mainly attributed to the monthly Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that rose by 1.5 percent in July 2022 from the 1.0 percent rise recorded in June 2022.

In addition, the monthly Inflation for Transport increased by 2.7 percent in July 2022 compared to the 1.9 percent rise recorded in June 2022. 'Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods' increased by 1.1 percent compared to the 0.6 percent rise recorded in June 2022. Health increased by 1.1 percent compared to the 0.0 percent recorded in June 2022 and 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' increased by 0.4 percent compared to 1.1 percent rise recorded in June 2022.

However, monthly 'Information and Communication' decreased by 1.0 percent in July 2022 compared to the 0.3 percent rise recorded in June 2022. Monthly 'Clothing and Footwear' Inflation declined by 0.1 percent in the month of July 2022 compared to the 0.4 percent rise recorded in June 2022.


1.5 Annual Headline Inflation by Income Groups and Geographical areas

Analysis by geographical areas and income groups revealed that Mbale registered the highest Inflation of 11.0 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 9.2 percent recorded in June 2022. This was mainly driven by annual 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation that increased to 21.0 percent in July 2022 up from 16.9 percent registered in June 2022. In addition, annual Health Inflation increased to 11.5 percent in July 2022, up from 6.1 percent in June 2022.

The second highest Inflation was registered in Gulu at 10.8 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 10.4 percent recorded in June 2022. This was mainly driven by annual Transport Inflation that increased to minus 2.2 percent in July 2022 up from minus 4.3 percent registered in June 2022. In addition, annual Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation increased to 23.0 percent in July 2022 up from 22.5 percent registered in June 2022.

The least Annual Inflation was registered in Mbarara at 6.4 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 4.7 percent recorded in June 2022. This was mainly due to the annual Information and Communication Inflation that decreased to minus 5.4 percent in July 2022 down from 0.1 percent registered in June 2022. In addition, annual 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' Inflation decreased to 4.6 percent in July 2022, down from 5.3 percent in June 2022.


The evolution of Annual Inflation according to COICOP is described in the following paragraphs, reference is made to table 6.

01 Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The Inflation for Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages was registered at 14.9 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 13.0 percent recorded in June 2022. The increase was due to Annual Food Inflation that increased to 15.8 percent in July 2022 up from 13.8 percent recorded in June 2022.

In addition, Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation increased to 1.1 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 0.5 percent recorded in June 2022. *Figure 4 shows the trends of Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages Annual Inflation from June 2020 to July 2022.*





02 Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics

The Inflation for Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics registered 6.6 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 the same rate recorded in June 2022. The increase was due to the Annual Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that increased to 7.2 percent in July 2022 up from 7.1 percent recorded in June 2022. However, Annual Tobacco Inflation decreased to 1.1 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 down from 1.7 percent recorded in June 2022.

03 Clothing and Footwear




Figure 5: Clothing and Footwear Annual Inflation Trends; July 2020 – July 2022.

The Inflation for Annual Clothing and Footwear increased to 3.4 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 the same rate recorded in June 2022. This was attributed to Clothing Inflation that registered 3.2 percent in July 2022 the same rate recorded in June 2022. Footwear Inflation decreased to 4.0 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 down from 4.1 percent recorded in June 2022. Figure 5 shows the trends of Clothing and Footwear Inflation from June 2020 to July 2022.

04 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels comprises of Actual Rentals for Housing, Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling, Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Relating to the Dwelling, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels.

The Inflation for Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other Fuels increased to 5.2 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 4.9 percent recorded in June 2022. This was mainly attributed to Annual Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Relating to the Dwelling Inflation that increased to 4.2 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 0.4 percent recorded in June 2022. In addition, Actual Rentals for Housing Inflation increased to 1.8 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 1.0 percent recorded in June 2022.

However, Annual Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling Inflation decreased to 17.9 percent in July 2022 down from 22.9 percent recorded in June 2022. Annual Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation decreased to 5.2 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 down from 5.8 percent recorded in June 2022.

05 Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

This Division Comprises of Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets, Household Textiles, Household Appliances, Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils, Tools and Equipment for House & Garden, and Goods & Services for Routine Household Maintenance.

The Inflation for Furnishings, Household Equipment & Routine Household Maintenance increased to 17.1 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 16.7 percent recorded in June 2022. The increase was mainly due to Goods & Services for Routine Household Maintenance Inflation that increased to 31.9 percent in July 2022 up from 31.2 percent in June 2022. In addition, 'Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets' Inflation increased to 3.4 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 2.8 percent in June 2022. Household Appliances Inflation also increased to 7.1 percent in July 2022 up from 4.9 percent recorded in June 2022. Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils Inflation increased to 3.3 percent for the 12 month to July 2022 up from 3.2 percent recorded in June 2022.

However, Household Textiles Inflation decreased to 2.0 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 down from 2.9 percent recorded in June 2022. Tools and Equipment for House & Garden Inflation decreased to minus 0.1 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 down from 0.9 percent in June 2022.

06 Health

The Health Division comprises of Medicines and Health Products, Outpatient Care Services, Inpatient Care Services and Other Health Services.

The Inflation for Health increased to 2.8 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 2.1 percent recorded in June 2022. This was mainly due to Annual Other Health Services Inflation increased to 7.7 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 2.4 percent recorded in June 2022. Annual Medicines and Health Products Inflation increased to 2.2 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 1.8 percent recorded in June 2022. Inpatient Care Services Inflation that increased to 3.8 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 3.7 percent recorded in June 2022.

However, Outpatient Care Services Inflation also decreased to minus 0.5 percent in July 2022 down from 0.5 percent recorded in June 2022.

07 Transport

Transport division comprises of Purchase of vehicles, Operation of Personal Transport Equipment and Passenger Transport Services. The Inflation for Transport increased to 4.6 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 1.7 percent recorded in June 2022. This was mainly attributed to Annual Operation of Personal Transport Equipment Inflation increased to 24.0 percent in July 2022 up from 20.3 percent recorded in June 2022.

In addition, Annual Passenger Transport Services Inflation that increased to minus 8.3 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from minus 11.3 percent registered in June 2022. Annual Purchase of vehicles Inflation also increased to 1.9 percent in July 2022 up from 1.2 percent recorded in June 2022.

08 Information and Communication

Information and Communication includes Information and Communication Equipment, and Information and Communication Services.

The Annual Inflation for Information and Communication increased to minus 1.3 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from minus 2.5 percent recorded in June 2022. This was due to the Annual Information and Communication Services Inflation that increased to minus 3.4 percent in July 2022 up from minus 5.2 percent recorded in June 2022.

However, Annual Information and Communication Equipment Inflation decreased to 3.5 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 3.9 percent recorded in June 2022.

09 Recreation, Sport and Culture

Recreation, Sport and Culture comprises of Other Recreational Goods, Gardens and Pets, Recreational Services, Cultural Services, Newspapers, Books & Stationery and Package Holidays.

The Annual Inflation for Recreation, Sport and Culture increased to 5.0 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 4.0 percent recorded in June 2022. This was mainly due to Annual Cultural Services Inflation that increased to 6.4 percent in July 2022 up from 4.7 percent recorded in June 2022. In addition, Annual Newspapers, Books & Stationery Inflation that increased to 5.4 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 4.3 percent recorded in June 2022

However, Annual Recreational Services Inflation decreased to 2.5 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 down from 3.7 percent recorded in June 2022. Annual Other Recreational Goods Inflation decreased to 0.3 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 down from the 4.0 percent recorded in June 2022. Annual Gardens and Pets Inflation decreased to 3.7 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 down from 4.2 percent recorded in June 2022.

Annual Package Holidays Inflation registered minus 10.8 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 the same rate recorded in June 2022.

10 Education Services

Education Services comprises of Early Childhood and Primary Education, Secondary Education, Post-secondary non-tertiary education, Tertiary Education and Education not Defined by level.

The Annual Inflation for Education Services registered 8.9 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 the same rate recorded in June 2022. This was due to Early Childhood and Primary Education Inflation registered 15.8 percent in July 2022 the same rate recorded in June 2022. In addition, Annual Secondary Education Inflation registered 6.5 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 the same rate recorded in June 2022. Annual Post-secondary non-tertiary education Inflation registered 1.9 percent in July 2022 the same rate recorded in June 2022. Annual Tertiary Education Inflation also recorded 0.0 percent in July 2022 the same rate recorded in June 2022.

Annual Education not Defined by level registered minus 0.1 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 the same rate recorded in June 2022.

11 Restaurants and Accommodation Services

Restaurants and Accommodation Services comprises of Food and Beverage Serving Services and Accommodation Services.

Annual Inflation for Restaurants and Accommodation Services decreased to 5.9 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 down from 6.1 percent recorded in June 2022. This was mainly due to Annual Food and Beverage Serving Services Inflation that decreased to 7.2 percent in July 2022 down from 7.7 percent recorded in June 2022.

However, Annual Accommodation services Inflation that increased to 2.8 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 2.5 percent recorded in June 2022.

12 Insurance and Financial Services

Insurance and Financial Services comprises of Insurance and Financial Services.

The Annual Insurance and Financial Services Inflation for the 12 months to July 2022 decreased to 1.2 percent down from 2.5 percent recorded in June 2022. This was due to Annual Financial Services Inflation that decreased to 1.1 percent in July 2022 down from 2.6 percent recorded in June 2022.

However, Annual Insurance Services Inflation increased to 2.6 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 1.2 percent in June 2022.

13 Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods

Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods comprises of Personal Care, Personal Effects n.e.c, Social Protection and Other services n.e.c.

The Annual Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods Inflation for the 12 months to July 2022 increased to 5.4 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from 4.7 percent recorded in June 2022. This was mainly due to Annual Personal Effects n.e.c Inflation that increased to 13.1 percent in July 2022 up from 7.9 percent recorded in June 2022. In addition, Annual Other Services n.e.c Inflation increased to minus 2.1 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 up from minus 2.5 percent recorded in June 2022.

However, Annual Personal Care Inflation decreased to 5.0 percent for the 12 months to July 2022 down from 5.5 percent recorded in June 2022. Annual Social Protection Inflation also registered 15.2 percent in July 2022 the same rate recorded in June 2022.

ANNEX 2: MONTHLY INFLATION BY COICOP DIVISIONS

The evolution of Monthly Inflation according to COICOP is described in the following paragraphs, reference is made to table 4.

01 Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The Monthly Inflation for Food and Non-alcoholic Beverages increased by 1.5 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 1.0 percent rise recorded in June 2022 . This was mainly due to the monthly Food Inflation that increased by 1.6 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 1.1percent rise recorded in June 2022. In addition, Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation increased by 0.1 percent for the month of July 2022 up from the 0.2 percent drop recorded in June 2022 .

02 Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics

The Monthly Inflation for Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics increased by 0.1 percent during the month of July 2022 from the 3.9 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022. This was due to Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that increased by 0.2 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 4.1 percent rise recorded in June 2022.

However, Tobacco Inflation decreased by 1.6 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 1.8 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022.

03 Clothing and Footwear

The Monthly Inflation for Clothing and Footwear decreased by 0.1 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded in June 2022 . This was mainly due to Clothing Inflation that decreased by 0.1 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.5 percent rise recorded in June 2022 .

Footwear Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.3 percent rise recorded in June 2022.

04 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels

The Monthly Inflation for Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other fuels increased by 0.3 percent for the month of July 2022 from 1.0 percent rise recorded in June 2022. This was mainly due to Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Inflation that increased by 3.5 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.1 percent increase recorded for the month of June 2022. In addition, Actual Rentals for Housing inflation increased by 0.7 percent for the month of July 2022 from 0.0 percent recorded for the month of June 2022.

However, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation decreased by 1.2 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 2.6 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022. Maintenance, Repair And Security Of The Dwelling Inflation decreased by 0.9 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022

05 Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

The Monthly Inflation for Furnishings, Household Equipment & Routine Household Maintenance increased by 0.6 percent for the month of July 2022 up from the 0.1 percent drop recorded for the month of June 2022. This was mainly due to Goods and Services for Routine Household Maintenance Household Appliances Inflation that increased by 0.9 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.5 percent drop recorded for the month of June 2022. Household Appliances Inflation also increased by 2.9 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.8 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022.

Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets Inflation also increased by 0.2 percent for the month of June 2022 from the 0.3 percent drop recorded for the month of May 2022. Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022.

However, Tools and Equipment for House and Garden Inflation decreased by 1.3 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022. Household Textiles Inflation decreased by 0.4 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.7 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022.

06 Health

The Monthly Inflation for Health increased by 1.1 percent for the month of July 2022 from 0.0 percent recorded for the month of June 2022. This was mainly due to Other Health Services Inflation that increased by 5.2 percent for the month of July 2022 from 0.0 percent recorded for the month of June 2022. Purchase of vehicles Inflation also increased by 0.3 percent for the month of July 2022 the same rate recorded for the month of June 2022 .

08 Information and Communication

The Monthly Inflation for Information and Communication decreased by 1.0 percent for the month of July 2022 from 0.3 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022. This was due to Information and Communication Services Inflation that decreased by 1.4 percent for the month of July 2022 from 0.0 percent recorded for the month of June 2022. Information and Communication Equipment Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.9 rise percent recorded for the month of June 2022.

09 Recreation, Sport and Culture

Monthly Recreation, Sport and Culture Inflation increased by 0.6 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.9 percent rise recorded during the month of June 2022. This was mainly due to Newspapers, Books & Stationery Inflation that increased by 0.9 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 1.6 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022.

In addition, Cultural Services Inflation increased by 0.5 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022. Gardens and Pets Inflation increased by 2.1 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.0 percent recorded for the month of June 2022. Other Recreational Goods Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of July 2022 the same rate recorded for the month of June 2022.

Package Holidays Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of July 2022 the same rate recorded during the month of June 2022 .

10 Education Services

Monthly Inflation for Education Services decreased by 0.0 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.5 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022. This was due to Early Childhood and Primary Education that registered 0.0 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 1.0 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022. In addition, Secondary Education registered 0.0 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded for the month of July 2022.

Post-secondary non-tertiary education Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of July 2022 the same rate recorded for the month of June 2022. Tertiary Education inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of July 2022 the same rate recorded for the month of June 2022. This was due Insurance Inflation that increased by 1.6 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022. Financial Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of July 2022 from the 0.4 percent drop recorded for the month of June 2022.

13 Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods

Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods Inflation for the month of July 2022 increased by 1.1 percent from the 0.6 percent rise recorded for the month of June 2022. This was mainly due to, Personal Effects n.e.c Inflation that increased by 5.3 percent during the month of July 2022 from 0.2 percent drop recorded for the month of June 2022. Other services n.e.c Inflation increased by 0.9 percent for the month of July 2022 from 0.0 recorded for the month of June 2022.

Social Protection Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of July 2022 the same rate recorded for the month of June 2022.
