

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FOREWORD

This publication provides the monthly Consumer Price Indices for Uganda (Composite) and for the ten centres of Kampala High Income, Kampala Middle Income, Kampala Low Income, Jinja, Mbale, Masaka, Mbarara, Fortportal, Gulu and Arua. All the baskets are for the urban households.

The current Consumer Price Index has been rebased from 2009/2010 to 2016/2017, using weights derived from the Uganda National Household Survey (UNHS VI) that was conducted from July 2016 to June 2017. The rebased CPI is classified using international standards, referred to as Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP 2018) This is a shift from the COICOP 1999 that was used in the earlier series. COICOP 2018 is more detailed than the previous (1999) version, responding to the users' need for more detail, and addresses several other issues that required revision of the classification. The new COICOP of 2018 reflects the significant changes in goods and services in some areas, improved links of COICOP to other classifications, and addresses emerging statistical and policy needs of regional and international users.

At the elementary aggregate (EA) level, the indices are computed using the Jevons (Geometric Mean) method for all items within the elementary aggregates. The modified Laspeyres index formula is used to compute higher level indices. The National CPI is computed as a weighted average of the ten centres mentioned above and rebased indices are available from July 2017 to date at EA level.

ACRONYMS AND DEFINITIONS

COICOP: Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose, is a nomenclature developed by the United Nations Statistics Division to classify and analyse individual consumption expenditures incurred by households, non-profit institutions serving households and general government according to their purpose.

CPI: Consumer Price Index - a general indicator of price levels paid by households for consumer goods and services.

CPI basket: A commonly used term for the goods and services priced for the purpose of compiling the CPI.

Elementary aggregate (EA): The lowest level of commodity classification in the CPI, and the only level for which index numbers are constructed by direct reference to price data.

Inflation: A term commonly used to refer to changes in price levels. A rise in prices is called inflation, and a persistent fall is called deflation.

Jevons price index: An elementary price index defined as the un-weighted geometric average of the sample price relatives. It can also be defined as the un-weighted geometric average of the current to base period price relatives.

Laspeyres price index: The Laspeyres price index is an index formula used in price statistics for measuring the price development of the basket of goods and services consumed in the base period. The question it answers is how much a basket that consumers bought in the base period would cost in the current period.

Outlet: The interface between a supplier of products and the consumer. It may be a shop, a market stall, a catalogue, a website etc. Also referred to as a "retail outlet", although it can include wholesale outlets which also sell directly to the consumers

Outlier: A term used to describe any extreme value in a set of data, such as a price or price relative that requires further investigation or has been verified as incorrect

Price relative: A measure of price movements: the ratio of the price level in one period to the price level in another.

Reference base: The period in which the CPI is given a value of 100.0. The CPI is currently on a reference base of 2016/17.

Weight: The measure of the importance of an item in the index regimen relative to the other items. Weights can be expressed in either quantity or value terms. Value weights are used in the CPI.

1.0 HIGHLIGHTS OF UGANDA CPI FOR JUNE 2023

1.1 Annual Headline Inflation

The Annual average inflation for the Financial Year 2022/2023 is registered at 8.8 percent compared to 3.4 percent registered in Financial Year 2021/2022

The Annual Inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index for Uganda for the 12 months to June 2023 is registered at 4.9 percent compared to the 6.2 percent registered in the year ended May 2023.

The slowdown in the Annual Inflation is largely attributed to the Annual Core inflation, which slowed down to 4.8 percent in the year ending June 2023 compared to 5.6 percent registered in the year ended May 2023. The main driver to Annual Core Inflation was the Annual Other Goods Inflation that registered 6.0 percent in the year ending June 2023 compared to 7.4 percent in the year ended May 2023. The main drivers were Local Gin inflation that registered 0.4 percent in June 2023 compared to 10.4 percent registered in May 2023, Maize Flour inflation that registered 20.9 percent in June 2023 compared to 28.0 percent registered in May 2023, Rice inflation registered 31.7 percent in June 2023 compared to 35.3 percent registered in May 2023, and Cassava flour inflation registered 34.6 percent in June 2023 compared to 50.5 percent registered in May 2023. In addition, Annual Services inflation declined to 3.3 percent in the year ending June 2023 compared to 3.4 percent registered in the year ended May 2023. This is attributed to Annual Transport inflation that decelerated to negative 2.6 percent in the year ending June 2023 compared to negative 0.3 percent registered in May 2023.

The other driver to the slowdown in the Annual Inflation was the Annual Food Crops and Related Items Inflation that registered 12.3 percent in the year ending June 2023 compared to 15.7 percent registered in the year ended May 2023. This is attributed to Beans inflation that registered 28.4 percent in June 2023 compared to 40.1 percent in May 2023. Cooking Bananas inflation that registered 34.0 percent in June 2023 compared to 46.3 percent registered in May 2023, Sweet potatoes inflation that registered negative 1.0 percent in June 2023 compared to 15.9 percent registered in May 2023 and Tomatoes Inflation that registered negative 32.6 percent in June 2023 compared to negative 26.2 percent registered in May 2023.




Figure 1: Annual Headline, Core, Food crops and EFU Inflation: June 2021 – June 2023.

In addition, the Annual Energy Fuel and Utilities (EFU) inflation slowed down to negative 3.1 percent in the year ending June 2023 compared to 0.9 percent registered in the year ended May 2023. This was mainly due to Liquid Energy Fuels inflation that registered negative 11.9 percent in June 2023 compared to negative 4.4 percent in May 2023. In particular, Petrol inflation registered negative 14.7 percent in June 2023 compared to negative 7.0 percent in May 2023. Diesel inflation slowed down to negative 16.5 percent in June 2023 compared to negative 9.0 percent in May 2023 as shown in Table 1 and Figure 1.

1.2 Annual Inflation by COICOP Divisions

According to the Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP), the main drivers to the registered inflation were commodities under; 'Food and Non- alcoholic beverages' whose inflation registered 11.0 percent in the year ending June 2023 compared to 13.5 percent registered in the year ended May 2023, Transport whose inflation registered minus 2.6 percent in the year ending June 2023 compared to minus 0.3 percent registered in the year ended May 2023, Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels whose inflation registered 0.8 percent in the year ending June 2023 compared to 2.2 percent registered in the year ended May 2023, Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics whose inflation registered 3.8 percent in the year ending June 2023 compared to 7.3 percent registered in the year ended May 2023, 'Recreation, Sport and Culture' whose inflation registered 0.4 percent in the year ending June 2023 compared to 1.3 percent registered in the year ended May 2023, 'Clothing and Footwear' whose inflation registered 3.1 percent in the year ended May 2023, and 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household', whose inflation registered 1.9 percent in the year ending June 2023 compared to 2.1 percent registered in the year ended May 2023.

However, there was an increase in price of commodities under; 'Insurance and Financial Services' whose inflation was registered at 4.3 percent for the year ending June 2023 compared to 4.0 percent for the year ended May 2023, 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' whose inflation was registered at 5.7 percent for the year ending June 2023 compared to 5.4 percent for the year ended May 2023. 'Health' whose inflation was registered at 2.9 percent for the year ending June 2023 compared to 2.8 percent for the year ended May 2023 and 'Education Services' whose inflation registered 7.5 percent for the year ending June 2023 compared to 7.3 percent for the year ended May 2023 as shown in Table 3 below.

1.3 Monthly Inflation.

The Monthly Headline Inflation for June 2023 decreased by 0.3 percent the same rate recorded in the month of May 2023 as shown in Table 5 below.

The main driver was the monthly Food Crops and Related items inflation that decreased by 4.2 percent in June 2023 from the 2.3 percent drop recorded in May 2023. This was mainly due to monthly Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses inflation that decreased by 4.0 percent in June 2023 from the 1.9 percent drop recorded in May 2023. Specifically, Cooking Bananas (Matooke) inflation decreased by 20.0 percent in June 2023 from the 8.3 percent drop recorded in May 2023, Beans inflation decreased by 3.7 percent in June 2023 from the 3.1 percent rise recorded in May 2023 and Irish Potatoes inflation decreased by 6.7 percent in June 2023 from the 0.6 percent drop recorded in May 2023. In addition, monthly Fruits and nuts inflation decreased by 2.7 percent in June 2023 from the 2.3 percent drop recorded in May 2023. The decrease in monthly Fruits and nuts inflation was mainly due to the monthly Mangoes inflation that decreased by 21.0 percent in June 2023 from the 2.1 percent rise recorded in May 2023, Watermelon inflation that decreased by 21.2 percent in June 2023 from the 6.8 percent drop recorded in May 2023 and Avocado inflation that decreased by 6.0 percent in June 2023 from the 7.2 percent drop recorded in May 2023.

Monthly Energy Fuel and Utilities (EFU) inflation decreased by 0.6 percent in June 2023 compared to 0.4 percent drop registered in May 2023. The drop in EFU was mainly due to Firewood inflation that decreased by 5.8 percent in June 2023 compared to the 3.4 percent drop recorded in May 2023. Monthly Liquid energy fuels inflation decreased by 0.9 percent in June 2023 from the 0.8 percent drop registered in May 2023. However, Charcoal inflation increased by 1.3 percent in June 2023 the same rate registered in May 2023.

However, Monthly Core inflation increased by 0.2 percent in June 2023 from 0.0 percent recorded in May 2023. This was mainly due to monthly Services inflation that increased by 0.4 percent in June 2023 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded in May 2023. In addition, Other goods inflation increased by 0.1 percent in June 2023 from the 0.0 percent recorded in March 2023.

1.4 Monthly Inflation by COICOP Divisions

The monthly headline inflation for June 2023 decreased by 0.3 percent the same rate recorded in the month of May 2023. This was mainly attributed to the Monthly Food and Non- Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that decreased by 1.3 percent in June 2023 from the 0.8 percent drop recorded in May 2023. In addition, Monthly Transport inflation decreased by 0.5 percent in the month of June 2023 from the 1.1 percent drop recorded in May 2023. Monthly Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels inflation decreased by 0.4 percent in June 2023 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded in May 2023.

However, Monthly Restaurants and Accommodation Services inflation increased by 1.4 percent in June 2023 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in May 2023. Monthly Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods inflation increased by 0.6 percent in June 2023 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded in May 2023. Monthly Education Services inflation increased by 0.6 percent in June 2023 from 0.0 percent registered in May 2023 as indicated in Table 7 below.


1.5 Annual Headline Inflation by Income Groups and Geographical areas

Analysis by geographical areas and income groups revealed that Arua registered the highest inflation of 7.3 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 11.6 percent recorded in May 2023. This was mainly driven by annual 'Insurance and Financial Services' inflation that increased to 3.8 percent in June 2023 compared to 3.5 percent registered in May 2023. In addition, Annual 'Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods' inflation registered 13.8 percent the same rate recorded in May 2023.

The second highest inflation was registered in Fort portal at 6.3 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 7.2 percent recorded in May 2023. This was mainly driven by annual 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' inflation that registered 8.5 percent in June 2023 compared to 7.1 percent registered in May 2023. In addition, Annual 'Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods' inflation registered 4.2 percent in June 2023 compared to 2.0 percent in May 2023.

The least annual inflation was registered in Jinja at 3.4 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 6.6 percent recorded in May 2023. This was mainly due to the annual inflation for 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' that registered 3.3 percent in June 2023 compared to 9.7 percent registered in May 2023. In addition, annual 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' inflation registered 0.7 percent in June 2023 compared to 6.9 percent in May 2023.

ANNEX 1: ANNUAL INFLATION BY COICOP DIVISIONS

The evolution of Annual Inflation according to COICOP is described in the following paragraphs, reference is made to table 6.

01 Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The Inflation for Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages registered 11.0 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 13.5 percent registered in May 2023. This was mainly due to Annual Food Inflation that registered 11.5 percent in June 2023 compared to 14.2 percent recorded in May 2023.

However, Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation registered 1.2 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 the same rate recorded in May 2023. *Figure 4 shows the trends of Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages Annual Inflation from June 2021 to June 2023.*

02 Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics

The Inflation for Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics was registered at 3.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 7.3 percent registered in May 2023. This was attributed to the Annual Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that registered 4.1 percent in June 2023 compared to 7.9 percent registered in May 2023. However, Annual Tobacco Inflation registered 1.2 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 1.8 percent recorded in May 2023.

03 Clothing and Footwear

The Inflation for Annual Clothing and Footwear registered 3.1 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 3.6 percent recorded in May 2023. This was mainly attributed to Footwear Inflation that registered 1.0 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 1.3 percent recorded in May 2023.

Clothing Inflation registered 3.8 percent in June 2023 compared to 4.3 percent recorded in May 2023. *Figure 5 shows the trends of Clothing and Footwear Inflation from June 2021 to June 2023.*

04 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels comprises of Actual Rentals for Housing, Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling, Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Relating to the Dwelling, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels.

The Inflation for Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other Fuels was registered at 0.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 the from the 2.2 percent recorded in May 2023. This was mainly attributed to Actual Rentals for Housing Inflation registered 1.3 percent for the 12 months to June the same rate recorded in May 2023.

Annual Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Relating to the Dwelling Inflation registered 5.9 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 the same rate recorded in May 2023.

However, Annual Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation that registered minus 0.3 percent in June 2023 compared to 2.9 percent recorded in May 2023.

Annual Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling inflation registered minus 4.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to minus 2.5 percent recorded in May 2023.

05 Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

This Division Comprises of Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets, Household Textiles, Household Appliances, Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils, Tools and Equipment for House & Garden, and Goods & Services for Routine Household Maintenance.

The Inflation for Furnishings, Household Equipment & Routine Household Maintenance registered 1.9 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 2.1 percent recorded in May 2023. This was mainly due to Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets Inflation registered 2.3 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 1.9 percent recorded in May 2023. Household Textiles Inflation registered 3.0 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 3.3 percent recorded in May 2023. Goods & Services for Routine Household Maintenance Inflation that registered 1.3 percent in June 2023 compared to 1.5 percent in May 2023. Household Appliances Inflation registered 7.6 percent in June 2023 compared to 8.8 percent recorded in May 2023. In addition, Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils Inflation registered 1.5 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 2.0 percent recorded in May 2023.

However, Tools and Equipment for House & Garden Inflation registered minus 1.4 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to minus 0.9 percent in May 2023.

06 Health

The Health Division comprises of Medicines and Health Products, Outpatient Care Services, Inpatient Care Services and Other Health Services.

The Inflation for Health registered 2.9 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 2.8 registered in May 2023. This was mainly due to Annual Inpatient Care Services Inflation registered 2.1 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 1.7 percent recorded in May 2023. Annual Outpatient Care Services Inflation registered 4.5 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 4.1 percent recorded in May 2023.

However, Annual Medicines and Health Products Inflation registered 3.1 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 the same rate recorded in May 2023. Annual Other Health Services Inflation registered 1.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 the same rate recorded in May 2023.

07 Transport

Transport division comprises of Purchase of vehicles, Operation of Personal Transport Equipment and Passenger Transport Services.

The Inflation for Transport registered minus 2.6 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to minus 0.3 percent recorded in May 2023. This was mainly attributed to Annual Operation of Personal Transport Equipment inflation registered minus 2.4 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 1.2 percent registered in May 2023. Annual Passenger Transport Services Inflation that registered minus 3.9 percent in June 2023 compared to minus 2.1 percent recorded in May 2023.

However, Annual Purchase of vehicles Inflation registered 0.7 percent in June 2023 compared to 1.3 percent recorded in May 2023.

08 Information and Communication

Information and Communication includes Information and Communication Equipment, and Information and Communication Services.

The Annual Inflation for Information and Communication increased to 2.5 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 the same rate recorded in May 2023. This was mainly due to the Information and Communication Services Inflation registered at 2.9 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 2.4 percent in May 2023. In addition, Annual Information and Communication Equipment Inflation that registered 1.6 percent in June 2023 compared to 2.8 percent recorded in May 2023.

09 Recreation, Sport and Culture

Recreation, Sport and Culture comprises of Other Recreational Goods, Gardens and Pets, Recreational Services, Cultural Services, Newspapers, Books & Stationery and Package Holidays.

The Annual Inflation for Recreation, Sport and Culture registered 0.4 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 1.3 percent recorded in May 2023. This was mainly due to Annual Newspapers, Books & Stationery Inflation that registered 2.7 percent in June 2023 compared to 4.2 percent recorded in May 2023. Annual Recreational Services Inflation registered 1.0 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 3.3 percent recorded in May 2023. Annual cultural services Inflation that registered minus 1.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to minus 1.4 percent recorded in May 2023.

However, Annual Other Recreational Goods Inflation registered 2.1 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 1.8 percent recorded in May 2023.

10 Education Services

Education Services comprises of Early Childhood and Primary Education, Secondary Education, Post-secondary non-tertiary education, Tertiary Education and Education Not Defined by level.

The Annual Inflation for Education Services registered 7.5 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 the same rate recorded in May 2023. This was mainly due to Annual 'Secondary Education' Inflation that registered 8.9 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 8.5 percent recorded in May 2023. Annual 'Early Childhood and Primary Education' inflation that registered 7.6 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 7.5 percent recorded in May 2023. Annual Education Not Defined by level registered 0.1 percent in June 2023 compared to 0.0 percent recorded in May 2023.

In addition, Annual Tertiary Education Inflation registered 0.0 percent in June 2023 the same rate recorded in May 2023.

However, Annual Post-Secondary Non-Tertiary Education registered 16.6 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 16.5 percent recorded in May 2023.

11 Restaurants and Accommodation Services

Restaurants and Accommodation Services comprises of Food and Beverage Serving Services and Accommodation Services.

Annual Inflation for Restaurants and Accommodation Services registered 5.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 5.4 percent recorded in May 2023. This was mainly due to Annual Accommodation Services Inflation that registered 9.0 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 5.9 percent recorded in May 2023.

However, Annual Food and Beverage Serving Services Inflation registered 4.4 percent in June 2023 compared to 5.2 percent recorded in May 2023.

12 Insurance and Financial Services

Insurance and Financial Services comprises of Insurance and Financial Services.

The Annual Insurance and Financial Services Inflation for the 12 months to June 2023 registered 4.3 percent in June 2023 compared to 4.0 percent recorded in May 2023. This was due to Annual Financial Services Inflation that registered 4.5 percent in June 2023 compared to 4.2 percent recorded in May 2023.

However, Annual Insurance Services Inflation registered 1.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 2.0 percent recorded in May 2023.

13 Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods

Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods comprises of Personal Care, Personal Effects n.e.c, Social Protection and Other services n.e.c.

The Annual Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods Inflation for the 12 months to June 2023 registered 9.4 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 the same rate recorded in May 2023. This was mainly due to Annual Social Protection Inflation registered 5.2 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 0.0 percent recorded in May 2023. Annual Personal Effects NEC Inflation registered 14.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 14.5 percent recorded in May 2023.

In addition, Annual Other Services n.e.c Inflation recorded 2.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 the same rate recorded in May 2023.

However, Annual Personal Care Inflation registered 9.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2023 compared to 9.8 percent recorded in May 2023.

ANNEX 2: MONTHLY INFLATION BY COICOP DIVISIONS

The evolution of Monthly Inflation according to COICOP is described in the following paragraphs, reference is made to table 4.

01 Foodand Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The Monthly Inflation for Food and Non-alcoholic Beverages decreased by 1.3 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to 0.8 percent drop registered in May 2023. This was mainly due to the monthly Food Inflation that decreased by 1.3 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to 0.9 percent drop recorded in May 2023.

In addition, Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation decreased by 0.1 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to 0.6 percent rise recorded in May 2023.

02 Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics

The Monthly Inflation for Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics increased by 0.5 percent during the month of June 2023 from the 0.3 percent drop registered for the month of May 2023. This was due to Alcoholic beverages Inflation that increased by 0.4 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.4 percent drop recorded in May 2023.

In addition, Tobacco Inflation increased by 1.3 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to the 0.4 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2023.

03 Clothing and Footwear

The Monthly Inflation for Clothing and Footwear registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in May 2023. This was mainly due to Clothing Inflation decreased by 0.1 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in May 2023.

In addition, Footwear Inflation recorded 0.0 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded in May 2023.

04 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels

The Monthly Inflation for Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other fuels decreased by 0.4 percent for the month of June 2023 from 0.1 percent recorded in May 2023. This was mainly due to Maintenance, Repair And Security Of The Dwelling Inflation decreased by 1.9 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to 0.3 percent drop recorded for May 2023. In addition, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation decreased by 0.6 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.2 percent drop recorded in May 2023.

However, Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Inflation increased by 0.1 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded in May 2023. Actual Rentals for Housing inflation registered 0.1 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2023.

05 Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

The Monthly Inflation for Furnishings, Household Equipment & Routine Household Maintenance decreased by 0.4 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.4 percent drop recorded for the month of May 2023.

This was mainly due to Goods and Services for Routine Household Maintenance that decreased by 0.7 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to the 0.7 percent rise recorded for May 2023. In addition, tools and Equipment for House and Garden Inflation decreased by 0.3 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to the 0.4 percent rise registered in 2023. Household Appliances Inflation decreased by 0.3 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.3 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2023. Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils Inflation decreased by 0.1 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded in May 2023.

However, Household Textiles increased by 0.4 percent for the Month of June 2023 compared to 0.2 percent drop registered for May 2023. Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets Inflation increased by 0.1 percent during the month of June 2023 the same rate recorded for the month of May 2023.

06 Health

The Monthly Inflation for Health increased by 0.1 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to the 1.2 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2023. This was mainly due to Outpatient Care Services Inflation increased by 0.4 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to 0.0 percentrecorded for the month of May 2023. In addition, inpatient care services inflation registered 0.1 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to 2.0 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2023. Medicines And Health Products Inflation recorded 0.1 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to 0.8 percent rise registered for the month of May 2023. Other Health Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2023 the same rate recorded in May 2023.

07 Transport

Transport Inflation decreased by 0.5 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to the 1.1 percent drop recorded for the month of May 2023. This was mainly due to, Passenger Transport Services inflation that decreased by 0.6 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 2.1 percent drop recorded in May 2023. In Operation of personal transport equipment decreased by 0.5 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.1 percent drop registered during the month of May 2023. Purchase of vehicles Inflation decreased by 0.2 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to 1.1 percent drop recorded for the month of May 2023.

08 Information and Communication

The monthly inflation for information and communication increased by 0.3 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to 0.1 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2023. This was mainly due to information and communication services inflation that increased by 0.5 percent rise during the month of June 2023 compared to the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2023.

However, information and communication equipment inflation decreased by 0.2 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to 0.2 percent rise recorded in May 2023.

09 Recreation, Sport and Culture

Monthly recreation, sport and culture inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of May 2023 the same rate recorded in May 2023. This was mainly attributed to Cultural Services Inflation that decreased by 0.2 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2023.

However, Other recreational goods inflation increased by 0.3 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.0 percent registered during the month of May 2023.

Recreational services Inflation recorded 0.3 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2023.

Newspapers, books & stationery' inflation increased by 0.1 percent for the month of June 2023 the same rate recorded for the month of May 2023.

Gardens and Pets Inflation that recorded 0.0 percent for the month of June 2023 the same rate registered during the month of May 2023.

Package Holidays Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2023 the same rate recorded during the month of May 2023.

10 Education Services

Monthly Inflation for Education Services increased by 0.6 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.0 percent recorded for the month of May 2023. This was mainly due to Secondary Education Inflation that increased by 0.5 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2023.

In addition, Early Childhood and Primary Education Inflation increased by 1.1 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2023.

Education not Defined by level inflation increased 0.1 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded in May 2023.

Post-secondary and non-tertiary education Inflation recorded 0.0 percent for the month of June 2023 the same rate recorded for the month of May 2023.

Tertiary education Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2023 the same rate recorded for the month of May 2023.

11 Restaurants and Accommodation Services

The Monthly Inflation for restaurants and accommodation services increased by 1.4 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to the 0.2 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2023.

This was mainly due to accommodation services inflation that that increased by 3.1 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to the 0.0 percent recorded for the month of May 2023.

Food and beverage serving services inflation increased by 0.7 percent for the month of June 2023 compared to the 0.3 percent rise registered in May 2023.

12 Insurance and Financial Services

Insurance and Financial Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2023 the same rate recorded during the month of May 2023. This was due to Financial Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2023 the same rate recorded May 2023. Insurance Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2023 the same rate recorded for the month of May 2023.

13 Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods

Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods Inflation increased by 0.6 percent during the month of June 2023 compared to the 0.4 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2023. This was mainly due to Social Protection Inflation registered 5.2 percent for the month of June 2023 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2023.

In addition, Personal care Inflation increased by 0.8 percent during the month of June 2023 compared to 0.3 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2023.

Other services n.e.c Inflation increased by 0.1 percent in June 2023 from the 1.4 pecent rise recorded for the month of May 2023.

However, Personal Effects n.e.c Inflation recorded 0.0 percent during the month of June 2023 compared to the 0.3 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2023.
