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FOREWORD

This publication provides the monthly Consumer Price Indices for Uganda (Composite) and for the ten centres of Kampala High Income, Kampala Middle Income, Kampala Low Income, Jinja, Mbale, Masaka, Mbarara, Fortportal, Gulu and Arua. All the baskets are for the urban households.

The current Consumer Price Index has been rebased from 2009/2010 to 2016/2017, using weights derived from the Uganda National Household Survey (UNHS VI) that was conducted from July 2016 to June 2017. The rebased CPI is classified using international standards, referred to as Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP 2018). This is a shift from the COICOP 1999 that was used in the earlier series. COICOP 2018 is more detailed than the previous (1999) version, responding to the users' need for more detail, and addresses several other issues that required revision of the classification. The new COICOP of 2018 reflects the significant changes in goods and services in some areas, improved links of COICOP to other classifications, and addresses emerging statistical and policy needs of regional and international users.

At the elementary aggregate (EA) level, the indices are computed using the Jevons (Geometric Mean) method for all items within the elementary aggregates. The modified Laspeyres index formula is used to compute higher level indices. The National CPI is computed as a weighted average of the ten centres mentioned above and rebased indices are available from July 2017 to date at EA level.

ACRONYMS AND DEFINITIONS

COICOP: Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose, is a nomenclature developed by the United Nations Statistics Division to classify and analyse individual consumption expenditures incurred by households, non-profit institutions serving households and general government according to their purpose.

CPI: Consumer Price Index - a general indicator of price levels paid by households for consumer goods and services.

CPI basket: A commonly used term for the goods and services priced for the purpose of compiling the CPI.

Elementary aggregate (EA): The lowest level of commodity classification in the CPI, and the only level for which index numbers are constructed by direct reference to price data.

Inflation: A term commonly used to refer to changes in price levels. A rise in prices is called inflation, and a persistent fall is called deflation.

Jevons price index: An elementary price index defined as the un-weighted geometric average of the sample price relatives. It can also be defined as the un-weighted geometric average of the current to base period price relatives.

Laspeyres price index: The Laspeyres price index is an index formula used in price statistics for measuring the price development of the basket of goods and services consumed in the base period. The question it answers is how much a basket that consumers bought in the base period would cost in the current period.

Outlet: The interface between a supplier of products and the consumer. It may be a shop, a market stall, a catalogue, a website etc. Also referred to as a "retail outlet", although it can include wholesale outlets which also sell directly to the consumers

Outlier: A term used to describe any extreme value in a set of data, such as a price or price relative that requires further investigation or has been verified as incorrect

Price relative: A measure of price movements: the ratio of the price level in one period to the price level in another.

Reference base: The period in which the CPI is given a value of 100.0. The CPI is currently on a reference base of 2016/17.

Weight: The measure of the importance of an item in the index regimen relative to the other items. Weights can be expressed in either quantity or value terms. Value weights are used in the CPI.

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1.0 HIGHLIGHTS OF UGANDA CPI FOR SEPTEMBER 2021

1.1 Annual Headline Inflation

The Consumer Price Index for Uganda for the 12 months to September 2021 increased to 2.2 The inflation rate as measured by the Consumer Price Index for Uganda for the 12 months to September 2021 increased to 2.2 percent, up from 1.9 percent in August 2021. This was mainly driven by the rise in the prices of the commodities under; 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' (2.9 percent), 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household' (3.0 percent) and 'Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods' (2.9 percent) between September 2020 and September 2021, as shown in Tables 1 and 2.

However, there were some decreases in the prices of the commodities under; 'Transport', (4.8 percent), 'Clothing and Footwear' (1.0 percent), and, 'Recreation, Sport and Culture' (minus 0.4 percent) between September 2020 and September 2021.

1.2 Monthly Inflation

The Monthly Headline Inflation for September 2021 increased by 0.6 percent compared to the 0.0 percent recorded for August 2021. This is mainly attributed to the monthly Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages which rose by 1.2 percent in the month of September 2021 compared to the 1.1 percent rise recorded in the month of August 2021. In addition, the monthly Inflation for Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods' increased by 1.1 percent in September 2021 compared to the 0.0 percent recorded in August 2021. The monthly inflation for 'Information and Communication' increased by 1.0 percent in September 2021 compared to the 0.0 percent recorded in the month of August 2021. 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' monthly Inflation increased by 0.4 percent in September 2021 compared to the 0.2 percent drop recorded in August 2021. 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household' Inflation increased by 0.8 percent in September 2021 compared to the 0.7 percent rise recorded in August 2021, see Table 2 below.

Relative to August 2021, the prices of cooking Bananas (Matooke) increased by 34.9 percent in the month of September 2021, Water melon increased by 30.0 percent, Sorghum grain increased by 23.4 percent, Mangoes increased by 20.7 percent, Onions increase by 17.1 percent, and Beans increased by 5.0 percent, see Table 3 below.

1.3 Annual Core and Non-Core Inflation

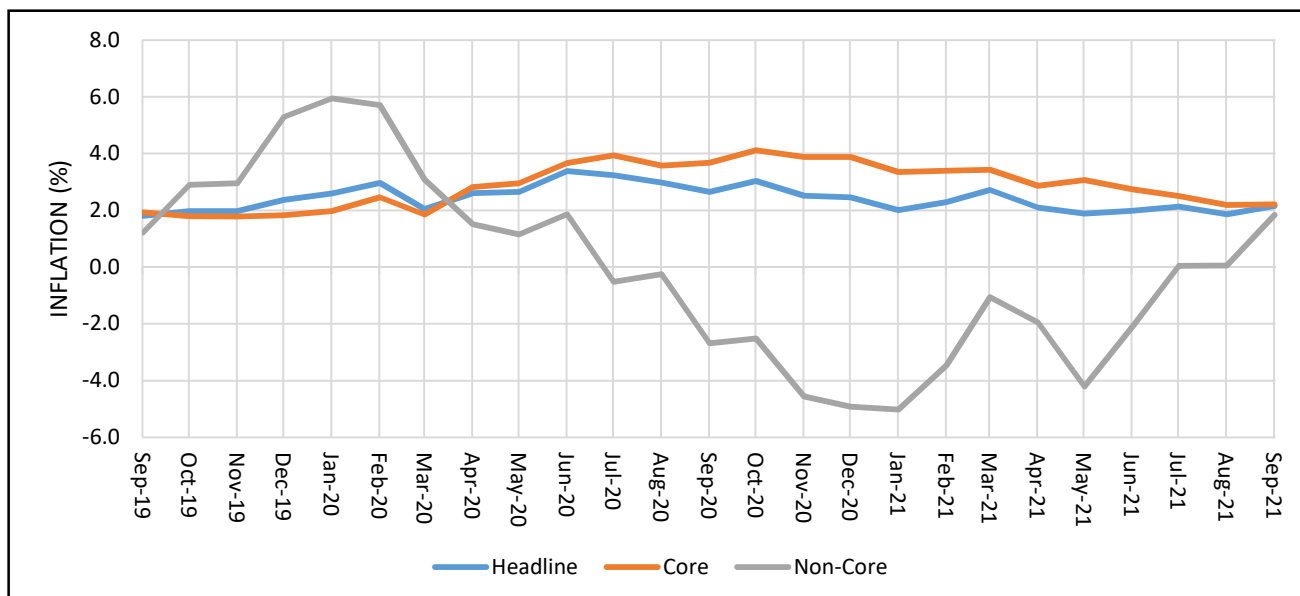
The Core Inflation for the 12 months to September 2021 was registered at 2.2 percent the same rate registered for August 2021. This is attributed to Annual 'Other Goods' Inflation that increased to 2.5 percent in September 2021 up from 1.9 percent in August 2021. However, this was offset by a decrease in Annual Services Inflation that decreased to 1.8 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from 2.5 percent in August 2021, Table 4.

The Non-Core inflation for the 12 months to September 2021 increased to 1.8 percent up from 0.1 percent in August 2021. The increase in Annual Non-Core Inflation is mainly attributed to annual 'Food Crops and Related Items' Inflation which increased to 3.2 percent in September 2021 up from 0.5 percent in August 2021. This was due to Annual 'Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses' Inflation that increased to 3.0 percent in September 2021 up from 0.4 percent in August 2021. In addition, Annual Energy Fuel and Utilities Inflation (EFU) increased to 0.2 percent, up from minus 0.5 percent in August 2021. The rise in EFU Inflation was due to Annual Liquid Energy Fuels Inflation that increased to 4.8 percent in September 2021 up from 2.2 percent in August 2021. Specifically, Annual Petrol increased to 9.6 percent in September 2021 up from 7.4 percent in August 2021, Table 1 and Figure 2.

1.4 Annual Goods and Services Inflation

The Goods inflation for the 12 months to September 2021 increased to 2.4 percent up from 1.4 percent in August 2021. The rise in Annual Goods Inflation was attributed to Annual Non-Durable (ND) Goods Inflation that increased to 2.3 percent in September 2021 up from 1.1 percent in August 2021. In addition, Annual Inflation for Durables (D) increased to 4.5 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 4.2 percent in August 2021. However, Annual Inflation for Semi-Durable Goods (SD) decreased to 1.8 percent for the 12 month to September 2021 down from 1.9 percent in August 2021, Table 5 below.

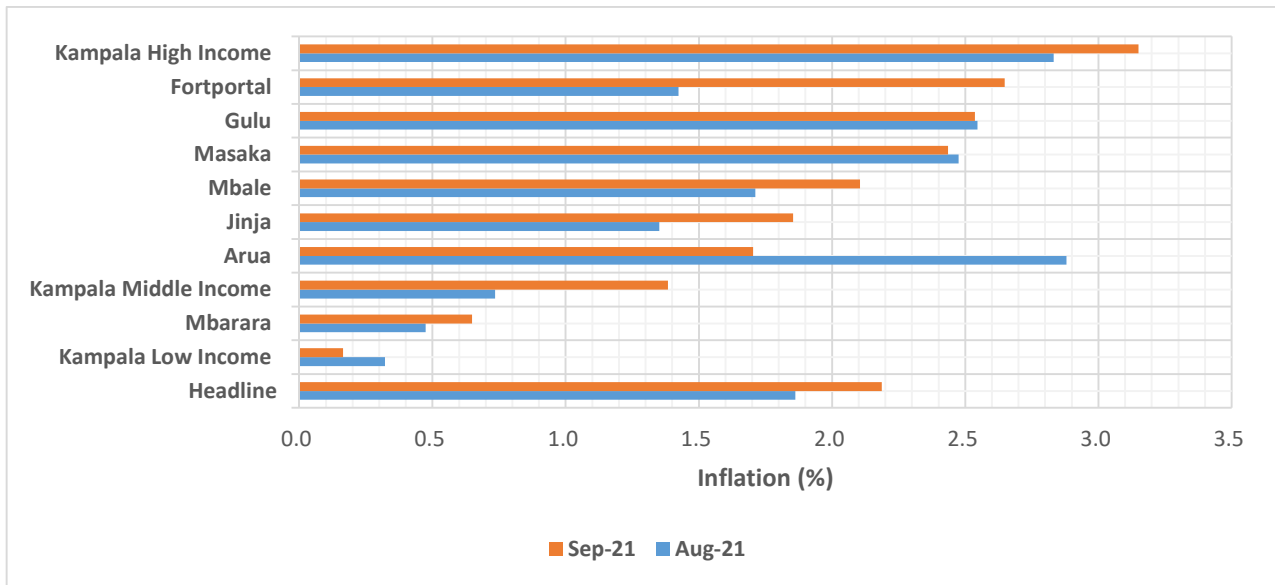
1.5 Annual Headline Inflation by Income Groups and Geographical areas

Analysis by geographical areas and income groups reveal that Kampala High Income registered the highest Inflation of 3.1 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 2.8 percent in August 2021. This was driven by annual 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation that increased to 2.5 percent in September 2021 up from 0.5 percent registered in August 2021. In addition Annual 'Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods' Inflation increased to 1.7 percent in September 2021 up from 0.0 percent in August 2021.

The second highest Inflation was registered in the basket of Fort portal at 2.6 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 1.4 percent in August 2021. The main driver was the Annual 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation that increased to 5.7 percent in September 2021, up from 3.9 percent in August 2021. In addition, Annual 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Inflation increased to minus 3.3 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from minus 6.9 percent in August 2021.

The least Annual Inflation was registered in Kampala Low Income at 0.2 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from 0.3 percent in August 2021. The low inflation in the Centre was mainly due to Transport Inflation that declined to minus 8.1 Percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from minus 3.3 percent in August 2021. In addition, Annual 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Inflation declined to minus 2.6 percent in September 2021 down from minus 2.0 percent in August 2021.

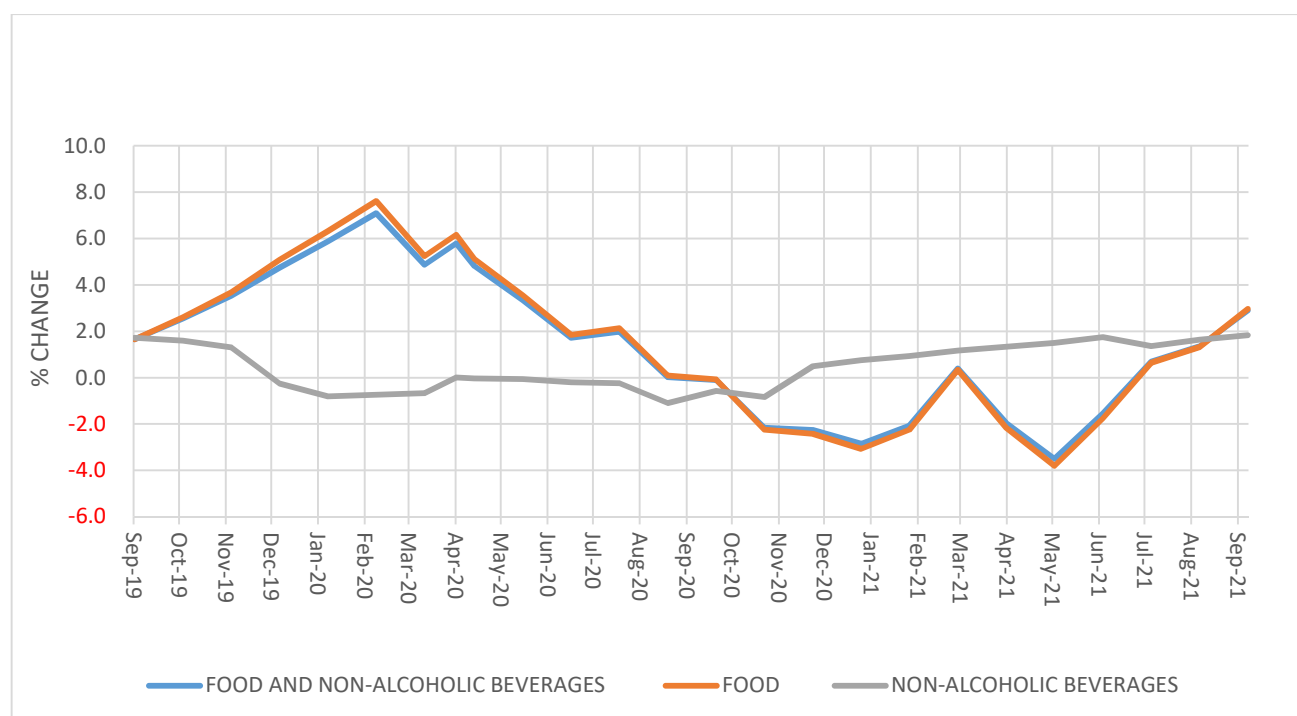
The evolution of Annual Inflation according to COICOP is described in the following paragraphs, reference is made to table 6.

01 Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The Inflation for Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages increased to 2.9 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 1.3 percent recorded in August 2021. The increase was mainly due to Annual Food Inflation that increased to 3.0 percent in September 2021 up from 1.3 percent recorded in August 2021.

In addition, Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation increased to 1.8 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 1.6 percent recorded in August 2021. *Figure 4 shows the trends of Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages Annual Inflation from September 2019 to September 2021.*

Figure 4: Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages Annual Inflation Trends; September 2019 – September 2021.



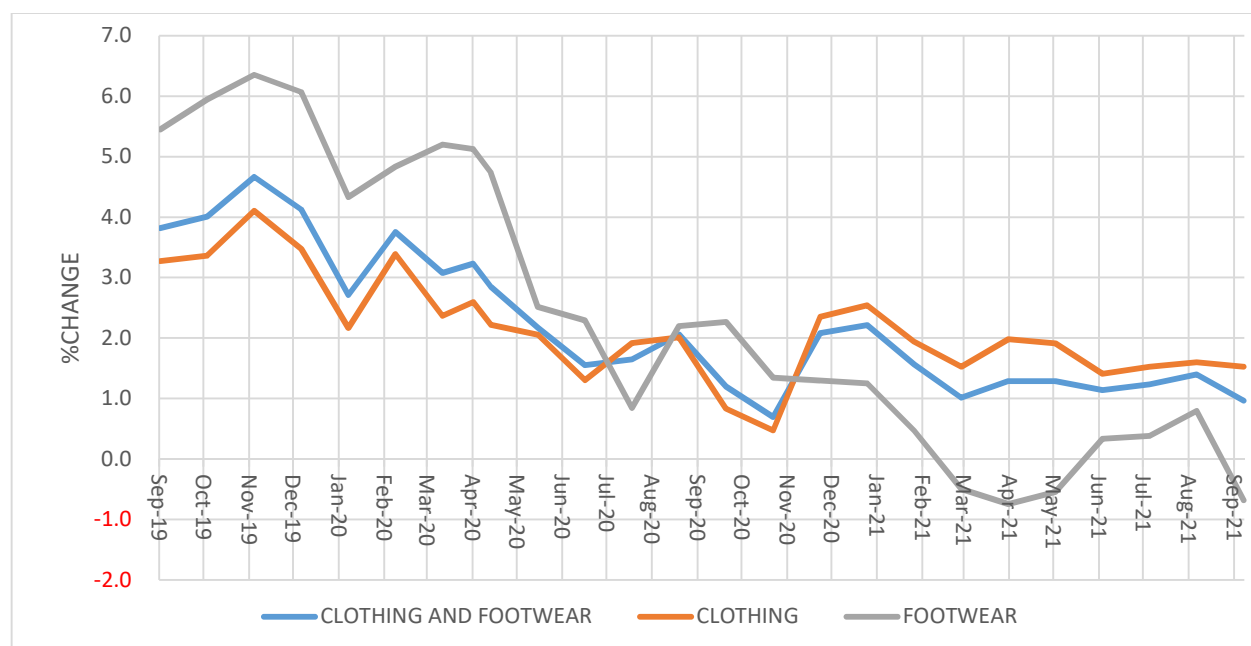
02 Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics

The Inflation for Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics decreased to 0.9 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from 1.0 percent recorded in August 2021. This was due to the Annual Tobacco Inflation that decreased to 1.7 percent in September 2021 down from 2.7 percent recorded in August 2021. However, Annual Alcoholic Beverages Inflation increased to 0.9 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 0.8 percent recorded in August 2021.

03 Clothing and Footwear

The Inflation for Clothing and Footwear decreased to 1.0 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from 1.4 percent recorded in August 2021. This was mainly due to Footwear Inflation decreased to minus 0.7 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from 0.8 percent recorded in August 2021. In addition, Clothing Inflation decreased to 1.5 percent in September 2021 down from 1.6 percent recorded in August 2021. Figure 5 shows the trends of Clothing and Footwear Inflation from September 2019 to September 2021.

04 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels comprises of Actual Rentals for Housing, Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling, Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Relating to the Dwelling, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels.

The Inflation for Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other Fuels increased to minus 0.5 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from minus 0.7 percent in August 2021. The increase was mainly attributed to Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Relating to the Dwelling Inflation increased to 0.1 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from minus 0.3 percent in August 2021. In addition, Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling Inflation that increased to 4.6 percent in September 2021 up from 4.4 percent recorded in August 2021. Actual Rentals for Housing Inflation registered 0.6 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 same rate as 0.6 percent recorded in August 2021.

Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation also increased to minus 3.1 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from minus 3.6 percent recorded in August 2021.

05 Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

This Division Comprises of Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets, Household Textiles, Household Appliances, Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils, Tools and Equipment for House & Garden, and Goods & Services for Routine Household Maintenance.

The Inflation for Furnishings, Household Equipment & Routine Household Maintenance increased to 3.0 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 1.7 percent recorded in August 2021. The increase was mainly due to Goods & Services for Routine Household Maintenance Inflation that increased to 4.3 percent in September 2021 up from 1.9 percent in August 2021. In addition, Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets Inflation increased to 1.8 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 0.8 percent in August 2021. Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils Inflation increased to 1.0 percent for the 12 month to September 2021 up from minus 0.2 percent recorded in August 2021.

However, Tools and Equipment for House & Garden Inflation decreased to 3.2 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from 4.0 percent in August 2021. Household Textiles Inflation decreased to 2.3 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from 2.4 percent recorded in August 2021. Household Appliances Inflation decreased to 0.9 percent in September 2021 down from 2.1 percent recorded in August 2021.

06 Health

The Health Division comprises of Medicines and Health Products, Outpatient Care Services, Inpatient Care Services and Other Health Services.

The Inflation for Health increased to 5.5 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 5.1 percent recorded in August 2021. This was mainly due to Inpatient Care Services Inflation that increased to 22.2 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 20.4 percent recorded in August 2021. In addition, Annual Medicines and Health Products Inflation and Annual Other Health Services Inflation increased to 0.8 percent and 2.6 percent respectively for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 0.7 percent and 2.5 percent in August 2021.

However, Outpatient Care Services Inflation decreased to 3.8 percent in September 2021 from 3.9 percent recorded in August 2021.

07 Transport

Transport division comprises of Purchase of vehicles, Operation of Personal Transport Equipment and Passenger Transport Services.

The Inflation for Transport decreased to 4.8 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from 7.3 percent recorded in August 2021. This was attributed to Annual Passenger Transport Services Inflation that decreased to 1.8 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from 7.3 percent registered in August 2021. Annual Purchase of vehicles Inflation also decreased to 6.8 percent in September 2021 down from 7.6 percent recorded in August 2021.

However, Annual Operation of Personal Transport Equipment Inflation increased to 8.2 percent in September 2021 up from 7.3 percent recorded in August 2021

08 Information and Communication

Information and Communication includes Information and Communication Equipment, and Information and Communication Services.

The Annual Inflation for Information and Communication increased to minus 0.7 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from minus 1.7 percent recorded in August 2021. This was mainly due to the Annual Information and Communication Services Inflation that increased to minus 1.8 percent in September 2021 up from minus 2.5 percent in August 2021. In addition, Annual Information and Communication Equipment Inflation increased to 2.0 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 0.3 percent recorded in August 2021.

09 Recreation, Sport and Culture

Recreation, Sport and Culture comprises of Other Recreational Goods, Gardens and Pets, Recreational Services, Cultural Services, Newspapers, Books & Stationery and Package Holidays.

The Annual Inflation for Recreation, Sport and Culture decreased to minus 0.4 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from minus 0.3 percent recorded in August 2021. This was mainly due to Annual Newspapers, Books & Stationery Inflation that decreased to 0.1 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from 0.2 percent recorded in August 2021. In addition, Annual Package Holidays Inflation decreased to minus 3.0 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from minus 0.4 percent recorded in August 2021. The Annual Cultural Services Inflation decreased to minus 2.2 percent in September 2021 down from minus 2.1 percent recorded in August 2021.

However, Annual Gardens and Pets Inflation registered an increase of 17.3 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 17.2 percent recorded in August 2021.

The Annual Other Recreational Goods Inflation registered minus 1.9 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 same rate recorded in August 2021. Also, Recreational Services Inflation registered 2.8 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 the same rate recorded in August 2021.

10 Education Services

Education Services comprises of Early Childhood and Primary Education, Secondary Education, Post-secondary non-tertiary education, Tertiary Education and Education not Defined by level.

The Annual Inflation for Education Services registered 0.6 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 the same rate recorded in August 2021. This was mainly due to Annual Tertiary Education Inflation registered 3.3 percent in September 2021 the same rate recorded in August 2021.

In addition, Annual Secondary Education Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 the same rate recorded in August 2021. Annual Post-secondary non-tertiary education Inflation registered 0.0 percent in September 2021 the same rate recorded in August 2021. Early Childhood and Primary Education Inflation registered 0.0 percent in September 2021 the same rate recorded in August 2021. Also, Education not Defined by level recorded 0.1 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 same rate recorded in August 2021.

11 Restaurants and Accommodation Services

Restaurants and Accommodation Services comprises of Food and Beverage Serving Services and Accommodation Services.

Annual Inflation for Restaurants and Accommodation Services increased to 1.6 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 1.5 percent recorded in August 2021. This was due to Annual Accommodation services Inflation that increased to minus 1.0 percent in September 2021 up from minus 1.7 percent recorded in August 2021.

However, Annual Food and Beverage Serving Services Inflation decreased to 2.7 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from 3.0 percent recorded in August 2021.

12 Insurance and Financial Services

Insurance and Financial Services comprises of Insurance and Financial Services.

The Annual Insurance and Financial Services Inflation for the 12 months to September 2021 increased to 2.2 percent up from 0.8 percent recorded in August 2021. This was due to Annual Financial Services Inflation that increased to 2.2 percent in September 2021 up from 0.8 percent recorded in August 2021.

Annual Insurance Services Inflation registered 1.2 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 the same rate recorded in August 2021.

13 Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods

Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods comprises of Personal Care, Personal Effects n.e.c, Social Protection and Other services n.e.c.

The Annual Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods Inflation for the 12 months to September 2021 increased to 2.9 percent up from 1.8 percent recorded in August 2021. This was due to Annual Personal Effects n.e.c Inflation that increased to 7.8 percent in September 2021 up from 5.3 percent recorded in August 2021. In addition, Annual Personal Care Inflation increased to 1.8 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 up from 0.2 percent recorded in August 2021.

Annual Social Protection Inflation registered 0.0 percent in September 2021 the same rate recorded in August 2021.

However, Annual Other Services n.e.c Inflation decreased to 2.6 percent for the 12 months to September 2021 down from 5.2 percent recorded in August 2021.

ANNEX 2: MONTHLY INFLATION BY COICOP DIVISIONS

The evolution of Monthly Inflation according to COICOP is described in the following paragraphs, reference is made to table 4.

01 Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The Monthly Inflation for Food and Non-alcoholic Beverages registered an increase of 1.2 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 1.1 percent rise recorded in August 2021. This was due to Food Inflation that recorded an increase of 1.2 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 1.1 percent rise recorded in August 2021. In addition, Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation registered 0.2 percent for the month of September 2021 the same rate recorded in August 2021.

02 Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics

The Monthly Inflation for Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics registered a 0.3 percent rise during the month of September 2021 from the 0.5 percent drop recorded for the month of August 2021. This was due to Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that increased by 0.4 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.6 percent drop recorded for August 2021. However, Tobacco Inflation decreased by 0.7 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 1.1 percent rise recorded for the month of August 2021

03 Clothing and Footwear

The Monthly Inflation for Clothing and Footwear registered an increase of 0.4 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in August 2021. This was due to Footwear Inflation that increased by 0.5 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.3 percent drop recorded in August 2021.

In addition, Clothing Inflation registered 0.4 percent for the month of September 2021 the same rate recorded in August 2021.

04 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels

The Monthly Inflation for Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other fuels registered a 0.4 percent rise for the month of September 2021 from 0.2 percent drop recorded in August 2021. This was attributed to Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation that registered a 0.7 percent rise for the month of September 2021 from 0.7 drop recorded for the month of August 2021. In addition, Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling Inflation registered an increase of 0.8 percent for the month of September 2021 from 0.2 percent rise recorded for the month of August 2021. Actual Rentals for Housing Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of September 2021 the same rate recorded for the month of August 2021.

However, Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Relating to the Dwelling Inflation that recorded a decrease of 0.2 percent for the month of September 2021 from 0.3 percent rise recorded in August 2021.

05 Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

The Monthly Inflation for Furnishings, Household Equipment & Routine Household Maintenance registered an increase of 0.8 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.7 percent rise recorded for the month of August 2021. This was mainly due to Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils Inflation registered 1.4 percent rise for the month of September 2021 from the 0.3 percent drop recorded for the month of August 2021. In addition, Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets Inflation registered 0.4 percent rise for the month of September 2021 from the 0.4 percent drop recorded for the month of August 2021. Household Textiles Inflation also registered an increase of 0.3 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.0 percent recorded for the month of August 2021.

However, Goods & Services for Routine Household Maintenance Inflation that registered a decrease of 1.3 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 1.5 percent rise recorded for the month of August 2021. Tools and Equipment for House & Garden Inflation Household Appliances Inflation registered 0.4 percent drop for the month of September 2021 from the 0.5 percent rise recorded for the month of August 2021. Household Appliances Inflation registered a 0.3 percent drop for the month of September 2021 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded for the month of August 2021.

06 Health

The Monthly Inflation for Health registered an increase of 0.7 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded for the month of August 2021. This was mainly due to Inpatient Care Services Inflation that registered 2.5 percent rise for the month of September 2021 from the 0.3 percent drop recorded for the month of August 2021. In addition, Medicines and Health Products Inflation registered 0.2 percent rise for the month of September 2021 from the 0.0 percent recorded for the month of August 2021.

However, Outpatient Care Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded for the month of August 2021. Other Health Services Inflation that registered a decrease of 0.4 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.6 percent rise recorded for the month of August 2021.

07 Transport

Transport Inflation registered 0.1 percent rise for the month of September 2021 from the 2.1 percent drop recorded for the month of August 2021. This was mainly due to Passenger Transport Services Inflation that registered an increase of 1.0 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 5.1 percent drop recorded for the month of August 2021. In addition, Purchase of vehicles Inflation registered an increase of 1.5 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.5 percent drop recorded for the month of August 2021. However, Operation of Personal Transport Equipment Inflation recorded a decrease 0.9 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 1.5 percent rise recorded during the month of August 2021.

08 Information and Communication

The Monthly Inflation for Information and Communication registered an increase of 1.0 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.0 percent recorded for the month of August 2021. This was due to Information and Communication Services Inflation that registered an increase of 0.9 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.0 percent recorded for the month of August 2021.

Information and Communication Equipment Inflation registered an increase of 1.3 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.2 percent drop recorded for the month of August 2021.

09 Recreation, Sport and Culture

Monthly Recreation, Sport and Culture Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.8 percent drop recorded during the month of August 2021. This was mainly due to Cultural Services Inflation that registered an increase of 0.1 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 1.4 percent drop recorded during the month of August 2021. Newspapers, Books & Stationery Inflation registered an increase of 0.2 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.4 percent drop recorded for the month of August 2021. Gardens and Pets Inflation registered an increase of 0.2 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.7 percent drop recorded during the month of August 2021. Recreational Services and Other Recreational Goods Inflation all registered 0.0 percent for the month of September 2021 the same rate recorded for the month of August 2021.

However, Package Holidays Inflation registered 2.7 percent drop for the month of September 2021 from 0.0 percent recorded during the month of August 2021.

10 Education Services

Monthly Inflation for Education Services registered 0.0 percent for the month of September 2021 compared to 0.0 percent recorded for the month of August 2021. This was due to no changes registered for all Education Services. Tertiary Education, Early Childhood and Primary Education, Secondary Education, Post-secondary non-tertiary education and Education not Defined by level Inflation all registered 0.0 percent for the month of September 2021 the same rate recorded for the month of August 2021.

11 Restaurants and Accommodation Services

The Monthly Inflation for Restaurants and Accommodation Services registered 0.0 percent for the month of September 2021 from 0.1 percent increase recorded for the month of August 2021. This was mainly due to Food and Beverage Serving Services Inflation that decreased to 0.1 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded during the month of August 2021. However, Accommodation Services Inflation registered an increase of 0.1 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.8 percent drop recorded for the month of August 2021.

12 Insurance and Financial Services

Insurance and Financial Services Inflation registered an increase of 1.3 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.1 percent decrease recorded for the month of August 2021. This was due to Financial Services Inflation that registered an increase of 1.5 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.0 percent recorded for the month of August 2021. Insurance Inflation that registered 0.0 percent for the month of September 2021 from the 0.9 percent rise recorded for the month of August 2021.

13 Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods

Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods Inflation for the month of September 2021 registered 1.1 percent increase from the 0.0 percent recorded for the month of August 2021. This was due to Personal Care Inflation that registered 1.3 percent rise for the month of September 2021 from the 0.6 percent drop recorded for the month of August 2021. In addition, Other services n.e.c Inflation registered 0.1 percent drop for the month of September 2021 the same rate recorded for the month of August 2021. However, Personal Effects n.e.c Inflation registered 1.4 percent decrease for the month of September 2021 from the 2.4 percent rise recorded for the month of August 2021. Social Protection Inflation registered 0.0 percent during the month of September 2021 the same rate recorded for the month of August 2021.
