

### **CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES**

### OCTOBER 2021

### 1.1 Annual Headline Inflation

The inflation rate as measured by the Consumer Price Index for Uganda for the 12 months to October 2021 decreased to 1.9 percent, down from 2.2 percent in September 2021. This was mainly driven by the decline in the prices of commodities under; 'Transport' (2.4 percent), 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' (minus 0.5 percent) and 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' (minus 0.9 percent) between October 2020 and October 2021, as shown in Tables 1 and 2.

However, there were some increases in the prices of commodities under; 'Clothing and Footwear' (2.2 percent), 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household (3.9 percent), and, 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' (3.1 percent) between October 2020 and October 2021.

### 1.2 Monthly Inflation

The Monthly Headline Inflation for October 2021 increased by 0.2 percent compared to the 0.6 percent increase recorded for September 2021. This is mainly attributed to the monthly Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages which rose by 0.4 percent in the month of October 2021 compared to the 1.2 percent rise recorded in the month of September 2021. In addition, the monthly Inflation for 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' increased by 0.5 percent in October 2021 compared to the 0.4 percent increase recorded in September 2021. The monthly inflation for 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household' increased by 1.1 percent in October 2021 compared to the 0.8 percent recorded in the month of September 2021. 'Clothing and Footwear' Inflation increased by 0.5 percent in October 2021 compared to the 0.4 percent rise recorded in September 2021. 'Recreation, Sport and Culture' monthly Inflation increased by 0.1 percent in October 2021 compared to the 0.0 percent recorded in September 2021, Table 2 below.

Relative to September 2021, the prices of Pineapples in October 2021 increased by 11.2 percent, Cooking Bananas (Matooke) increased by 10.6 percent, Whole Cassava increased by 9.0 percent, Smoked Tilapia increased by 6.9 percent, Sweet Potatoes increased by 5.6 percent, and Laundry Soap Bar increased by 5.6 percent, see Table 3 below.

### 1.3 Annual Core and Non-Core Inflation

The Core Inflation for the 12 months to October 2021 decreased to 2.1 percent in October 2021 down from 2.2 percent in September 2021. This is attributed to Annual Services Inflation that decreased to 1.1 percent in October 2021 down from 1.8 percent in September 2021. However, Annual 'Other Goods' Inflation increased to 3.0 percent for the 12 months to October 2021 up from 2.5 percent in September 2021, Table 4.

The Non-Core inflation for the 12 months to October 2021 decreased to 0.8 percent down from 1.8 percent in September 2021. The decrease in Annual Non-Core Inflation is mainly attributed to annual 'Food Crops and Related Items' Inflation that decreased to 1.7 percent in October 2021 down from 3.2 percent in September 2021. This majorly was due to Annual 'Fruits and nuts' Inflation that decreased to minus 3.5 percent in October 2021 down from 0.3 percent in September 2021.




Figure 2: Annual National Core and Non-Core Inflation: October 2019 - October 2021.

In addition, Annual Energy Fuel and Utilities Inflation (EFU) decreased to minus 0.2 percent, down from 0.2 percent in September 2021. The drop in EFU Inflation was due to Annual Solid Fuels Inflation that decreased to minus 7.9 percent in October 2021 down from minus 4.0 percent in September 2021. Specifically, Annual Firewood inflation decreased to minus 17.5 percent in October 2021 down from minus 9.0 percent in September 2021, Table 1 and Figure 2.

### 1.4 Annual Goods Inflation

The Goods inflation for the 12 months to October 2021 is registered at 2.4 percent the same rate recorded in September 2021. This was due to Annual Semi-Durable Goods (SD) Goods Inflation that increased to 2.6 percent in October 2021 up from 1.8 percent in September 2021. This increase was offset by decreases in Annual Inflation for Durables (D) that decreased to 3.3 percent for the 12 months to October 2021 down from 4.5 percent in September 2021. In addition, Annual Inflation for Non-Durable (ND) registered 2.3 percent for the 12 month to October 2021 the same rate recorded in September 2021, Table 5 below.

### 1.5 Annual Headline Inflation by Income Groups and Geographical areas

Analysis by geographical areas and income groups reveal that Arua registered the highest Inflation of 2.6 percent for the 12 months to October 2021 from 1.7 percent recorded in September 2021. This was driven by annual 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation that increased to 3.5 percent in October 2021 up from 1.2 percent registered in September 2021. In addition Annual Transport Inflation increased to 4.6 percent in October 2021 up from minus 1.4 percent in September 2021.

The second highest Inflation was registered in the basket of Kampala High Income at 2.6 percent for the 12 months to October 2021 down from 3.1 percent in September 2021. The main driver for the high inflation was the Annual 'Clothing and Footwear' Inflation that increased to 2.7 percent in October 2021, up from 1.0 percent in September 2021. In addition, Annual 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household' Inflation increased to 2.5 percent for the 12 months to October 2021 up from 0.9 percent in September 2021.

The least Annual Inflation was registered in Kampala Low Income at 0.2 percent for the 12 months to October 2021 the same rate recorded in September 2021. The low inflation in the Centre was mainly due to 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' Inflation that declined to 2.0 Percent for the 12 months to October 2021 down from 5.6 percent in September 2021. In addition, Annual 'Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods' Inflation declined to 1.2 percent in October 2021 down from 2.6 percent in September 2021.
