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FOREWORD

This publication provides the monthly Consumer Price Indices for Uganda (Composite) and for the ten centres of Kampala High Income, Kampala Middle Income, Kampala Low Income, Jinja, Mbale, Masaka, Mbarara, Fortportal, Gulu and Arua. All the baskets are for the urban households.

The current Consumer Price Index has been rebased from 2009/2010 to 2016/2017, using weights derived from the Uganda National Household Survey (UNHS VI) that was conducted from July 2016 to June 2017. The rebased CPI is classified using international standards, referred to as Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP 2018). This is a shift from the COICOP 1999 that was used in the earlier series. COICOP 2018 is more detailed than the previous (1999) version, responding to the users' need for more detail, and addresses several other issues that required revision of the classification. The new COICOP of 2018 reflects the significant changes in goods and services in some areas, improved links of COICOP to other classifications, and addresses emerging statistical and policy needs of regional and international users.

At the elementary aggregate (EA) level, the indices are computed using the Jevons (Geometric Mean) method for all items within the elementary aggregates. The modified Laspeyres index formula is used to compute higher level indices. The National CPI is computed as a weighted average of the ten centres mentioned above and rebased indices are available from July 2017 to date at EA level.



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ACRONYMS AND DEFINITIONS

COICOP: Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose, is a nomenclature developed by the United Nations Statistics Division to classify and analyse individual consumption expenditures incurred by households, non-profit institutions serving households and general government according to their purpose.

CPI: Consumer Price Index - a general indicator of price levels paid by households for consumer goods and services.

CPI basket: A commonly used term for the goods and services priced for the purpose of compiling the CPI.

Elementary aggregate (EA): The lowest level of commodity classification in the CPI, and the only level for which index numbers are constructed by direct reference to price data.

Inflation: A term commonly used to refer to changes in price levels. A rise in prices is called inflation, and a persistent fall is called deflation.

Jevons price index: An elementary price index defined as the un-weighted geometric average of the sample price relatives. It can also be defined as the un-weighted geometric average of the current to base period price relatives.

Laspeyres price index: The Laspeyres price index is an index formula used in price statistics for measuring the price development of the basket of goods and services consumed in the base period. The question it answers is how much a basket that consumers bought in the base period would cost in the current period.

Outlet: The interface between a supplier of products and the consumer. It may be a shop, a market stall, a catalogue, a website etc. Also referred to as a "retail outlet", although it can include wholesale outlets which also sell directly to the consumers

Outlier: A term used to describe any extreme value in a set of data, such as a price or price relative that requires further investigation or has been verified as incorrect

Price relative: A measure of price movements: the ratio of the price level in one period to the price level in another.

Reference base: The period in which the CPI is given a value of 100.0. The CPI is currently on a reference base of 2016/17.

Weight: The measure of the importance of an item in the index regimen relative to the other items. Weights can be expressed in either quantity or value terms. Value weights are used in the CPI.

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1.0 HIGHLIGHTS OF UGANDA CPI FOR JUNE 2025

1.1 Annual Headline Inflation

The Annual Inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index for Uganda for the 12 months to June 2025 is 3.9 percent compared to the 3.8 percent registered in the year ended May 2025, see Table 1 and Figure 1 below.

This is largely attributed to Annual Food Crops and Related Items Inflation recorded at 4.7 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to 4.3 percent registered in the year ended May 2025. This was mainly attributed to a rise in the prices of Dry beans by 12.1 percent compared to 9.2 percent in May 2025, Cooking Bananas (Matoke) by 37.7 percent compared to 29.8 percent in May 2025, Passion fruit prices by 5.3 percent compared to minus 2.1 percent in May 2025 and Irish potato prices that recorded minus 0.6 percent compared to minus 5.5 percent in May 2025.

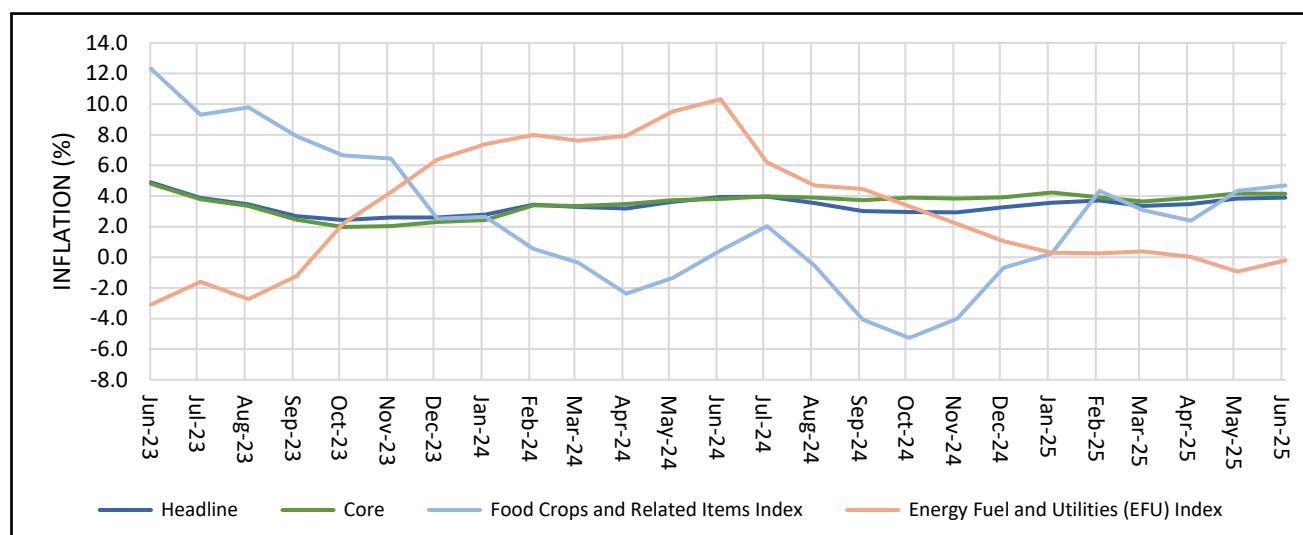
Annual Core Inflation is registered at 4.2 percent in the year ending June 2025 same rate recorded in the year ended May 2025. The main driver of Annual Core Inflation is the Annual Services Inflation that recorded 4.7 percent in June 2025 same rate registered in May 2025. This was mainly due to Outpatient care services inflation that recorded 7.9 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to 4.5 percent registered in the year ended May 2025. In addition, Restaurants and accommodation services inflation recorded 4.7 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to 4.6 percent registered in the year ended May 2025. However, Annual Other Goods Inflation recorded 3.7 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to 3.8 percent registered in the year ended May 2025. This was mainly due to Sugar prices that increased by 3.9 percent in June 2025 compared to minus 4.0 percent recorded in May 2025. In addition, Rice prices increased by 7.6 percent in June 2025 compared to 3.7 percent recorded in May 2025. Maize Flour prices registered 12.6 percent in June 2025 compared to 7.4 percent recorded in May 2025.

Annual Energy Fuel and Utilities (EFU) Inflation recorded minus 0.2 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to minus 0.9 percent registered in the year ended May 2025. This was mainly attributed to Firewood prices that recorded 7.8 percent in June 2025 compared to 8.4 percent recorded in May 2025 and Kerosene prices that dropped by minus 4.1 percent in June 2025 compared to minus 4.0 percent recorded in May 2025. However, Charcoal prices increased by 4.6 percent in June 2025 compared to 2.6 percent recorded in May 2025, Petrol prices decreased by minus 6.6 percent in June 2025 compared to minus 7.7 percent registered in May 2025, Diesel prices dropped by minus 4.7 percent in June 2025 compared to minus 6.0 percent registered in May 2025 and Liquefied gas (propane) prices decreased by minus 4.9 percent in June 2025 compared to minus 6.4 percent recorded in May 2025.

1.2 Annual Average Headline Inflation

The Annual Average Headline Inflation for the Financial Year 2024/25 was registered at 3.5 percent compared to 3.2 percent recorded during the Financial Year 2023/24. This was mainly due to the Annual Average Core Inflation that registered 3.9 percent for the Financial Year 2024/25 compared to 3.0 percent registered during the Financial Year 2023/24.

1.3 Annual Inflation by COICOP Divisions

According to the Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP), the main drivers to the 3.9 percent Inflation were 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Inflation that increased to 2.9 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to 2.4 percent registered in the year ended May 2025. 'Recreation, Sport and Culture' Inflation registered 2.8 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to 1.9 percent registered in the year ended May 2025. 'Information and Communication' Inflation increased to 1.7 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to 1.2 percent recorded in the year ended May 2025. 'Transport' Inflation registered 2.9 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to 2.7 percent recorded in the year ended May 2025. 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation registered 4.8 percent in the year ending June 2025, the same rate registered in the year ended May 2025. 'Health' Inflation registered 4.6 percent for the year ending June 2025 compared to 4.4 percent registered for the year ended May 2025. 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' Inflation registered 1.8 percent for the year ending June 2025 compared to 1.7 percent registered for the year ended May 2025. 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' Inflation increased to 4.7 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to 4.6 percent registered in the year ended May 2025.

However, 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household' Inflation registered 1.8 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to 2.7 percent registered in the year ended May 2025. 'Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods' Inflation registered 1.3 percent for the year ending June 2025 compared to 1.7 percent registered for the year ended May 2025. 'Education Services' Inflation registered 6.3 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to 6.7 percent recorded in the year ended May 2025. 'Clothing and Footwear' Inflation registered 3.2 percent in the year ending June 2025 compared to 3.3 percent recorded in the year ended May 2025. 'Insurance and Financial Services' Inflation registered 13.1 percent in the year ending June 2025, same rate recorded in the year ended May 2025, see Table 3 below.

1.4 Monthly Inflation.

The Monthly Headline Inflation for June 2025 increased by 0.1 percent from the 0.5 percent rise registered in May 2025, Table 4 below.

This was due to the increase in the monthly Core Inflation of 0.3 percent in June 2025 from the 0.5 percent rise registered in May 2025. The main driver was the monthly Services Inflation that increased by 0.4 percent in June 2025 from the 0.3 percent rise recorded in May 2025. In addition, Other Goods Inflation increased by 0.2 percent in June 2025 from the 0.7 percent rise recorded in May 2025.

Monthly Food Crops and Related Items Inflation decreased by 2.2 percent in June 2025 from the 0.6 percent rise recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to decrease in prices of cooking bananas by 9.3 percent in June 2025 from the 9.6 percent rise recorded in May 2025, fresh beans by 24.3 percent in June 2025 from the 15.3 percent rise recorded in May 2025, mangoes by 12.8 percent in June 2025 from the 16.2 percent rise recorded in May 2025, cabbage by 13.9 percent in June 2025 from the 7.4 percent drop recorded in May 2025 and tomatoes by 4.2 percent in June 2025 from the 9.3 percent drop recorded in May 2025.

Monthly Energy Fuel and Utilities (EFU) Inflation increased by 0.8 percent in June 2025 from the 0.1 percent rise registered in May 2025. This was mainly due to monthly Solid Fuels Inflation that increased by 2.0 percent in June 2025 from the 0.6 percent drop recorded in May 2025. Specifically, charcoal prices increased by 2.1 percent in June 2025 from the 1.7 percent drop recorded in May 2025 and firewood prices increased by 1.9 percent in June 2025 from the 1.6 percent rise recorded in May 2025. In addition, petrol prices increased by 1.1 percent in June 2025 from the 1.5 percent rise recorded in May 2025 and diesel prices increased by 0.2 percent in June 2025 from the 0.9 percent rise recorded in May 2025

1.5 Monthly Inflation by COICOP Divisions

According to the Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP), monthly Education Services Inflation increased by 1.3 percent in June 2025 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2025. Monthly Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation increased by 0.5 percent in June 2025 from the 0.2 percent drop recorded in May 2025. Monthly Recreation, Sport and Culture Inflation increased by 0.7 percent in June 2025 from the 0.8 percent rise recorded in May 2025. Monthly Restaurants and Accommodation Services Inflation increased by 0.4 percent in June 2025 from the 0.3 percent rise recorded in May 2025. Monthly Health Inflation increased by 0.7 percent in June 2025 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in May 2025. Monthly Information and Communication Inflation increased by 0.6 percent in June 2025 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2025. Monthly Clothing and Footwear Inflation increased by 0.4 percent in June 2025 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded in May 2025. Monthly Transport Inflation increased by 0.1 percent in June 2025 from the 0.5 percent rise recorded in May 2025. Monthly Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics Inflation increased by 0.3 percent in June 2025 from the 0.6 percent drop recorded in May 2025. Monthly Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods Inflation increased by 0.2 percent in June 2025 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2025.

However, monthly Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation decreased by 0.7 percent in June 2025 from the 1.3 percent rise recorded in May 2025. Monthly Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Inflation decreased by 0.1 percent in June 2025 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded in May 2025.

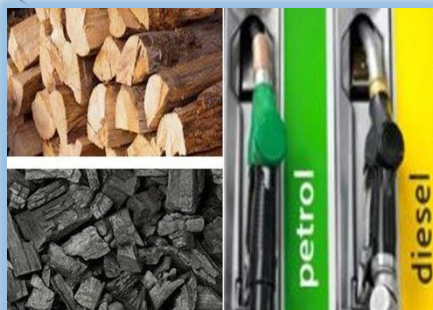

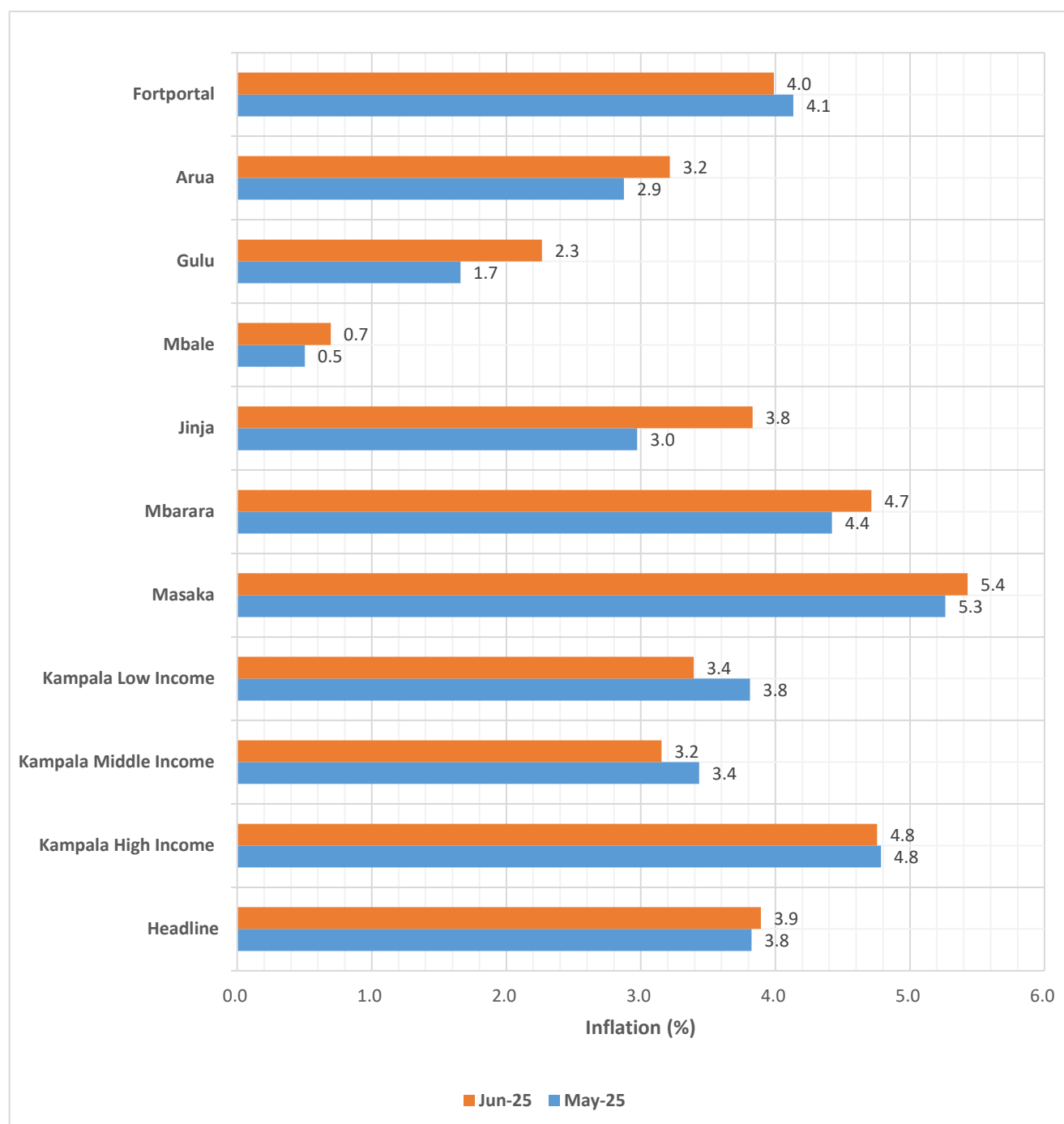
1.6 Annual Headline Inflation by CPI Geographical Center

Analysis by geographical areas and income groups revealed that Masaka center registered the highest Inflation at 5.4 percent for the year ending June 2025 compared to 5.3 percent recorded in May 2025. This was mainly driven by annual 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Inflation that increased to 8.8 percent in June 2025 compared to 5.3 percent registered in May 2025. In addition, Annual 'Transport' Inflation registered minus 0.2 percent in June 2025 compared to minus 1.2 percent registered in May 2025.

The second highest Annual Inflation was registered in Kampala High Income group at 4.8 percent for the year ending June 2025, the same rate recorded in May 2025. This was mainly driven by annual 'Recreation, Sport and Culture' Inflation that increased to 2.8 percent in June 2025 compared to 1.3 percent registered in May 2025. In addition, Annual 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Inflation increased to 2.4 percent in June 2025 compared to 1.9 percent registered in May 2025.

The least Annual Inflation was registered in Mbale Centre at 0.7 percent for the year ending June 2025 compared to 0.5 percent recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to the annual 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' Inflation that registered 4.3 percent in June 2025 compared to 5.9 percent registered in May 2025. In addition, Annual 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household' Inflation registered minus 4.0 percent in June 2025 compared to minus 1.7 percent registered in May 2025.

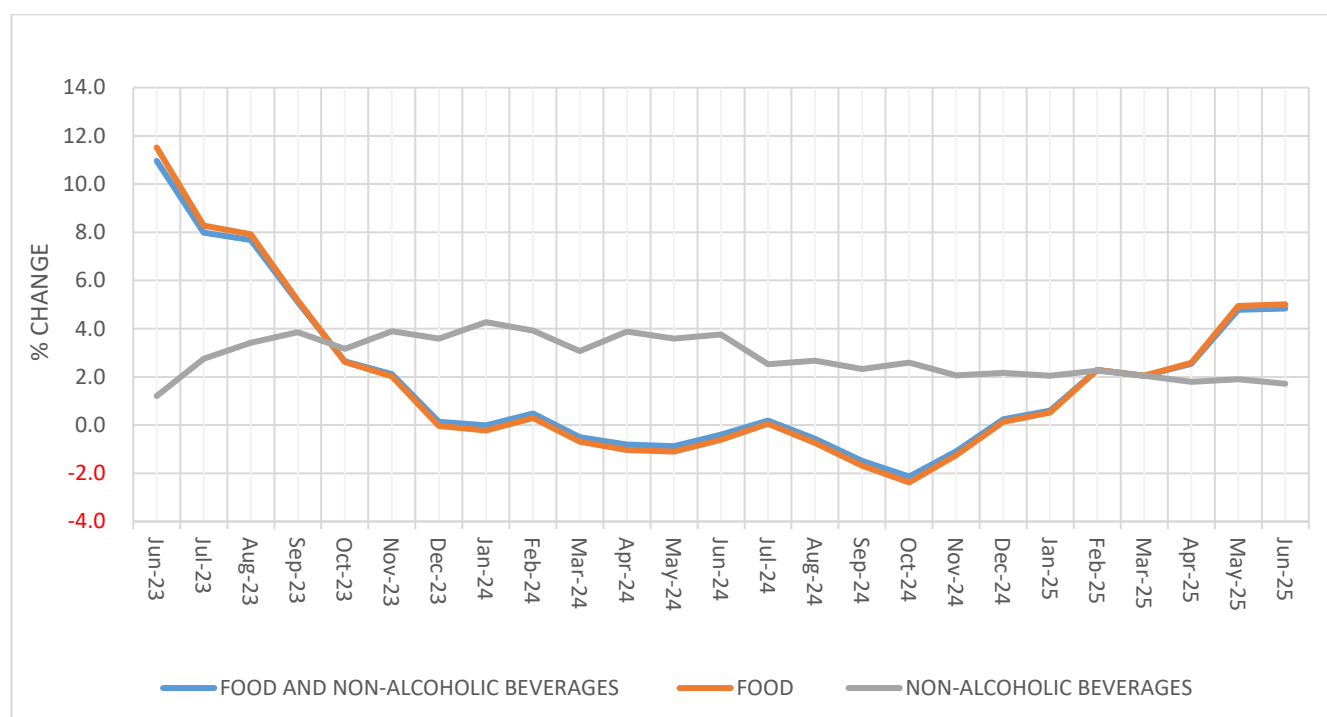
01 Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The Inflation for Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages increased to 4.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 the same rate registered in May 2025. This was mainly due to Annual Food Inflation that increased to 5.0 percent in June 2025 compared to 4.9 percent recorded in May 2025.

Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation for the 12 months to June 2025 registered 1.7 percent compared to 1.9 percent recorded in May 2025.

Figure 4 shows the trends of Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages Annual Inflation from June 2023 to June 2025.

02 Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics

Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics Inflation increased to 1.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 1.7 percent recorded in May 2025. This was attributed to the Annual Tobacco Inflation that registered minus 1.5 percent in June 2025 compared to minus 2.5 percent registered in May 2025.

In addition, Annual Alcoholic Beverages Inflation registered 2.2 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

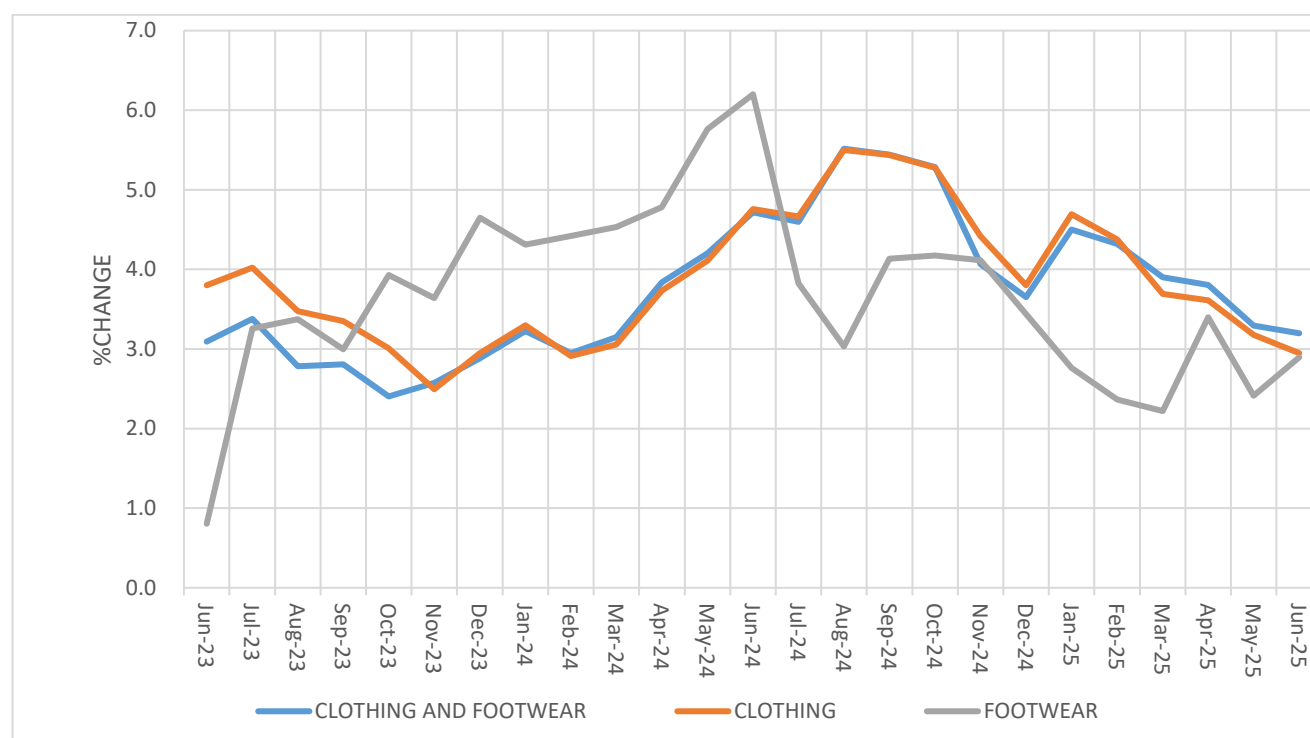
03 Clothing and Footwear

The Annual Clothing and Footwear Inflation slowed down to 3.2 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 3.3 percent recorded in May 2025. This was mainly attributed to Clothing Inflation that slowed down to 2.9 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 3.2 percent recorded in May 2025.

However, Footwear Inflation increased to 4.0 percent in June 2025 compared to 3.6 percent recorded in May 2025.

04 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels comprises of Actual Rentals for Housing, Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling, Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Relating to the Dwelling, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other Fuels Inflation increased to 2.9 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 2.4 percent recorded in May 2025. This was mainly attributed to Annual Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation that increased to 1.0 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 0.2 percent recorded in May 2025.

In addition, Annual Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling Inflation registered minus 1.2 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to minus 2.8 percent recorded in May 2025. Annual Actual Rentals for Housing Inflation registered 2.0 percent in June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Relating to the Dwelling inflation recorded 10.7 percent in June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

05 Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

This Division Comprises of Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets, Household Textiles, Household Appliances, Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils, Tools and Equipment for House & Garden, and Goods & Services for Routine Household Maintenance.

The Inflation for Furnishings, Household Equipment & Routine Household Maintenance slowed down to 1.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 2.7 percent recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to Annual Goods & Services for Routine Household Maintenance Inflation that slowed down to 0.9 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 2.0 percent registered in May 2025.

In addition, Annual Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils Inflation slowed down to 7.4 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 10.4 percent recorded in May 2025.

Annual Household textiles Inflation slowed down to 0.2 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 from the 1.6 percent recorded in May 2025.

Annual Household appliances inflation slowed down to 0.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 1.1 percent recorded in May 2025.

However, Annual Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets Inflation increased to 4.4 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 2.8 percent recorded in May 2025.

Annual Tools and Equipment for House & Garden Inflation registered minus 0.4 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

06 Health

The Health Division comprises of Medicines and Health Products, Outpatient Care Services, Inpatient Care Services and Other Health Services.

The Inflation for Health increased to 4.6 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 4.4 percent registered in May 2025. This was mainly due to Annual Outpatient Care Services Inflation that increased to 7.9 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to the 4.5 percent recorded in May 2025.

In addition, Annual Other Health Services Inflation increased to 6.3 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 5.8 percent recorded in May 2025.

However, Annual Inpatient Care Services Inflation slowed down to 2.9 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 3.2 percent recorded in May 2025. Annual Medicine and Health Products Inflation slowed down to 3.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 4.5 percent recorded in May 2025.

07 Transport

Transport division comprises of Purchase of vehicles, Operation of Personal Transport Equipment and Passenger Transport Services.

The Inflation for Transport increased to 2.9 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 2.7 percent recorded in May 2025. This was mainly attributed to Annual Purchase of vehicles Inflation that increased to 5.4 percent in June 2025 compared to 4.2 percent recorded in May 2025.

In addition, Annual Operation of Personal Transport Equipment inflation increased to 7.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 7.4 percent registered in May 2025.

However, Annual Passenger Transport Services Inflation decreased to minus 2.7 percent in June 2025 compared to minus 2.3 percent recorded in May 2025.

08 Information and Communication

Information and Communication includes Information and Communication Equipment, and Information and Communication Services.

The Annual Inflation for Information and Communication increased to 1.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 from the 1.2 percent recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to Annual Information and Communication Equipment Inflation that increased to 4.3 percent in June 2025 compared to 2.7 percent recorded in May 2025.

Annual Information and Communication Services Inflation registered 0.5 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

09 Recreation, Sport and Culture

Recreation, Sport and Culture comprises of Other Recreational Goods, Gardens and Pets, Recreational Services, Cultural Services, Newspapers, Books & Stationery and Package Holidays.

The Annual Inflation for Recreation, Sport and Culture increased to 2.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 1.9 percent recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to Annual Cultural Services Inflation that increased to 2.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 1.3 percent recorded in May 2025.

In addition, Annual Newspapers, Books & Stationery Inflation increased to 1.6 percent in June 2025 compared to 0.9 percent recorded in May 2025.

Annual Other Recreational Goods Inflation increased to 8.2 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 7.4 percent recorded in May 2025.

Annual Recreational Services Inflation increased to 5.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

Annual Gardens and Pets inflation registered 13.2 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

However, Annual Package Holidays inflation registered minus 7.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to minus 7.2 percent recorded in May 2025.

10 Education Services

Education Services comprises of Early Childhood and Primary Education, Secondary Education, Post-secondary non-tertiary education, Tertiary Education and Education Not Defined by level.

The Annual Inflation for Education Services slowed down to 6.3 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 from the 6.7 percent recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to Annual Early Childhood and Primary Education inflation that slowed down to 6.9 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 8.3 percent recorded in May 2025.

However, Annual Secondary Education Inflation increased 7.8 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 6.7 percent recorded in May 2025.

Annual Post-Secondary Non-Tertiary Education inflation increased to 9.3 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 8.0 percent recorded in May 2025.

Annual Education NotDefined by level registered 0.1 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

11 Restaurants and Accommodation Services

Restaurants and Accommodation Services comprises of Food and Beverage Serving Services and Accommodation Services.

Annual Inflation for Restaurants and Accommodation Services increased to 4.7 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 4.6 percent recorded in May 2025.

This was mainly due to Annual Food and Beverage Serving Services Inflation that increased to 5.1 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 5.0 percent recorded in May 2025.

However, Annual Accommodation Services Inflation slowed down to 3.6 percent in June 2025 compared to 3.8 percent recorded in May 2025.

12 Insurance and Financial Services

Insurance and Financial Services comprises of Insurance and Financial Services.

The Annual Insurance and Financial Services Inflation for the 12 months to June 2025 registered 13.1 percent the same rate recorded in May 2025.

Annual Financial Services Inflation registered 14.3 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

In addition, Annual Insurance Services Inflation registered 0.5 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

13 Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods

Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods comprises of Personal Care, Personal Effects n.e.c, Social Protection and Other services n.e.c.

The Annual Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods Inflation for the 12 months to June 2025 slowed down to 1.3 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 1.7 percent recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to Annual Personal Care Inflation that decreased to minus 0.5 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to minus 0.2 percent recorded in May 2025.

In addition, Annual Other Services n.e.c Inflation slowed down to 4.4 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 4.8 percent recorded in May 2025.

Annual Personal Effects NEC Inflation slowed down to 5.4 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 compared to 5.8 percent recorded in May 2025.

Annual Social Protection Inflation registered 4.5 percent for the 12 months to June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

ANNEX 2: MONTHLY INFLATION BY COICOP DIVISIONS

The evolution of Monthly Inflation according to COICOP is described in the following paragraphs, reference is made to table 4.

01 Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The Monthly Inflation for Food and Non-alcoholic Beverages decreased by 0.7 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 1.3 percent rise recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to the monthly Food Inflation that decreased by 0.8 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 1.3 percent rise recorded in May 2025.

In addition, Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation decreased by 0.1 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded in May 2025 .

02 Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics

The Monthly Inflation for Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics increased by 0.3 percent for the month of June 2025 from 0.6 percent drop recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to Alcoholic beverages Inflation that registered 0.2 percent rise for the month of June 2025 from the 0.7 percent drop recorded in May 2025.

In addition, Tobacco Inflation registered a rise of 1.4 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.3 percent rise recorded in May 2025.

03 Clothing and Footwear

The Monthly Inflation for Clothing and Footwear increased by 0.4 percent for the month of June 2025 compared to 0.1 percent rise recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to Clothing Inflation that increased by 0.3 percent for the month of June 2025 from 0.1 percent rise recorded in May 2025. Footwear inflation registered 0.4 percent rise for the month of June 2025 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2025.

04 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels

The Monthly Inflation for Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other fuels registered a rise of 0.5 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.2 percent drop recorded in May 2025. This was mainly attributed to Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation that registered a rise of 1.2 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.4 percent decrease recorded in May 2025.

In addition, Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling Inflation increased by 0.4 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded in May 2025.

Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

Actual Rentals for Housing Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

05 Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

The Monthly Inflation for Furnishings, Household Equipment & Routine Household Maintenance registered 0.1 percent drop for the month of June 2025 from the 0.1 percent rise registered for the month of May 2025.

This was mainly due to Goods and Services for routine household maintenance inflation that recorded 0.7 percent drop in June 2025 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2025. In addition, Tools and Equipment for House and Garden Inflation recorded 0.1 percent drop for the month of June 2025 from the 0.1 percent rise registered in May 2025.

Household Textiles inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded for May 2025

However, Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets inflation increased by 1.5 percent for the month of June 2025 from 0.1 percent rise recorded in May 2025. Household Appliances Inflation recorded 1.0 percent rise for the month of June 2025 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded in May 2025.

Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils Inflation recorded 0.1 percent rise for the month of June 2025 the same rate registered in May 2025.

06 Health

The Monthly Inflation for Health increased by 0.7 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to Outpatient Care Services Inflation that registered 3.3 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.0 percent registered in May 2025.

In addition, Other Health Services Inflation registered 1.6 percent rise for the month of June 2025 from the 0.0 percent registered in May 2025.

Medicines And Health Products Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.2 percent rise registered in May 2025.

However, Inpatient care services inflation registered 0.3 percent drop for the month of June 2025 from the 0.7 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2025.

07 Transport

Transport Inflation registered 0.1 percent rise for the month of June 2025 from the 0.5 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2025. This was mainly due to Purchase of vehicles Inflation that increased by 1.2 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.7 percent rise recorded in May 2025.

In addition, Operation of personal transport equipment inflation increased by 0.3 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 1.4 percent rise recorded in May 2025.

However, Passenger Transport Services inflation decreased by 0.4 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.3 percent drop recorded in May 2025.

08 Information and Communication

The monthly inflation for Information and Communication registered a rise of 0.6 percent for the month of June 2025 compared to 0.0 percent recorded in May 2025.

This was mainly due to Information and Communication Equipment inflation that registered 1.8 percent rise for the month of June 2025 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded in May 2025.

Information and communication services inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2025 the same rate recorded in May 2025.

09 Recreation, Sport and Culture

Monthly Recreation, Sport and Culture inflation registered 0.7 percent rise in the month of June 2025 from the 0.8 percent rise recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to Cultural Services Inflation that registered a rise of 1.4 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2025.

In addition, Newspapers, books & stationery inflation increased by 0.2 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.5 percent rise recorded in May 2025.

Recreational services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 5.8 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2025.

Other recreational goods inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2025 from 2.0 percent rise recorded in May 2025.

Gardens and Pets Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2025 the same rate recorded during the month of May 2025.

However, Package Holidays Inflation registered a drop of 2.2 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.0 percent recorded for the month of May 2025.

10 Education Services

Monthly Inflation for Education Services registered a rise of 1.3 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2025. This was mainly due to Early Childhood and Primary Education Inflation that registered a rise of 1.1 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2025. In addition, Secondary Education Inflation registered a rise of 1.9 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2025. Post-secondary and non-tertiary education Inflation recorded a rise of 2.5 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.0 percent recorded in May 2025.

Tertiary education Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the the month of June 2025 the same rate recorded for the month of May 2025. Education not Defined by level inflation recorded 0.0 percent for the month of June 2025 the same rate recorded for the month of May 2025.

11 Restaurants and Accommodation Services

The Monthly Inflation for restaurants and accommodation services increased by 0.4 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.7 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2025. This was mainly due to Food and beverage serving services inflation that increased by 0.5 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 1.0 percent rise recorded for the month of May 2025.

Accommodation services inflation registered a rise of 0.2 percent for the month of June 2025 from the 0.0 percent registered in May 2025.

12 Insurance and Financial Services

Insurance and Financial Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2025 the same rate recorded for the month of May 2025.

Financial Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2025 the same rate recorded for the month of May 2025.

Insurance Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of June 2025 the same rate recorded for the month of May 2025.

13 Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods
