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FOREWORD

This publication provides the monthly Consumer Price Indices for Uganda (Composite) and for the ten centres of Kampala High Income, Kampala Middle Income, Kampala Low Income, Jinja, Mbale, Masaka, Mbarara, Fortportal, Gulu and Arua. All the baskets are for the urban households.

The current Consumer Price Index has been rebased from 2009/2010 to 2016/2017, using weights derived from the Uganda National Household Survey (UNHS VI) that was conducted from July 2016 to June 2017. The rebased CPI is classified using international standards, referred to as Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP 2018). This is a shift from the COICOP 1999 that was used in the earlier series. COICOP 2018 is more detailed than the previous (1999) version, responding to the users' need for more detail, and addresses several other issues that required revision of the classification. The new COICOP of 2018 reflects the significant changes in goods and services in some areas, improved links of COICOP to other classifications, and addresses emerging statistical and policy needs of regional and international users.

At the elementary aggregate (EA) level, the indices are computed using the Jevons (Geometric Mean) method for all items within the elementary aggregates. The modified Laspeyres index formula is used to compute higher level indices. The National CPI is computed as a weighted average of the ten centres mentioned above and rebased indices are available from July 2017 to date at EA level.



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ACRONYMS AND DEFINITIONS

COICOP: Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose, is a nomenclature developed by the United Nations Statistics Division to classify and analyse individual consumption expenditures incurred by households, non-profit institutions serving households and general government according to their purpose.

CPI: Consumer Price Index - a general indicator of price levels paid by households for consumer goods and services.

CPI basket: A commonly used term for the goods and services priced for the purpose of compiling the CPI.

Elementary aggregate (EA): The lowest level of commodity classification in the CPI, and the only level for which index numbers are constructed by direct reference to price data.

Inflation: A term commonly used to refer to changes in price levels. A rise in prices is called inflation, and a persistent fall is called deflation.

Jevons price index: An elementary price index defined as the un-weighted geometric average of the sample price relatives. It can also be defined as the un-weighted geometric average of the current to base period price relatives.

Laspeyres price index: The Laspeyres price index is an index formula used in price statistics for measuring the price development of the basket of goods and services consumed in the base period. The question it answers is how much a basket that consumers bought in the base period would cost in the current period.

Outlet: The interface between a supplier of products and the consumer. It may be a shop, a market stall, a catalogue, a website etc. Also referred to as a "retail outlet", although it can include wholesale outlets which also sell directly to the consumers

Outlier: A term used to describe any extreme value in a set of data, such as a price or price relative that requires further investigation or has been verified as incorrect

Price relative: A measure of price movements: the ratio of the price level in one period to the price level in another.

Reference base: The period in which the CPI is given a value of 100.0. The CPI is currently on a reference base of 2016/17.

Weight: The measure of the importance of an item in the index regimen relative to the other items. Weights can be expressed in either quantity or value terms. Value weights are used in the CPI.

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1.0 HIGHLIGHTS OF UGANDA CPI FOR FEBRUARY 2026

1.1 Annual Headline Inflation

The Annual Inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index for Uganda for the 12 months to February 2026 is 2.9 percent compared to 3.2 percent registered in the year ended January 2026, see Table 1 and Figure 1 below.

In particular, Annual Core Inflation registered 3.0 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 3.3 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026. Annual Services Inflation recorded 4.1 percent in February 2026 compared to 4.8 percent registered in January 2026. This is mainly due to Annual Passenger transport by Air Inflation (recorded at 0.5 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 8.8 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026) and Annual Health Services Inflation (recorded at 2.8 percent compared to 3.8 percent registered in the year ended January 2026). However, Annual Core Goods Inflation registered 2.1 percent in the year ending February 2026, same rate recorded in the year ended January 2026. This is attributed to Dried fish (whose rate of price change is 8.5 percent compared to 2.8 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026), Maize flour (whose rate of price change is 10.8 percent compared to 5.0 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026), Bread (whose rate of price change is 1.3 percent compared to minus 1.8 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026) and Refined oil (whose rate of price change is 4.1 percent compared to 2.7 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026).

In addition, Annual Food Crops and Related Items Inflation registered 1.8 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 3.0 percent registered in the year ended January 2026. This is attributed to Tomatoes (whose rate of price change is minus 17.6 percent compared to minus 10.1 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026), Dry beans (whose rate of price change is minus 1.1 percent compared to 1.0 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026), Fresh leaf vegetables (whose rate of price change is minus 0.2 percent compared to 7.5 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026), Passion fruits (whose rate of price change is 7.7 percent compared to 11.2 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026) and Green pepper (whose rate of price change is 12.7 percent compared to 33.7 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026).

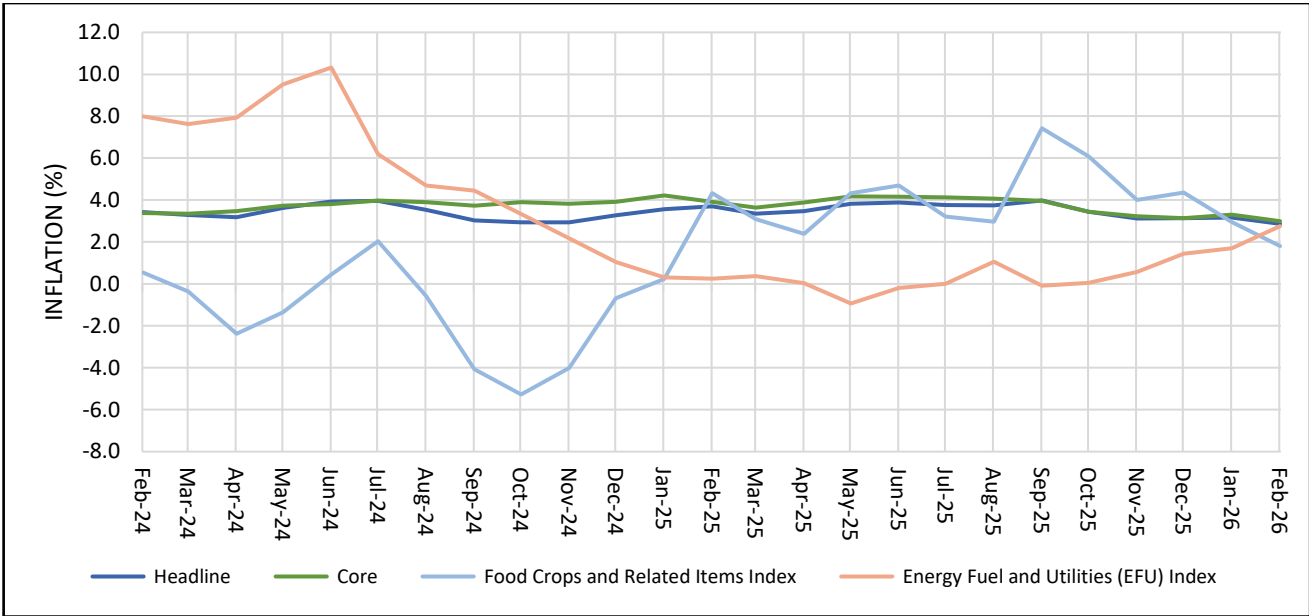
However, Annual Energy Fuel and Utilities (EFU) Inflation was recorded at 2.7 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 1.7 percent registered in the year ended January 2026. This is mainly due to Annual Liquid Energy Fuels Inflation that registered 1.7 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 0.2 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026. Particularly, Petrol (whose rate of price change is 3.4 percent compared to 1.3 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026) and Diesel (whose rate of price change is 0.8 percent compared to minus 0.7 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026). In addition, Annual Solid Fuels Inflation registered 7.3 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 5.3 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026. Particularly, Charcoal (whose rate of price change is 6.0 percent compared to 4.6 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026) and Firewood (whose rate of price change is 10.3 percent compared to 6.9 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026).

Table 1 and Figure 1 below show the components of the Annual Headline Inflation for the year ending February 2026.

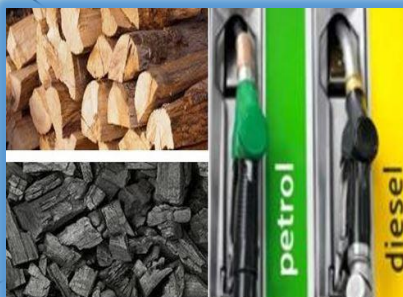

1.2 Annual Inflation by COICOP Divisions

According to the Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP), the main drivers to the 2.9 percent Inflation were 'Education Services' Inflation that registered 4.1 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 7.6 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026. 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation registered 2.8 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 3.0 percent registered in the year ended January 2026. 'Health' Inflation registered 2.8 percent for the year ending February 2026 compared to 3.8 percent registered for the year ended January 2026. 'Transport' Inflation registered 1.5 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 1.8 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026. 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' Inflation recorded 4.0 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 4.4 percent registered in the year ended January 2026. 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' Inflation registered 0.7 percent for the year ending February 2026 compared to 1.0 percent recorded for the year ended January 2026. 'Information and Communication' Inflation registered 2.0 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 2.1 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026. 'Insurance and Financial Services' Inflation registered 12.3 percent in the year ending February 2026 same rate recorded in the year ended January 2026. 'Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household' Inflation registered 1.2 percent in the year ending February 2026 same rate recorded in the year ended January 2026.

However, 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Inflation registered 3.9 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 3.1 percent registered in the year ended January 2026. 'Clothing and Footwear' Inflation registered 1.9 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 1.8 percent recorded in the year ended January 2026. 'Recreation, Sport and Culture' Inflation registered 2.2 percent in the year ending February 2026 compared to 2.1 percent registered in the year ended January 2026. 'Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods' Inflation registered 2.2 percent for the year ending February 2026 compared to 2.0 percent registered for the year ended January 2026, see Table 3 below.

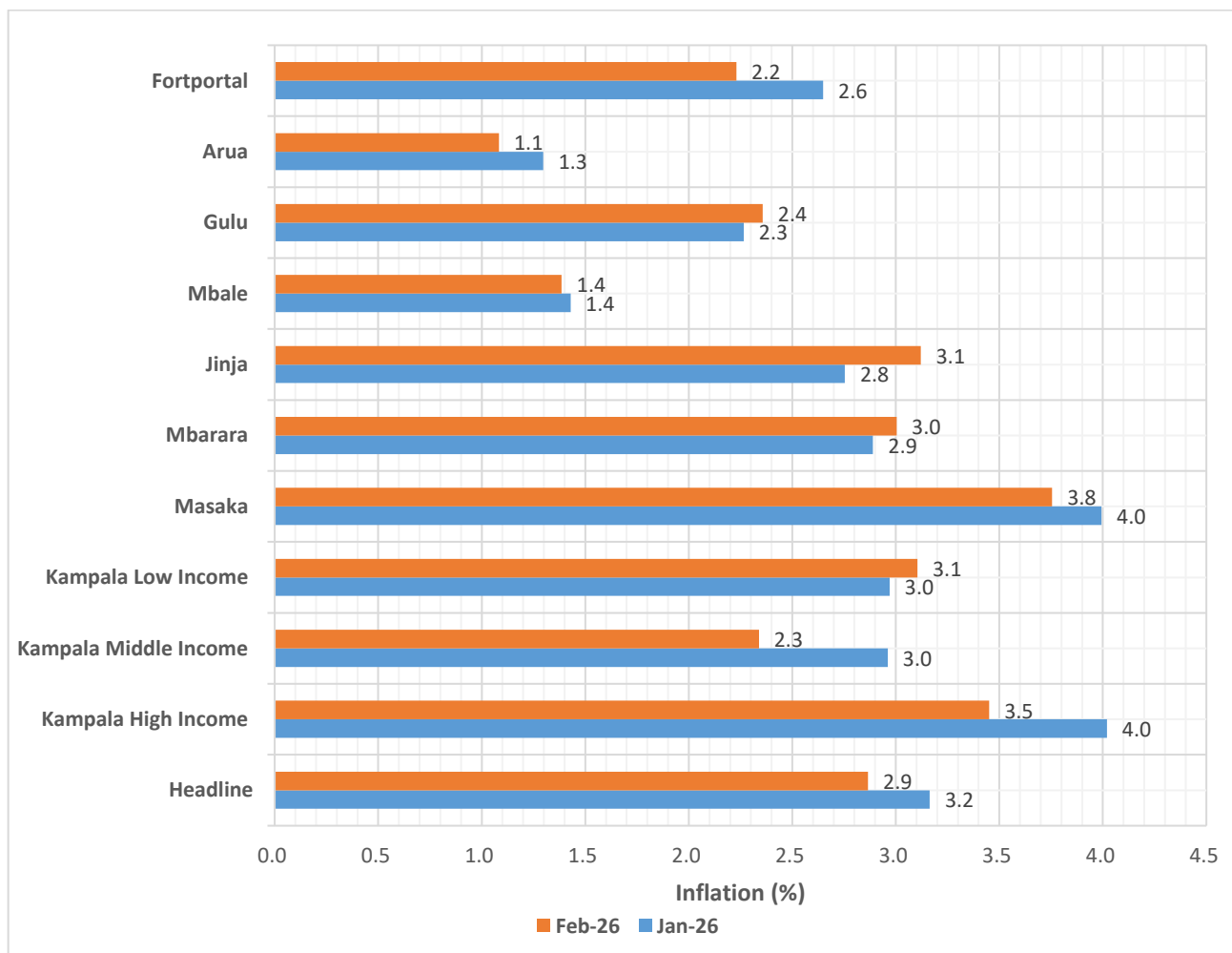
1.3 Annual Headline Inflation by CPI Geographical Center

Analysis by geographical areas and income groups revealed that Masaka registered the highest Inflation at 3.8 percent for the year ending February 2026 compared to 4.0 percent recorded in January 2026. This was mainly driven by annual 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation that increased to 2.4 percent in February 2026 compared to 1.4 percent registered in January 2026. In addition, annual 'Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods' Inflation increased to 2.2 percent in February 2026 compared to 1.4 percent registered in January 2026.

The second highest Inflation was registered in Kampala High Income at 3.5 percent for the year ending February 2026 compared to 4.0 percent recorded in January 2026. This was mainly driven by annual 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' inflation that registered 3.8 percent in February 2026 compared to 2.2 percent registered in January 2026. In addition, Annual 'Restaurants and Accommodation Services' Inflation registered 5.1 percent in February 2026 compared to 4.3 percent registered in January 2026.

The least Annual Inflation was registered in Arua Centre at 1.1 percent for the year ending February 2026 compared to 1.3 percent recorded in January 2026. This was mainly due to the annual 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' Inflation that registered 0.1 percent in February 2026 compared to 0.6 percent registered in January 2026. In addition, Annual 'Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics' Inflation registered minus 1.6 percent in February 2026 compared to minus 0.2 percent registered in January 2026.

1.4 Monthly Inflation.

The Monthly Headline Inflation for February 2026 increased by 0.3 percent from 0.3 percent rise registered in January 2026, Table 4 below.

This was mainly due to monthly Core Inflation that increased by 0.3 percent in February 2026 from the 0.5 percent rise registered in January 2026. This was mainly due to monthly Core Goods Inflation that increased by 0.4 percent in February 2026 from the 0.3 percent rise recorded in January 2026. In addition, monthly Services Inflation increased by 0.2 percent in February 2026 from the 0.7 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

Monthly Food Crops and Related Items Inflation registered 0.4 percent rise in February 2026 from the 0.7 percent drop recorded in January 2026. This was attributed to the increase in prices of Tomatoes by 3.0 percent in February 2026 from the 1.7 percent drop recorded in January 2026, fresh cassava by 4.1 percent in February 2026 from the 7.0 percent rise recorded in January 2026, green cabbage by 6.2 percent in February 2026 from the 3.1 percent drop recorded in January 2026, Irish potatoes by 2.4 percent in February 2026 from the 3.9 percent rise recorded in January 2026 and Fresh Leaf Vegetables by 3.9 percent in February 2026 from the 1.2 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

Monthly Energy Fuel and Utilities (EFU) Inflation registered 0.6 percent rise in February 2026 from the 0.0 percent registered in January 2026. This was mainly due to monthly Liquid Energy Fuels Inflation that increased by 1.0 percent in February 2026 from the 0.3 percent rise registered in January 2026. Particularly, petrol prices increased by 1.4 percent in February 2026 from the 0.5 percent rise recorded in January 2026 and diesel prices increased by 0.8 percent in February 2026 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in January 2026. In addition, monthly Solid Fuels Inflation increased by 0.9 percent in February 2026 from the 0.3 percent drop registered in January 2026. Particularly, firewood prices increased by 2.1 percent in February 2026 from the 1.3 percent rise recorded in January 2026 and charcoal prices increased by 0.4 percent in February 2026 from the 1.0 percent drop registered in January 2026.

1.5 Monthly Inflation by COICOP Divisions

According to the Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP), monthly Food and Non-alcoholic Beverages Inflation increased by 0.8 percent in February 2026 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded in January 2026. Monthly Education Services Inflation increased by 1.0 percent in February 2026 from the 0.0 percent recorded in January 2026. Monthly Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation increased by 0.6 percent in February 2026 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded in January 2026. Monthly Restaurants and Accommodation Services Inflation increased by 0.2 percent in February 2026 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded in January 2026. Monthly Clothing and Footwear Inflation increased by 0.3 percent in February 2026 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded in January 2026. Monthly Recreation, Sport and Culture Inflation registered 0.4 percent rise in February 2026 from 0.4 percent drop recorded in January 2026. Monthly Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods Inflation increased by 0.3 percent in February 2026 from 0.1 percent drop recorded in January 2026. Monthly Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Inflation increased by 0.1 percent in February 2026 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in January 2026. Monthly Health Inflation increased by 0.1 percent in February 2026 from 0.0 percent recorded in January 2026.

However, Monthly Transport Inflation registered 0.6 percent drop in February 2026 from the 0.3 percent rise recorded in January 2026. Monthly Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics Inflation registered 0.0 percent in February 2026 from 0.1 percent rise recorded in January 2026. Monthly Information and Communication Inflation recorded 0.0 percent in February 2026 same rate recorded in January 2026. Monthly Insurance and Financial Services Inflation recorded 0.0 percent in February 2026 from the 9.1 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

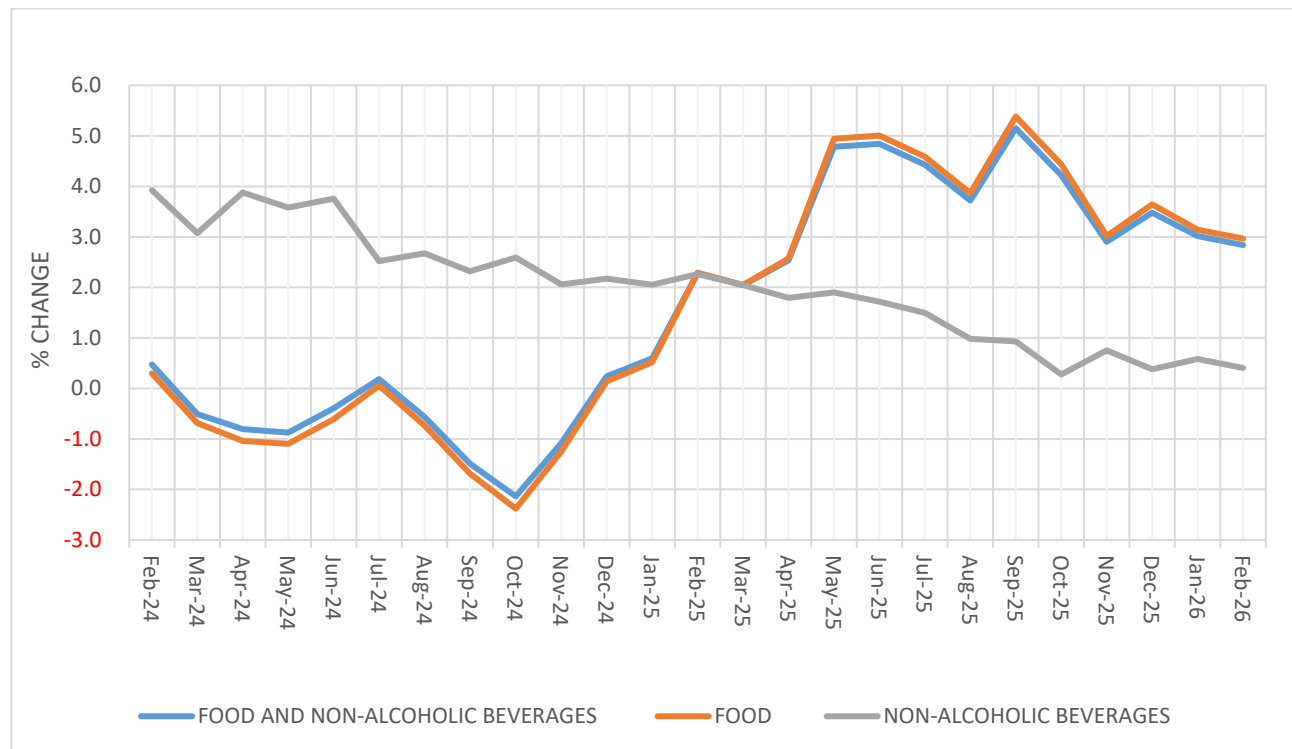
01 Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The Inflation for Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages registered 2.8 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 3.0 percent registered in January 2026. This was mainly due to Annual Food Inflation that recorded 3.0 percent in February 2026 compared to 3.1 percent recorded in January 2026.

Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation registered 0.4 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 0.6 percent recorded in January 2026.

Figure 4 shows the trends of Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages Annual Inflation from February 2024 to February 2026.

02 Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics

Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics Inflation registered 0.7 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 1.0 percent recorded in January 2026. This was attributed to the Annual Alcoholic Beverages Inflation that registered 0.5 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 0.9 percent recorded in January 2026.

In addition, Annual Tobacco Inflation registered 1.6 percent in February 2026 compared to 2.2 percent registered in January 2026.

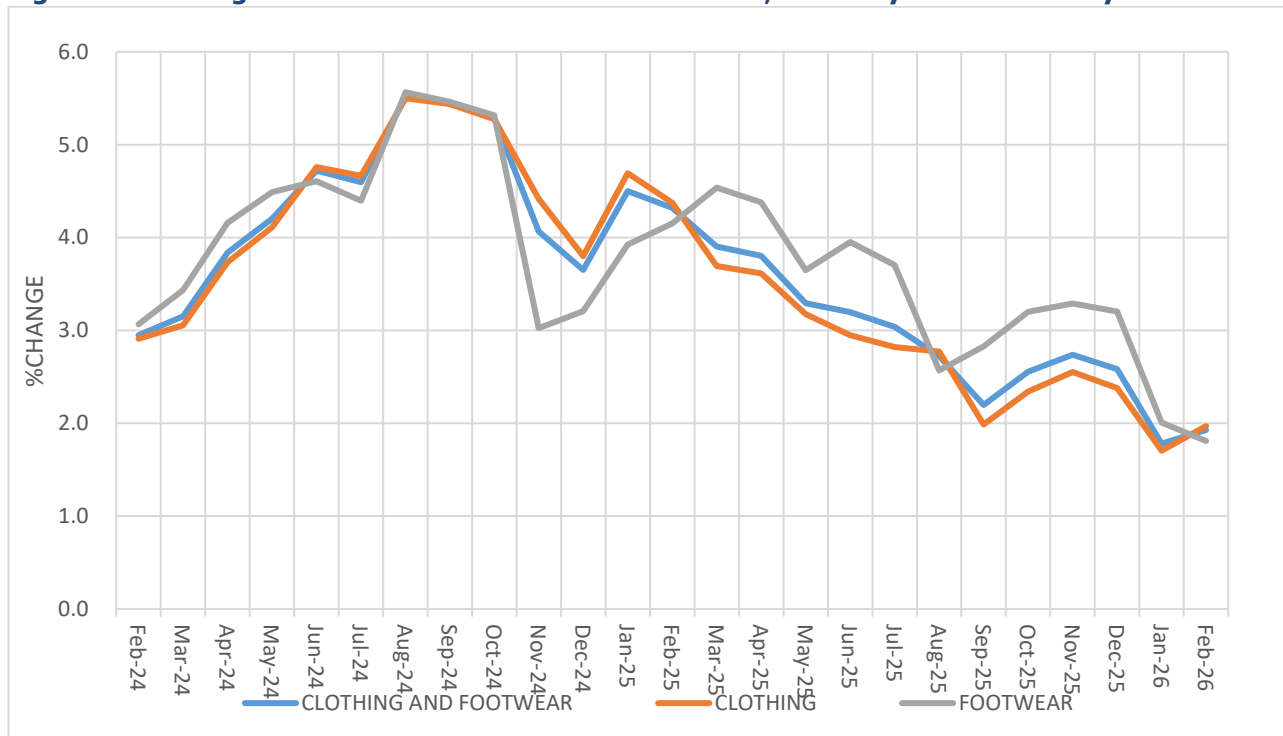
03 Clothing and Footwear

The Annual Clothing and Footwear Inflation registered 1.9 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 1.8 percent recorded in January 2026. This was mainly attributed to Clothing Inflation that registered 2.0 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 1.7 percent recorded in January 2026.

However, Footwear Inflation registered 1.8 percent in February 2026 compared to 2.0 percent recorded in January 2026.

04 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels comprises of Actual Rentals for Housing, Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling, Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Relating to the Dwelling, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other Fuels Inflation increased to 3.9 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 3.1 percent recorded in January 2026. This was mainly attributed to Annual Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation that increased to 3.7 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 2.5 percent recorded in January 2026. Annual Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Relating to the Dwelling inflation increased to 12.3 percent in February 2026 compared to 10.3 percent recorded in January 2026. Annual Actual Rentals for Housing Inflation registered 1.3 percent in February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026. Annual Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling Inflation registered minus 2.5 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to minus 2.6 percent recorded in January 2026.

05 Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

This Division Comprises of Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets, Household Textiles, Household Appliances, Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils, Tools and Equipment for House & Garden, and Goods & Services for Routine Household Maintenance.

The Inflation for Furnishings, Household Equipment & Routine Household Maintenance registered 1.2 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026. This was mainly due to Annual Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets Inflation that registered 4.7 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 4.6 percent recorded in January 2026.

In addition, Annual Goods & Services for Routine Household Maintenance Inflation increased to 0.7 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 0.5 percent registered in January 2026. Annual Household appliances inflation registered 2.3 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 2.0 percent recorded in January 2026.

Annual Household textiles Inflation registered 0.4 percent for the 12 months to January compared to 0.3 percent recorded in January 2026.

However, Annual Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils Inflation registered 1.0 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 2.7 percent recorded in January 2026. Annual Tools and Equipment for House & Garden Inflation registered minus 0.6 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026.

06 Health

The Health Division comprises of Medicines and Health Products, Outpatient Care Services, Inpatient Care Services and Other Health Services.

The Inflation for Health registered 2.8 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 3.8 percent registered in January 2026. This was mainly due to Annual Other Health Services Inflation that registered 6.6 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 8.1 percent recorded in January 2026.

In addition, Annual Medicine and Health Products Inflation registered 1.6 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 2.4 percent recorded in January 2026. Annual Outpatient Care Services Inflation registered 5.1 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 from the 8.0 percent recorded in January 2026. Annual Inpatient Care Services Inflation registered 1.1 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 1.0 recorded in January 2026.

07 Transport

Transport division comprises of Purchase of vehicles, Operation of Personal Transport Equipment and Passenger Transport Services.

The Inflation for Transport registered 1.5 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 1.8 percent recorded in January 2026. This was mainly attributed to Annual Passenger Transport Services Inflation that registered 0.9 percent in February 2026 compared to 2.4 percent recorded in January 2026. In addition, Annual Purchase of vehicles Inflation registered 3.4 percent in February 2026 from the 4.2 percent recorded in January 2026.

Annual Operation of Personal Transport Equipment inflation registered 1.4 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 from the 0.5 percent registered in January 2026.

08 Information and Communication

Information and Communication include Information and Communication Equipment, and Information and Communication Services.

The Annual Inflation for Information and Communication registered 2.0 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 2.1 percent recorded in January 2026. This was mainly due to Annual Information and Communication Equipment Inflation that registered 2.9 percent in February 2026 compared to 3.3 percent recorded in January 2026.

Annual Information and Communication Services Inflation registered 1.6 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026.

09 Recreation, Sport and Culture

Recreation, Sport and Culture comprise of Other Recreational Goods, Gardens and Pets, Recreational Services, Cultural Services, Newspapers, Books & Stationery and Package Holidays.

The Annual Inflation for Recreation, Sport and Culture registered 2.2 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 2.1 recorded in January 2026. This was mainly due to Annual Cultural Services Inflation that increased to 2.6 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 1.6 percent recorded in January 2026. In addition, Annual Recreational Services Inflation registered 6.0 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 5.7 percent recorded in January 2026. Annual Newspapers, Books & Stationery Inflation registered 1.1 percent in February 2026 compared to 1.3 percent recorded in January 2026. Annual Other Recreational Goods Inflation registered 3.9 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 10.2 percent recorded in January 2026.

Annual Gardens and Pets inflation registered 0.1 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 4.5 percent recorded in January 2026.

However, Annual Package Holidays inflation registered minus 1.0 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026.

10 Education Services

Education Services comprises of Early Childhood and Primary Education, Secondary Education, Post-secondary non-tertiary education, Tertiary Education and Education Not Defined by level.

The Annual Inflation for Education Services registered 4.1 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 7.6 percent recorded in January 2026. This was mainly due to Annual Early Childhood and Primary Education inflation that registered 4.5 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 8.4 percent recorded in January 2026. In addition, Annual Secondary Education Inflation registered 5.0 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 9.1 recorded in January 2026. Annual Post-Secondary Non-Tertiary Education inflation registered 5.4 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 11.2 recorded in January 2026. Annual Education Not Defined by level registered 0.0 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 same as that recorded in January 2026.

11 Restaurants and Accommodation Services

Restaurants and Accommodation Services comprise of Food and Beverage Serving Services and Accommodation Services.

Annual Inflation for Restaurants and Accommodation Services registered 4.0 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 4.4 percent recorded in January 2026.

This was mainly due to Annual Food and Beverage Serving Services Inflation that registered 4.8 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 5.1 percent recorded in January 2026.

In addition, Annual Accommodation Services Inflation registered 2.2 percent in February 2026 compared to 2.7 percent recorded in January 2026.

12 Insurance and Financial Services

Insurance and Financial Services comprises of Insurance and Financial Services.

The Annual Insurance and Financial Services Inflation for the 12 months to February 2026 registered 12.3 percent the same rate recorded in January 2026. This was mainly due to Annual Financial Services Inflation that registered 13.4 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026.

Annual Insurance Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026.

13 Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods

Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods comprise of Personal Care, Personal Effects n.e.c, Social Protection and Other services n.e.c

The Annual Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods Inflation for the 12 months to February 2026 registered 2.2 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 2.0 percent recorded in January 2026. This was mainly due to Annual Personal Care Inflation that registered 2.1 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 1.8 percent recorded in January 2026. Annual Social Protection Inflation registered 5.1 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 4.5 recorded in January 2026.

Annual Other Services n.e.c Inflation registered 2.0 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026.

Annual Personal Effects n.e.c Inflation registered to 2.1 percent for the 12 months to February 2026 compared to 2.6 percent recorded in January 2026.

ANNEX 2: MONTHLY INFLATION BY COICOP DIVISIONS

The evolution of Monthly Inflation according to COICOP is described in the following paragraphs, reference is made to table 4.

01 Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages

The Monthly Inflation for Food and Non-alcoholic Beverages registered 0.8 percent increase for the month of February 2026 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded in January 2026. This was mainly due to monthly Food Inflation that registered an increase of 0.8 percent for the month of February 2026 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

However, Non-Alcoholic Beverages Inflation registered a 0.2 percent drop for the month of February 2026 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

02 Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics

The Monthly Inflation for Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded in January 2026. This was mainly due to monthly Alcoholic beverages Inflation that registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

However, Tobacco Inflation registered 0.4 percent drop for the month of February 2026 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

03 Clothing and Footwear

The Monthly Inflation for Clothing and Footwear increased by 0.3 percent for the month of February 2026 compared to 0.1 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

This was mainly due to clothing Inflation that increased by 0.3 percent for the month of February 2026 from 0.2 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

In addition, Footwear inflation registered 0.2 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded in January 2026.

04 Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels

The Monthly Inflation for Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other fuels registered 0.6 percent increase for the month of February 2026 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded in January 2026. This was mainly attributed to Water Supply and Miscellaneous Services Inflation that increased by 2.0 percent for the month of February 2026 from 1.8 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

In addition, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels Inflation registered 0.6 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from the 0.2 percent drop recorded in January 2026. Actual Rentals for Housing Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 from 0.3 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

However, Maintenance, Repair and Security of the Dwelling Inflation registered 0.3 percent drop for the month of February 2026 from the 0.2 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

05 Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance

The Monthly Inflation for Furnishings, Household Equipment & Routine Household Maintenance registered 0.1 percent increase for the month of February 2026 from 0.2 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2026.

This was mainly due to Furniture, Furnishings, and Loose Carpets inflation that registered 0.6 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from 0.0 percent recorded in January 2026.

In addition, Household Textiles inflation registered 0.2 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from the 0.4 percent drop recorded for January 2026. Glassware, Tableware and Household Utensils Inflation recorded 0.2 percent increase for the month of February 2026 from 0.1 percent rise registered in January 2026.

Household Appliances Inflation registered 0.2 percent increase for the month of February 2026 from the 0.6 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

Tools and Equipment for House and Garden Inflation registered 0.1 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from the 0.1 percent drop registered in January 2026.

Goods and Services for routine household maintenance inflation registered 0.0 percent in February 2026 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2026.

06 Health

The Monthly Inflation for Health registered 0.1 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from 0.0 percent recorded in January 2026. This was mainly due to monthly Inpatient care services inflation that registered 0.5 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from the 0.0 percent recorded for the month of January 2026.

Other Health Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026.

Outpatient Care Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026.

However, Medicines and Health Products Inflation registered 0.1 percent drop for the month of February 2026 from 0.0 percent registered in January 2026.

07 Transport

Transport Inflation registered 0.6 percent drop for the month of February 2026 from 0.3 percent rise registered for the month of January 2026. This was mainly due to Passenger Transport Services inflation that registered 1.8 percent drop for the month of February 2026 from the 0.4 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

However, Operation of personal transport equipment inflation recorded 0.4 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from 0.1 percent drop recorded in January 2026.

Purchase of vehicles Inflation increased by 0.1 percent for the month of February 2026 from 1.5 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

08 Information and Communication

The monthly inflation for Information and Communication registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026.

Information and communication services inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026.

Information and Communication Equipment inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 the same rate recorded in January 2026.

09 Recreation, Sport and Culture

Recreation, Sport and Culture inflation registered 0.4 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from 0.4 percent drop registered in January 2026. This was mainly due to Cultural Services Inflation that registered 0.8 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from 0.0 percent recorded in January 2026.

In addition, Recreational services Inflation registered 0.3 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from 0.0 percent recorded for the month of January 2026. Package Holidays Inflation that registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 from 14.0 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2026.

Gardens and Pets Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 the same rate recorded during the month of January 2026.

Other recreational goods inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 from 0.1 percent rise recorded in January 2026.

However, Newspapers, books & stationery inflation decreased by 0.1 percent for the month of February 2026 from 0.2 percent drop recorded in January 2026.

10 Education Services

Monthly Inflation for Education Services registered 1.0 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from 0.0 percent recorded in January 2026.

This was mainly due to Early Childhood and Primary Education Inflation that registered 1.1 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from 0.0 percent recorded in January 2026.

In addition, Secondary Education Inflation registered 1.5 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from 0.0 percent recorded in January 2026.

Post-secondary and non-tertiary education Inflation recorded 1.0 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from 0.0 percent recorded in January 2026.

Tertiary education Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 the same rate recorded for the month of January 2026. Education not Defined by level inflation recorded 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 the same rate recorded for the month of January 2026.

11 Restaurants and Accommodation Services

The Monthly Inflation for Restaurants and Accommodation services increased by 0.3 percent for the month of February 2026 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2026. This was mainly due to Food and beverage serving services inflation that registered 0.3 percent increase for the month of February 2026 from the 0.1 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2026.

Accommodation services inflation increased by 0.4 percent for the month of February 2026 from 0.1 percent rise registered in January 2026.

12 Insurance and Financial Services

Insurance and Financial Services Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 from 9.1 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2026.

This was mainly due to Financial Services Inflation that registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 from 9.8 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2026.

Insurance Inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 from 0.1 percent rise recorded for the month of January 2026.

13 Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods

Personal Care, Social Protection and Miscellaneous Goods Inflation registered 0.3 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2026.

This was mainly due to monthly Personal care Inflation that registered 0.2 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from the 0.1 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2026.

In addition, social protection inflation recorded 5.1 percent rise in February 2026 from 0.0 percent recorded for the month of January 2026.

Personal Effects n.e.c Inflation registered 0.5 percent rise for the month of February 2026 from the 0.3 percent drop recorded for the month of January 2026.

Other services n.e.c inflation registered 0.0 percent for the month of February 2026 the same rate registered for January 2026.
