

• Agricultural Census: Is a statistical operation for collecting, processing and disseminating data on the structure of agriculture, covering the whole or a significant part of a country.


• Large scale sample census: Due to limited resources, there are very few countries in the world that attempt to carry out complete enumeration on all agricultural holdings. Consequently, the majority of countries conduct a large-scale sample census.

National Livestock Census 2021

 ✓ Objective: To collect data on the livestock populations, structure and organization of the livestock sub sector in Uganda.

Rationale: To obtain Livestock statistics that are required for evidence-based decision making, policy formulation, monitoring and evaluation of government programs and reporting on national, regional and international frameworks.

✓ Reference period: 24th May to 4th June 2021







NLC 2021 Management

✓The NLC 2021 was conducted by UBOS under the Authority of the Uganda Bureau of Statistics Act Number 12 of 1998.



NLC Methodology

• Scope and coverage

- Livestock (Populations, Production systems, extension services, livestock products), apiary and Companion animals
- ✓National Census-covering 135 districts (as of July 2019) in cattle and non-cattle corridor.
- Statistical unit of enumeration: Household-based farms and Private Large Scale and Institutional Farms were enumerated





NLC Methodology CTD

- Sample size
- ✓ Complete enumeration in the cattle-corridor districts and a sample in non-cattle corridor districts.
- ✓ A two-stage stratified sampling design; 20% of EAs in non-cattle corridor districts were sampled.
- ✓ The National population housing census (NPHC) 2024 sampling frame was used obtain the NLC sample.
- ✓ 32,163 EAs were to be covered; cattle corridor with 23,443 EAS and 8,720 EAs in the noncattle corridor.
- ✓ 31,195 EAs were enumerated ; hence a 97% completion rate.












Livestock-Keeping HHs by Sub-region








Livestock-keeping HH Head, by Gender



Female-headed Livestock-keeping HHs by Sub-region






Livestock-Keeping HHs by Livestock Type







Cattle-Keeping Households & Average Herd Size, by Sub-region










Cattle Population by Breed











Goat-Keeping HHs in Millions










Goat-Keeping Households & Average Herd Size, by Sub-region










Goat Population by Breed in Millions





The population of indigenous goats increased to 16.9 million in 2021 from 12.2 million in 2008. This is 97 percent.


□ The population of exotic goats was 0.5 million in 2021 compared to 0.2 million in 2008. This is an increase of about two (2) times.



Goat Population by Region












Sheep Population by Breed in Million















Chicken-Keeping Households by Breed











Where are the Exotic/ Cross Chicken in Uganda?



Rabbit Population in Millions








Production Systems for Pigs







Main Type of Labour Used







Generally, over 50 percent of the households keep livestock for subsistence. Commercial production was highest among pigs (48.7%), rabbits (42.3%) and cattle (37.9%).



Pasture Planting by Livestock-keeping HHs

Percentage of livestock keeping households that plant pasture increased from 2.4% in 2008 to 14.5% in 2021. Pasture planting is highest among cattle keeping households (22.0%), followed by rabbits (17.9%) and pigs (16.6%).



Average Daily Amount of Water in Litres for Livestock Production


