#### 1.0 FOREWORD

This is the 35<sup>th</sup> release of the Producer Price Index for Manufacturing (PPI-M) for the months of July, August and September, 2013. In the compilation of the index, the Manufacturing sector is divided into eight groups namely:

- Food Processing which includes Processing of Meat, Fish and Diary Products; Grain Milling; Animal Feeds; Bakery; Sugar; Coffee; Tea and Other Food Processing.
- · Beverages and Tobacco
- Textile, Clothing, Leather and Footwear.
- Timber, Paper and Printing
- Chemicals, Paint, Soap and Foam Products
- Bricks and Cement
- Metal Products
- Miscellaneous group, which includes manufacture of Plastic and Furniture Products

Note that, revisions have been made to the indices of the April to June 2013 in line with the Revision Policy. In addition, for analytical purposes the index is separated into products manufactured for Export and products manufactured for the Local Market.

Producer prices for all manufactured goods increased by 0.5% during the 12-month period leading up to September 2013 from September 2012. In July 2013 Producer Prices registered an increase of 2.6 and in August 2013 Producer Prices registered an increase of 3.3%.

Comparing monthly changes, Prices of Manufactured goods produced for consumption in the Local Market experienced a decrease of 1.1% in September 2013 following relatively stable prices recorded in August 2013. The decrease of prices in September was mainly due to fall in prices of Processed Food by 1.9%, Bricks and Cement by 0.9% and Metal Products by 1.4%.

In July and August 2013, prices of goods produced for Export registered an increase of 2.8% and 1.6% respectively. However in September 2013, prices for goods manufactured for Exports decreased by 7.8% mainly due to a general decrease in prices in all subsectors.

The TECHNICAL NOTE below explains in detail the compilation process of the indices.

# HIGHLIGHTS

#### Annual Producer Prices rose by 0.5%.

Producer prices for all manufactured goods increased by 0.5% during the 12-month period leading up to September 2013 from September In August 2013 Producer Prices registered an increase of 3.3%.



#### Main Contributors to the 0.5% increase.

Notable increases were in the sectors of:

- Drinks & Tobacco by 9.8% mainly due to rise in the prices of Malt liquors attributed to cost of raw material
- Textiles, Clothing and Foot wear by 4.5% mainly due to rise in the prices of wearing apparel attributed to cost of raw materials
- Chemicals Products 4.5% mainly due to rise in the prices of Soap Products.

However, during the same period decreases in prices were registered in the sectors of Food Products (0.9%), Bricks and Cement (2.9%) as well as Metal Products (3.1%).

#### **Monthly Changes**

In September 2013, Producer Prices decreased by 3.1% following a previous rise of 0.4% in August 2013. The fall in prices for the month of September was mainly due to a:


- 1.4% fall in prices of Processed Food.
- 11.7% fall in prices of Drinks and Tobacco.
- 1.4% fall in prices of Metal Products

#### **Monthly Changes Local**

Prices of Manufactured goods produced for consumption in the Local Market experienced a decrease of 1.1% in September 2013 following relatively stable prices recorded in August 2013. The decrease of prices in September was mainly due to fall in prices of Processed Food by 1.9%, Bricks and Cement by 0.9% and Metal Products by 1.4%.

#### **Monthly Changes Exports**

In July and August 2013, prices of goods produced for Export registered an increase of 2.8% and 1.6% respectively. However in September 2013, prices for goods manufactured for Exports decreased by 7.8% mainly due to a general decrease in prices in all subsectors.

#### 3.0 TECHNICAL NOTE

The Producer Price Index for Manufacturing (PPI-M) produced by the Bureau measures the average change over time in the prices received by domestic producers of manufactured goods. The PPI-M measures price change from the perspective of the producer. Comparatively the Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures the price change from the perspective of the buyer/consumer. The producers' and consumers' prices differ due to government subsidies, value added tax, excise duty, transport and distribution costs. The monthly PPI-M released quarterly is made up 8 main groupings and 28 Sub groups all categorized according to the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC Rev IV).

A total of 600 prices of finished goods are collected from the manufacturing sector every quarter. The choice of the products was determined with the guidance of the manufacturer. During a specific quarter monthly prices are collected for all the 3 months. The PPI-M is then organized into three sets: (1) PPI-M for products produced for the local Market (2) PPI-M for products produced for Export (3) PPI-M combining local products and exports. Although the PPI is currently restricted to the manufacturing sector, it will gradually be expanded to other production and service sectors of the economy.

#### 3.1 Weighting Scheme and Sample design

PPI-Ms are based on producer prices reported by 170 business establishments employing 10 or more persons selected using probability proportional to size and cut-off method. The PPI-M reflects the price trends of a constant basket of well-specified products representing the output of the selected manufacturing business establishments.

The PPI-M weights were derived from the Gross Output data compiled from the 2000/2001 Uganda Business Inquiry (UBI) for manufacturing businesses employing 10 or more persons. The selection of the 600 regularly produced products was done taking into account the output of the selected business establishments. This was done during the 'recruitment survey' undertaken in October 2004 whose main objective was to identify products for regular pricing in addition to soliciting the collaboration of the respondents in the selected business establishments. During this survey the product groups were identified and products for regular pricing within each product group were selected using criteria such as regularity of sales, demand, and the relative share importance of each product. A detailed description of the item was generated to enable proper identification of the product and to help identify quality differences. During selection, items selected were among the best selling lines and were deemed representative of the establishment's production. The collaboration of the owners/managers ensured the success of this step. The reference date for the production of the index is July to September 2004=100

#### 3.2 Data Collection

Bureau staff on a quarterly basis visits the selected businesses and collect the prices of specified products. Business establishments then provide the 'factory gate' monthly prices of the selected products. The prices provided are prices normally prevailing during the mid-month (around the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the month). The survey is conducted primarily by visiting each business every quarter.

The 1998 Uganda Bureau of Statistics Act compels all businesses to provide the required information to the Bureau. Each Bureau employee swears an Oath of Secrecy to the effect that the data collected will only be used for statistical purposes. For some businesses however it is an uphill task to obtain the required information.

The Bureau publishes price indices instead of unit shilling prices, and although the export prices are normally

provided in dollars, these are converted to shillings using the official middle rate Foreign Exchange Rate as provided by the Bank of Uganda. All PPI-Ms are subject to revision every 3 months after the original publication to reflect the availability of late reports and corrections by respondents.

#### 3.3 Index Calculation

The PPI-M is constructed in a hierarchical way. The index is first calculated at the 4-digit level of ISIC Rev IV. Indices at higher level division (2-digit level) were then derived as a weighted average of the indices of the products falling within each division. Finally, the overall index for manufacturing (PPI-M) was obtained as a weighted average of the division indices.

Each PPI-M measures the price changes from the reference period which equals 100.0. An increase of say 6.6 percent from the reference period in PPI-M for goods produced for the local Market will be shown as 106.6. This change can also be expressed in shillings as follows: Prices received by the producers for a sample of selected goods have risen from 100 shillings in the reference period to 106.6 shillings. Similarly a current index of 95.0 would indicate that the prices received by producers are 5 percent lower than they were in the reference period.

Movements of the index from one time period to the next time period can be expressed as changes in index points i.e. the difference between index levels or as percent changes. However, it is often more useful to express the movements as percent changes because the index points are affected by the level of the index in relation to its reference period, while percent changes are not.

The example below shows how to compute 'index points' and 'percentage changes' for a given set of indices.

## 3.4 Seasonality Quality Adjustment

In specifying the product as mentioned earlier, each product was specifically and comprehensively defined in terms of the characteristics that influenced the final transaction price such as unit of measure, type of packaging, raw materials used and mode of sale to mention but a few. Over time, however, there is normally a change in quality or specifications of the product which change in most cases is triggered by a mixture of both price and quality change. Hence the need to undertake Quality Adjustment (QA) in order to capture the effects of pure price changes. If there is an increase or decrease in the quality of an item, then the price is adjusted downwards or upwards to reflect the value of the quality change. This technique is known as 'Pricing to Constant Quality'. In cases where no producer price was reported an appropriate imputation method was applied. So far no seasonal adjustment is undertaken because the PPI-M series is still short.
