PERFORMANCE AT A GLANCE

Net revenue decreased by 9.5 percent to Shs 7.2 trillion in Q1 2024/25 from Shs 7.9 trillion in Q4 2023/24.

Tax revenue was the biggest contributor to central government revenue accounting for 89.1 percent of total central government revenue in Q1 2024/25. See table1 a(ii)

Grants to central government increased by 18.3 percent from Shs 282.9 billion in Q4 2023/24 to Shs 334.7 billion in Q1 2024/25 and they accounted for 4.6 percent of the total revenue in Q1 2024/25. See tables 1 a(i) and 1a(ii)

Central government expenditure (including local government grants and donor disbursements) decreased by 59.7 percent to about Shs 5.9 trillion in Q1 2024/25 from Shs 14.6 trillion registered in Q4 2023/24, See Table 1 Summary.

Central government recurrent expenditure (excluding local government transfers) decreased by 49.0 percent to Shs 3.6 trillion in Q1 2024/25 from Shs 7.1 trillion registered in Q4 2024/25 while development expenditure (excluding local government transfers) decreased by 93.2 percent to Shs 174.4 billion in Q1 2024/25 compared to Shs 2.6 trillion recorded in Q4 2024/25. Transfers to local government decreased by 72.2 percent to Shs 1.1 trillion in Q1 2024/25 from Shs 3.9 trillion recorded in Q4 2023/24, See Table 1 Summary.

Donor disbursements decreased by 1.7 percent to Shs 1.0 trillion in Q1 2024/25 from Shs 1.02 trillion disbursed in Q4 2023/24, See Table 1 Summary.

INTRODUCTION

The principal function of government is to provide public services such as law and order, defense, education, health, and welfare to its citizens as well as redistribute income. To manage its operations and provide accountability to its citizens, government needs an accounting and reporting system. Two kinds of reporting systems are used, fiscal accounting and statistical reporting. A government fiscal accounting system is primarily designed to fulfill the requirements of fiscal accountability, which is a demonstration of compliance in the use of resources allocated by the budgetary process. The Government Finance Statistics (GFS) reporting system is concerned with measuring the effectiveness of spending and the sustainability of fiscal policies. It deals with the stocks and flows in revenue, expense, assets, and liabilities. Therefore, Government Finance Statistics (GFS) measure the financial activities of the government in an economy.

Purpose of GFS

- To provide input to the compilation of Government Consumption Estimates (GCE) for the General Government in the compilation of Gross Domestic Product (GDP).
- Used in the compilation of the Supply and Use tables.
- Used in analysis of operations of specific levels of government and transactions between levels of government as well as the entire general government.
- To provide summary information on the overall performance and financial position of the general government.

Coverage

The bulletin covers Central Government which comprises Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDA) and referral hospitals. Currently, this includes 23 ministries, 66 agencies; 22 referral hospitals; 36 missions abroad and 13 public universities.

GFS COMPILATION PRACTICES

The GFS compilation is in line with the latest Government Finance Statistics Manual (GFSM 2014).

Data sources

The primary source of data is IFMS at the Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development (MFPED), Department for Development Assistance and Regional Cooperation (DARC) at MFPED and Uganda Revenue Authority.

Classification

The classification of transactions is consistent with internationally accepted standards, guidelines, and best practices. Data is classified in accordance with the new chart of accounts issued in 2018, which is aligned to the classifications of GFSM 2001/14.

Basis of recording

The general government sector uses a modified cash basis of recording in their accounting and budgeting systems with all its transactions recorded on cash basis except for interest which is on accrual basis of accounting.

Valuation

All general government transactions are valued at market prices. In respect to the stock of assets, no valuation has been done. This has therefore not enabled compilation of the

Consumption of Fixed Capital (CFC) estimates.

Periodicity

The bulletin is produced quarterly with a time lag of one (1) quarter.

ANALYSIS OF GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS

Central Government Revenue


In Quarter one (Q1) of 2024/25, the net central government revenue (excluding tax refunds) was Shs 7.2 trillion compared to Shs 7.9 trillion collected in Quarter four (Q4) of 2023/24. This was a 9.5 percent decrease in the net quarterly central government revenue in Q1 2024/25 compared to Q4 2023/24. See table1 a(i) and 1a(ii)

During the period under review, the largest contributor to the net revenue was tax revenue accounting for 89.1 percent while non-tax revenue contributed only 10.9 percent to the total revenue.

Taxes on goods and services were the largest contributors to tax revenue items accounting for 47.4 percent in Q1 2024/25.

Among the non-tax revenue items, grants contributed 4.6 percent and other revenues contributed 6.3 percent to the total revenue, See figure 1 below.

Figure 1: Composition of Quarter-to-Quarter Tax revenue changes from Q4 2022/23 to Q1 2024/25, Percentages



From figure 1, for the period under review, it was observed that there was a relatively high increase in only one tax category from Q4 2023/24 to Q1 2024/25. This category was other taxes on international trade, which increased

by 27.5 percent in Q1 2024/25. The highest reduction was observed in taxes on property (37.5 percent) and taxes on income, profits and capital gains (37.2 percent). See table1 a(iii)

Central Government Expenditure

The total central government expenditure including transfers to local government and donor disbursements was Shs 5.9 trillion in Q1 2024/25. This was a 59.7 percent decrease in expenditure in Q1 2024/25 compared to Q4 2023/24 (Shs 14.6 trillion) recorded in in, See table 1 above.

The central government recurrent expenditure excluding local government transfers for Q1 2024/25 was Shs 5,730 billion, representing a 19.3 percent decrease from Shs 7,097 billion for Q4 2023/24. Central government recurrent expenditure including grants to local government was Shs. 6,808 billion in Q1 2024/25, which was a 37.5 percent decrease from Shs 10.9 trillion recorded in Q4 2023/24. *See table1 d(i)*

The central government development expenditure excluding transfers to local government for Q1 2024/25 was Shs 176.8 billion, registering a 93.1 percent decrease from Shs 2.6 trillion recorded in Q4 2023/24. Central government development expenditure including local government transfers was Shs. 177.9 billion in Q1 2024/25 which was a 93.3 percent decrease from Shs 2.7 trillion recorded in Q4 2023/24. See tables 1 e(i) and 1 e(ii)

The donor disbursements for Q1 2024/25 were Shs 1,003 billion, reflecting a 1.7 percent decrease from Shs 1,020.8 billion recorded in

Q4 2023/24. Most donor disbursements made in Q1 2024/25 were for economic affairs accounting for 50.2 percent, followed by general public services accounting for 35.2 percent. See table1 j(i) and 1 j(ii)

Analysis of functional and economic classification of recurrent expenditure (including transfers to local government) and development expenditure has been assessed as follows:

In terms of government functions, the largest recurrent expenditure for GOU in Q1 2024/25 was on general public services sector, accounting for 28.8 percent of which, most of the expenditure was for financial and fiscal Affairs, general economic, social and statistical services representing 16.4 percent, while Executive; Legislative; and other General Services was 11.5 percent.

The second largest was defense accounting for 13.9 percent, followed by public order and safety at 10.0 percent to the total government recurrent expenditure. See tables 1 g(i) and 1 g(i)

Transfers to local government accounted for 23.0 percent of total government recurrent expenditure in Q1 2024/25. See table1 g(ii)

The largest share of the development expenditure was attributed to the economic affairs, accounting to 82.2 percent in Q1 2024/25 of which Transport (include road,

railway, air transport, other transport etc.) sub sector had a share of 75.0 percent.

The General Public Services sector was the second largest contributor to the development expenditure with 12.0 percent in Q1 2024/25.

The percentage contribution of health expenditure to the overall development expenditure decreased to 0.2 percent in Q1 2024/25 compared to a 2.5 percent recorded in Q4 2023/24. See table1 h(ii)

Economic analysis of the GOU expenses showed that total expense for Q1 2024/25 was Shs 6,879.4 billion (including transfers to local government) compared to Shs 11,502.4 billion

that was expensed in Q4 2023/24. This was a 40.2 percent decrease in the GOU expense between the two periods. See tables 1 b(i) and 1b(ii)

In Q1 2024/25, expenditure on acquisition of non-financial assets was Shs. 103.8 billion, of which Shs. 100.3 billion was spent on Buildings and structures which accounted for 96.7 percent. This was followed by expenses on machinery and equipment, representing 2.5 percent (Shs. 2.6 billion). Also, Shs. 0.9 billion was spent on net acquisition of non-produced assets (land) which accounted for 0.8 percent. See tables 1 c(i) and 1 c(ii)
